1 LICENSING HISTORY & CURRENT POSITION

- 1.1 On 4 December 2008 an application by **Mr Ediz Hastunc** for a new Premises Licence, which was not subject to any representations, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.2 On 19 January 2010 an application by **Mr Ediz Hastunc** for variation of the Premises Licence, which was not subject to any representations, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.3 The current Premises Licence permits:
- 1.3.1 **Hours the premises are open to the public** : Sunday to Saturday from 06:30 to 03:00 the following day and on St Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day & Christmas Eve from 06:30 to 04:00 the following day.
- 1.3.2 **Supply of alcohol (on supplies only)** : Sunday from 15:00 to 02:00 the following day, on Monday to Saturday from 11:00 to 02:00 the following day and on St Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day & Christmas Eve from 11:00 to 03:30 the following day.
- 1.3.3 Live music & Performance of dance : Sunday to Saturday from 15:00 to 01:00 the following day.
- 1.3.4 **Recorded music** : Sunday to Saturday from 07:00 to 03:00 the following day and on St Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day & Christmas Eve from 07:00 to 04:00 the following day.
- 1.3.5 **Facilities for dancing** : On 1 October 2012 the Live Music Act 2012 amended the Licensing Act 2003 and this activity ceased to be a licensable activity.
- 1.3.6 Late night refreshment : Sunday to Saturday from 23:00 to 01:30 the following day and on St Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day & Christmas Eve from 23:00 to 04:00 the following day.
- 1.4 A copy of a location map of the premises is attached as Annex 01.
- 1.5 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached as Annex 02.

2 THIS APPLICATION :

- 2.1 On 15 July 2014 the Metropolitan Police Service applied for a Summary Review of the Premises Licence.
- 2.2 A copy of the application is attached as Annex 03.
- 2.3 On 17 July 2014 the Licensing Sub-Committee considered that it wasn't necessary to take any interim steps.
- 2.4 A copy of the decision notice is attached as Annex 04.
- 2.5 The application was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.6 Each of the Responsible Authorities were consulted in respect of the application.
- 2.7 This hearing constitutes a full review of the licence, as required by the Summary Review statutory procedure.

3 **RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS** :

- 3.1 **Metropolitan Police** : Representation is made on the grounds of the prevention of crime & disorder and public safety. The authority considers that it is appropriate, for the promotion of the licensing objectives, to revoke the licence.

- 3.2 Licensing Authority (including Licensing Enforcement, Environmental Health, Trading Standards, Planning, Health & Safety and Children's Services) : Representation is made on the grounds of the prevention of crime & disorder and public safety. 
Decision:

- 4.6 Having heard all of the representations (from all parties) the Sub-Committee must take such steps as it considers <u>appropriate</u> for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are :
- 4.6.1 to modify the conditions of the licence;
- 4.6.2 to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- 4.6.3 to remove the designated premises supervisor
- 4.6.4 to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- 4.6.5 to revoke the licence [Act s.52].
- 4.7 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, the Sub-Committee should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should generally be directed at those causes and should always be no more than an <u>appropriate</u> and proportionate response [Guid s.11.20].

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Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by the management committee.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

4. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

A digital CCTV must be installed in the premises complying with the 5. following criteria: (1) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside, the bar, the stage and all the floor areas; (2) The cameras facing the entrance doors must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification: (3) Cameras viewing bar areas must capture frames not less then 50% of screen; (4) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (5) Cameras facing the entrance door and cameras on gaming machines must capture a minimum of 16 frames per second; (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (8) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (11) Provide a monitor in full view of customers entering the premises. This monitor must display the images of said customers; (12) Have a separate monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (13) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (14) Have signage displayed on the front entrance door and in the customer area to advise that recorded CCTV is in operation; (15) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (16) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (17) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

6. There will be no 18th birthday parties/celebrations at the premises.

At least 4 prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed 7. throughout the premises warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.

The sale of alcohol shall only take place during pre-arranged events 8. and shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for substantial buffet or sit down meals.

When alcohol is not for sale the bar area and all alcohol shall be 9. sectioned off by the use of a shutter.

10. Children under the age of 18 shall not be admitted to the premises unless they are accompanied by an adult.

11. No more that 480 people, including staff shall be on the premises at any one time.

At any event scheduled to continue after 00:00, with numbers attending 12. expected to be under 240 including staff, two door supervisors shall be employed from 21:00 until 30 minutes after closing time. If numbers expected to attend exceed 240 people including staff, a minimum of four door supervisors shall be employed. This condition does not apply to 'no alcohol' events.

13. A monitored alarm system to EU 50131 must be installed at the premises.

A suitable method e.g. clicker counters, for determining the number of 14. persons on the premises at any one time shall be employed to ensure that the maximum permitted number is not exceeded.

The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age 15. scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.


All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every 16. three months) relating to the sale of alcohol.

17. All training shall be documented and records kept for 12 months. This records must be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

18. When there are more than 240 people on the premises at least one of the shutters that divides the premises shall remain in the open position so that all emergency exits can be accessed.

On Saturday 12th July 2014 at 06:16 hours, Police were called by staff at North Middlesex Hospital to attend A&E regarding two males who had been bought in with gunshot and stab wounds. It was believed that both males received their injuries in the same incident. From initial enquiries it would appear that both males were at an event in The Golden Palace, C38-C42 Harbet Road, Edmonton, N18 3HR. At approximately 05:30 hours, a disturbance took place at the rear of the venue and gun shots were fired. The first victim received one gunshot entry wound to the left side of his abdomen and exit point back of left leg. The second male received stab wounds to his chest and abdomen. Both males were dropped off to hospital in friends cars. A crime scene was then instigated at the venue. One of the victims was unwilling to assist Police with their enquiries despite the serious nature of his potentially life changing injuries. At no time were Police called by the venue to attend this incident.

I hereby certify that in my opinion, this premises is associated with serious crime & disorder and have serious concerns for public safety at The Golden Palace if it is allowed to continue to operate further.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

4. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

5. A digital CCTV must be installed in the premises complying with the following criteria: (1) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside, the bar, the stage and all the floor areas; (2) The cameras facing the entrance doors must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification; (3) Cameras viewing bar areas must capture frames not less then 50% of screen; (4) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (5) Cameras facing the entrance door and cameras on gaming machines must capture a minimum of 16 frames per second; (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (8) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (11) Provide a monitor in full view of customers entering the premises. This monitor must display the images of said customers; (12) Have a separate monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (13) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (14) Have signage displayed on the front entrance door and in the customer area to advise that recorded CCTV is in operation; (15) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (16) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (17) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

6. There will be no 18th birthday parties/celebrations at the premises.

7. At least 4 prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.

8. The sale of alcohol shall only take place during pre-arranged events and shall be ancillary to the use of the premises for substantial buffet or sit down meals.

9. When alcohol is not for sale the bar area and all alcohol shall be sectioned off by the use of a shutter.

10. Children under the age of 18 shall not be admitted to the premises unless they are accompanied by an adult.

11. No more that 480 people, including staff shall be on the premises at any one time.

12. At any event scheduled to continue after 00:00, with numbers attending expected to be under 240 including staff, two door supervisors shall be employed from 21:00 until 30 minutes after closing time. If numbers expected to attend exceed 240 people including staff, a minimum of four door supervisors shall be employed. This condition does not apply to 'no alcohol' events.

13. A monitored alarm system to EU 50131 must be installed at the premises.

14. A suitable method e.g. clicker counters, for determining the number of persons on the premises at any one time shall be employed to ensure that the maximum permitted number is not exceeded.

15. The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.


16. All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every three months) relating to the sale of alcohol.

17. All training shall be documented and records kept for 12 months. This records must be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

18. When there are more than 240 people on the premises at least one of the shutters that divides the premises shall remain in the open position so that all emergency exits can be accessed.



I am Police Constable Martyn Fisher and have worked for the Metropolitan police service for over 25 years. For the past five years I have been in post as Licensing Officer for Enfield Borough Police, dealing with all licensed premises across the borough of Enfield. My role involves proactive patrols of these premises, offering both help and reassurance to patrons and management, as well as ensuring that the premises fully uphold the licensing objectives.

This is a supporting statement regarding an expedited review application for Golden Palace, C38-C42 Harbet road, Edmonton, N18 3HR. It details issues of serious crime & disorder, directly associated with the venue which has triggered the need for Police to call for this expedited review.

I have made a chronology of events of the night in question to assist the licensing sub committee that clearly demonstrates the wholly unacceptable levels of serious violent disorder and threatening behaviour experienced by the innocent patrons attending the banqueting hall that evening.

To begin with, it would be appropriate to give a background history of Golden Palace, including interactions by Police and London Borough of Enfield licensing Enforcement officers.

Golden Palace is ostensibly a banqueting suite that has also held a number of late night events by way of temporary event notices over the last two years. It is currently licensed to supply alcohol until 02:00 and provide live music until 01:00, recorded music until 03:00 and late night refreshment until 01:30 with a closing time of 03:00.

The current DPS is Mr Huseyin Mustafa who has been in post since 4th December 2008 when the licence was

The victim did not assist with the allegation.

Crimint - YERT00372090. (Redacted), as my exhibit MGF/6. Friday 28/03/2014. Refers to an intelligence report about Gangs from Tottenham, Hackney and South London attending Golden Palace over the weekends carrying firearms.

Crimint - CVRT104979. (Redacted), as my exhibit MGF/7. Relates to an intelligence report suggesting that firearms were going to be taken to an event at Golden Palace on 12/04/2014.

This is the enquiry relating to the victim of the shooting. A fight was believed to have started within the venue which caused all of the patrons to run towards the exits. A rear fire exit with a metal staircase was then the scene for one male being shot through the left side of his lower abdomen with an exit wound at the back of his left leg and a second male receiving stab wounds to his chest and abdomen. No calls were made to police by management, staff or security regarding this matter. Both victims were taken to the north Middlesex hospital by friends. Police were called by hospital staff to attend because of the nature of the injuries and also because staff feared that further incidents of a similar nature would continue as both victims attempted to engage in a fight with one another once at the hospital A&E department. Both victims were reluctant to assist Police with their enquiries.

Police attended Golden Place at 06:20 hours to find approximately 50 people still inside and a large crowd outside. The PLH, Mr Ediz Hastunc was still present and stated that he was unaware that anything had taken place and informed Police that the club had closed at 03:00. a search by officers attending discovered two spent cartridges and a bullet outside. When asked to view the venues CCTV, Mr Hastunc stated that it wasn't working and had not been for some time. This was confirmed when officers tried to view it.

This incident involved the significant use of both Police and LAS resources to deal with. With regards to Police resources, this incident required over fifty percent of available staff from night duty to attend, an unacceptable drain on Police resources at a critical time over the weekend.

The evidence I have presented in both this statement and those attached to this application outlines a serious and systematic breakdown in managerial procedures at the venue on the morning of Saturday 12th July 2014. Police were not called at the time of the incident, CCTV was not working as required under condition number 5 on the licence and lastly it has become apparent that the venue was open and operating beyond its terminal hours of 03:00. This is totally unacceptable and completely undermines the licensing objectives, particularly, crime & disorder and public safety.

I would like to highlight in particular the fact that the crime scene itself appears to have been cleared up by staff before the arrival of Police, albeit apparently quite innocently, thus ruining any chance for valuable evidence to be gathered and retained by way of forensic evidence. There appeared to be no effort whatsoever to preserve the scene of the incident which meant customers were allowed to continue contaminate the crime scene.

Further to this, I have not been contacted by anyone from the club in my capacity of licensing officer to discuss the night's events. I spoke to Mr Hastunc on Monday 14th July 2014 to inform him that I was submitting an expedited review for this matter and advised him that I would give him the date and time of the first hearing and that he should seek legal advice.

Police are now seeking an immediate suspension of the premises licence as an interim measure, with the distinct possibility of a full revocation of the premises licence for Golden Palace when the full review is heard in 28 days.

This incident was potentially life threatening and could quite easily have resulted in at least two deaths and possibly more with at least two shots fired amidst large groups of people in a confined fire escape staircase.

I am of the opinion that if licence for this venue is not suspended, further incidents of a similar nature are likely to take place by way of revenge.



On this occasion both venues co-operated. Golden Palace (positive contact by **matrix** after several attempts by both him and me) secured a full voluntary closure. I ensured Club Warehouse bolster their security as they did not wish to close and closure order was not progressed by the Governor.

This is a précis of events and timelines:

10th Apr.

" Intel received that serious anticipated violence and disorder involving Firearms and LX Gang related individuals were to take place at either a club in N18 believed to be Club Warehouse (further Intel awaited) (At this stage Intel from 9th April was not disseminated).

" LBE Licensing Team - Charlotte was away however Mark Galvain provided me with contact details for Warehouse.

" Pan London Licensing spoken to for advice (lan Graham) . TEN (temp. event notice) for Warehouse provided for cross check on activity there.

" Club Warehouse contacted and activity as per TEN discussed and confirmed as same as published (XYZ). I advised DPS to consider options of voluntary closure. Will consider and get back.

" Pan London Licensing - Records held by them checked and confirmed a second club venue in N18 - Golden Palace Banqueting Suite with a supplied TEN but no known name of the event. " LBE (Mark) spoken to re Golden Palace - 3 numbers on file provided to me, 1 dead line, 1 wrong

number and 1 mobile which was No reply repeated ringing and no voicemail facility.

" Pan London Licensing consulted, no further information held by them re this venue. I asked for experienced view of options open to us. I was advised of 3 possible pieces of legislation, (S.19 - not applicable in these circumstances, S.160 - considered the most viable option and advised to pursue this course (it was believed that Warehouse club would likely get collaterally involved through close geographical proximity (if one venue closed then event goers would likely overspill to open venue nearby), or S.161 - again not viable at this stage as no imminent threat. Advised to proceed with S.160.1 closure. Advised that Supt or above required for sign off of paperwork but can be presented at court by myself.

" No known local Authority CCTV known present, nothing on CAD GIS map.

" Paperwork completed, copies of licenses and TEN's obtained and compiled, intelligence product being developed and all sent up to DLS for consideration.

" HCMC court slot booked for Friday pm court.

" Appointment made to see Ma'am Johnson as only available Supt or above at 11.15 the next day. " Full Intel researched by PS Goodley (LIT) and PC Mortimer (Gangs unit)

11th Apr

" A/DS Sharif contacts me and given details of numbers and addresses for Golden Palace Licensee and TEN organiser as still unable to contact.

" DLS (Emma Harraway) contact me and advise a Supt or above must attend court. I queried this on the advice from Pan London.

" DLS then checked their opinion and re-confirmed with experienced licensing Legal rep that a Supt or above required to attend.

" DLS advise they are struggling to find Counsel and request Saturday slot. HCMC refuse Saturday request - DLS advised. Counsel arranged and would meet Ch Supt at HCMC

" Counsel also spoken to by DLS who also states Supt or above must attend to make application

" Intelligence pack, Application Information, License and TEN copied over to Staff officer

" Advised re redaction as In Camera court session not available

" A/DS Sharif makes contact with Golden palace organiser and secures voluntary closure

" Club warehouse decline to voluntarily close however offer to enhance security. I request them to send their proposal in writing for consideration.



Further to our meeting held at Enfield Civic Centre on Tuesday 15th April 2014 with your business partner Mr Trevor Francis, I am writing to you to outline the points we discussed and the actions we agreed upon.

I explained the issues surrounding temporary events taking place at The Golden Palace, particularly with regards to intelligence that some of these events are attracting gang members from all over London and the potential for crime and disorder when these events take place.

As the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor for The Golden Palace, it is your responsibility to ensure that all conditions relating to the premises licence are adhered to.

Police seek your full co-operation in operating your premises in a manner that is likely to promote the licensing objectives at all times, particularly with regards to the prevention of crime & disorder.

I have outlined the actions that we agreed upon that I feel would be both beneficial to you as the premises licence holder and guests visiting your premises particularly with regards to promoted events where there are likely to be large numbers of guest attending.

- 1. No under 25's
- 2. A minimum of ten SIA door supervisors for each promoted event taking place, including at least one female supervisor.
- 3. A search on entry policy including the use of hand held metal detectors for all guests entering the premises including those persons associated with any acts playing on the night.
- 4. Form 696, promoted risk assessment document to be submitted at least 10 working days prior to any promoted event taking place at the Golden Palace to both myself and SCD9.
- No booking shall be taken unless the applicant provides suitable photographic ID, including a driving licence or passport and two utility bills relating to the address of the applicant.

Would you be so kind as to confirm to me by 30th April 2014 by email or in writing that you are happy with the proposed actions and are willing to undertake them in order to promote the licensing objectives, particularly with regards to the prevention of Crime & Disorder.

I will remind you that the Metropolitan Police, acting in its role as a responsible authority, may apply to the licensing authority for a premises licence review without notice if you fail to uphold the licensing objectives.

The MPS and London Borough of Enfield are fully committed to reducing all forms of antisocial behaviour and will take a robust approach to gang related intelligence at the earliest opportunity.

The Borough Commander of Enfield is fully supportive of all measures available to us and is prepared to take appropriate action as and when required.

2. On Saturday 12th July 2014 police were called by staff at NMH regarding VIW1 being brought in with gunshot wounds and VIW2 being brought in with stab wounds.

This CAD stated that on their arrival in resus VIW1 and VIW2 had a dispute therefore it was believed they were both injured from the same incident.

Officers attempted to speak to VIW2 but he was non-responsive to officers and would only provide hospital staff with his apparant name and dob.

PC Clarke 248YE attended the NMH and dealt with VIW1 in resustation bay 4. Staff stated that he had two gun shot wounds, one to the lower abdomen and one to the upper leg. No members of staff would make a decision of whether the injuries were life threatening or life changing.

VIW1 stated that he had been at the GOLDEN PALACE which is near to THE WAREHOUSE. VIW1 stated that he had been in the club for most of the evening with his friends.

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There was a large amount of people running towards the rear of the venue as there was a believed fight. VIW1 stated that he went to see what the fight was all about. As he walked down the metal stairs at the rear of the venue he saw a big fight happening. As VIW1 got to the rear of the stairs he heard gun shots and then realised that he had been shot.

VIW1 was carried into one of his friends cars and taken to the hospital. VIW1 could or would not tell which one of his friends cars he went in. VIW1 could not or would not describe who had shot him.

At this point, VIW1 refused to give any more details as to what had happened and would not speak to Police. VIW1 stated that he was not part of any gangs, did not have any issues with any persons nor had there been any problems/altercations in the club prior to the shooting taking place.

Hospital staff took over VIW1 and would not let Police ask any more questions as they needed to deal with him medically.

Hospital staff decided both VIW1 and 2 needed to be conveyed to Royal London for treatment. LAS G199 conveyed VIW2 to royal london with 428YE as continuity. LAS 280 conveyed VIW1 to royal london with YE321 as continuity.

When YE17N arrived on scene Tojan arrived a short while later. The was an extremely large crowd of IC3 males and females of mixed ages (20-40 years old) and none of them were willing to speak to police.

Police spoke to the club owner Ediz HASTUNC dob 05/12/1972 of Fairways Driving Range, E48TA and he stated that he had not seen or heard anything. He stated that a couple of girls had a small disagreement at about 0330 hours but he stated nothing of note had happened.

When police arrived on scene the club still had about 50 people inside at about 0620 hours even though the club owner stated that the club closed at 0300 hours. The floors of the club had all been cleaned with bleach and water.

Police looked around the location and at the rear of the premises was 2 spent cartridges and a bullet was located.

Keys were taken from the owner with his consent and the building was secured as potentially the victim had come back into the club after the incident. On the metal fire escape steps were what appeared to be traces of blood even though the stairs had been washed.

There was CCTV at the rear of the premises which would have covered where the cartridges and bullet was but the CCTV was on a live feed and does not record. A statement was taken to this effect by the early turn crime scene officer.

Matters quickly developed. I contacted ND duty officer, Insp Skinner, making him aware that I was aware and ready for CID deployment when required. A scene was then established at the rear of the venue where there was blood, a bullet and a casing. Also, three vehicles had been discovered at NMH that had blood either on or in them. These were also secured as potential scenes. I spoke to the ND cluster DI, DI Leonard and appraised him of what actions were being taken by CID. Two officers were sent to the nightclub scene (DC Nakanda and DC Cook) and two more (DC Tomlinson and DC Marston) were sent to the hospital to secure that scene and any clothing that had beentaken from the victims. There is a metal staircase that leads from a fire exit from the banquet hall on the first floor into a roadway / car park at the rear, this stairway had blood up and along it and signs of soapy water as if someone had tried to clean the blood up. Also due to a blood trial and debris the front of the

premises was cordoned off, this is believed to be the route the victim took after the incident, there was further blood through the hall and again this appeared as if someone had tried to clean it up from soapy water.

The banquet hall itself was a further scene.

A firearms recovery dog was sent through the scene and indicated towards two spent casings, one bullet and one small round metal object (unknown) at the rear of the premises.

These with packaged by SOCO and swabs taken from blood at all three areas of the scene.

Inside the venue was a large banquet hall that was left in a state of disarray. There were numerous bottles and smashed glass throughout. There was also noted to be numerous CCTV camera domes situated within the main areas of the hall and entrance way. The owner, Ediz HASTUNC T07741271778, T02085279892 attended the scene. He showed DC Beck where the CCTV system was kept informing him that it was not working and hadn't for some time. This was confirmed when the system was shown to not be powered on.

This was discussed with the CSM John COCKRAM. Due to the lack of CCTV or witnesses that could assist with indicating to the investigating officers where the suspect(s) had been sitting during the night or what they had been drinking / eating out of no swabs or items were seized from within the venue.

Mr HASTUNC indicated that the venue had been hired out to a male called **math** for a birthday party. He did not have the details of the lease and will be contacting DC Beck with the details. All the security / bar / kitchen staff were hired by Mr HASTUNC and a full list will be supplied to

DC Beck as possible witnesses. Mr. HUGGUNC himself was working at the venue last night in the kitchen area and did not witness the incident. He indicated that they had started to clean the blood up however there does not appear to be any malicious intent and he states he was unaware that a shooting had taken place.

From the trading estate CCTV the apparent suspects are seen to enter a blue BMW X3 with a possible VRM of **CTTV**, this is seen to exit the trading estate at 06:02:44. Research is being conducted and this vehicle has been circulated.



He showed DC Beck where the CCTV system was kept informing him that it was not working and hadn't for some time. This was confirmed when the system was shown to not be powered on.

This was discussed with the CSM John COCKRAM. Due to the lack of CCTV or witnesses that could assist with indicating to the investigating officers where the suspect(s) had been sitting during the night or what they had been drinking / eating out of no swabs or items were seized from within the venue.

Mr HASTUNC indicated that the venue had been hired out to a male called **the** for a birthday party. He did not have the details of the lease and will be contacting DC Beck with the details. All the security / bar / kitchen staff were hired by Mr HASTUNC and a full list will be supplied to DC Beck as possible witnesses. Mr HUSTUNC himself was working at the venue last night in the kitchen area and did not witness the incident. He indicated that they had started to clean the blood up however there does not appear to be any malicious intent and he states he was unaware that a shooting had taken place.

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE - 17 JULY 2014

Application was made by the **METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE** for the premises known as and situated at **GOLDEN PALACE**, C38 & C42, 35 HARBET ROAD, EDMONTON N18 for a **SUMMARY REVIEW** of the premises licence.

The Licensing Sub-Committee considered that it wasn't necessary to take any interim steps.

Reasons:

The Chairman made the following statement :

"The Licensing Sub-Committee (LSC) convened in person to consider the Summary Licence Review brought by the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) with regard to the licence covering Golden Palace premises on Harbet Road, Edmonton.

In its deliberations, the LSC acknowledged that without doubt, the incident which occurred at the rear of the venue in the early morning of 12th July, was of a most serious nature; and will be the subject of criminal prosecutions in a court of law at a future time.

The statements by PC Fisher and Superintendent Robinson both proffer their opinions that the premises is associated with serious crime and disorder; and that they have concerns that further incidents of a similar nature are likely to take place by way of revenge. However such concerns do not, evidentially, link to the premises as a focus for any such future incidents.

From the bundle of criminal intelligence and other police papers, we were told that the premises has previously been associated with crime and disorder, with known incidents of firearms being taken to, if not necessarily within the venue. And yet, on the basis of such information and limited episodes of relatively minor assaults having occurred at the premises, the MPS had not to date seen fit to call a review of the licence or to facilitate, by agreement, strengthening the conditions of the current licence.

Indeed, on one occasion, according to the statement of PC Fisher, the licence holder (Mr Hastunc) acted in direct response to a police request to cancel an event that was due to take place as a preventative measure to head off a potentially serious incident involving firearms.

No indications exist, either from previous dealings, or within the present application, to suggest that the operation of the premises licence is poorly managed or operated inappropriately.

There is limited information or evidence to suggest this was the case on 12th July either.

It is the decision of the LSC that no interim steps are necessary pending the determination of the full review on the 6th August 2014.

There is no evidential link in the application to indicate or suggest that supply of alcohol was

in any way material to the incident that took place. The conditions of the licence, in our opinion, remain appropriate to the nature of the premises and legitimate activities taking place there. And we do not feel from the application that the actions of the licence holder and DPS actively contributed to the specific incident of 12th July.

In coming to its decision, the LSC focused therefore on whether suspension of the licence pending the full review would be necessary for the effective promotion of the licensing objectives.

It was the view of the LSC that there was insufficient evidence compelling enough for members to take such a step, in spite of the serious nature of the incident covered in the papers.

The MPS was not able to demonstrate whether any licensable activity was taking place in the hours more immediately preceding the incident, whether the licence holder, DPS, or both had knowledge of any incidents requiring them to call the police or other emergency services at any time beyond 03:00, or that the licence was actively being breached to a level that might lead to suspension of the licence.

We note that there was a number of people still present inside the premises, and congregating outside, beyond the terminal hour on the licence, but we were presented with insufficient evidence to determine a direct linkage between poor or inappropriate management of the premises, poor or inappropriate operation of the licence, and the incident that ensued.

Nor could we be sufficiently satisfied that the criminal activity was initiated or directly predicated by events inside the premises, or linked to the premises.

Such evidence may indeed exist, and the MPS and the licence holder will have an opportunity at the review meeting to present (orally and prior written submissions) more detailed accounts of what actually took place and what steps were taken on the evening and night of Friday 11th into Saturday 12th July, to a degree that was not available to the LSC in the papers supporting this application.

In conclusion, the LSC noted that the MPS did not appear to consider that a combination of the track record of the premises (as alleged), the intelligence they held, nor the shooting and stabbing incidents that occurred, was sufficient for them to deploy the alternative powers open to them under Sections 161 – 165 of the Licensing Act 2003 to close the premises.

Furthermore, there was no explanation, as covered in the Section 53A Summary Review Guidance, as to why other powers or actions were considered not to be an appropriate response to the serious nature of the incidents that took place as a result of a disturbance in very close proximity to The Golden Palace."

relation to the expedited review I submitted for **Golden Palace Banqueting Suite**, C38, 35 Harbet Road, Edmonton, N18 3HU on 15th July 2014.

Since the initial application was submitted, the enquiry into both the shooting and stabbing allegations have continued and I now submit an updated copy of that CRIS report outlining the ongoing investigation thus far.

CRIS: 5215184/14, (Redacted), as my exhibit MGF/2A. (This is a continuation of the investigation taken up from my initial submission made on 15th July 2014. Both CRIS enquiries 5215184/14 and 5215314/14 are being investigated as one incident and all updates to the enquiry are on this report). As can be seen from the report, both victims have been very reticent to assist police with the enquiry and have yet to make any form of official statement about their involvement in the nights events despite a number of requests made by the investigating officer DC Beck.

DC Beck has been provided with details of members of staff working at Golden Palace on the night and has spoken to several persons as follows:

Page 27 of 40. Hall hired out by a female called Lisa for her friend Latoya. No specific reason for the party and no guest list. The event was advertised by flyers.

Page 28 of 40. Male states that he recalled seeing an argument within the venue and hearing gunshots. Same male also drove victim to hospital.

Page 33 of 40. Staff member Esmond Blake stated that he was working in the kitchen on the night but left at 02:45 as he didn't like the look of some of the persons arriving at the venue as they had hoods on and made him

feel uneasy. (This statement would suggest that people were still arriving and entering the premise at 02:45) **Page 37 of 40.** Phone call to DC beck by victim stating that he attended the party at Golden Palace as it was advertised by way of flyers. Victim states that he was dancing at the venue and hearing a bang and then ending up at hospital. (This statement would suggest that the victim was shot inside of the venue although even at this stage it has not been confirmed exactly where both incidents took place)

Exhibit MGF/14. This is a floor plan of Golden Palace which indicates the point at which the shooting/stabbing is believed to have taken place on the steps of a fire escape at the back of the dance floor area. This premise is on the first floor of an industrial unit. The entrance is to the hall has also been indicated along with the location of the bar, kitchen and office.

Exhibit JB/1. This is a copy of the personal data request to the Security Industry Authority (SIA) made by DC Beck on Mr Wayne Henry. Mr Hastunc provided Mr Henry's details as being the head of security for the night of 12th July 2014. The response from the SIA shows that Mr Henry does not hold and has never held a licence from the SIA.

Exhibit JR/1. This is a statement from PC James Robinson regarding his involvement in this incident. PC Robinson attends the A&E department at North Middlesex hospital along with PC Gareth Bowen at approximately 06:30 hours after a call made by staff from the hospital for police to attend as two males had been taken in with gunshot and stab wounds. Further information received that rival gang members were also at the hospital attempting to get to both victims causing a nuisance. PC Robinson gives evidence that he was informed by a PC Clark that one of the victims had told him that he had been shot at a nightclub venue called 'Golden Palace' PC Robinson then updates the Police control room with this information. PC Robinson also gives evidence that he along with other officers had to remain outside the A&E department in order to prevent what he describes as a large group of males from getting in or to any of the ambulances that were taking the victims to the Royal free hospital for further treatment.

Exhibit GB/1. This is a statement from PC Gareth Bowen corroborating the statement as given by PC Robinson as above.

Both of the above statements evidence the knock on effect of this incident to not only Police but also staff working at the North Middlesex hospital with rival gangs attending and causing a disturbance. This is an unacceptable reality of gang behaviour impacting on not just the victims but NHS staff alike.

Exhibit RG/1. This is a statement from PC Roy Geraghty who attended Golden Palace at approximately 06:30 hours along with PC Jamie Williams after having been informed that it was the location of a shooting incident. PC Geraghty describes how upon arriving he saw approximately 250 people walking around outside of the venue. PC Geraghty meets with the premises licence holder Mr Ediz Hastunc and another male who he was informed was a doorman although not seen to be displaying an SIA badge. PC Geraghty describes entering the premises with Mr Hastunc to see 30 - 50 people still inside and a strong smell of cannabis and also cleaners at work which he asked them to stop doing. PC Geraghty mentions that Mr Hastunc stated that nothing had happened inside and that he was not aware of anything happening outside.

Exhibit JW/1. Statement from PC Jamie Williams corroborating the statement from PC Roy Geraghty as above. PC Williams describes finding a pool of blood outside of the venue and two bullet shell casings. Spots of blood were also found on the fire escape stairs leading in to Golden Palace. This area was cordoned off by PC Williams as a potential crime scene. PC Williams describes the premise as having no music on when he attended with the floor covered in alcoholic containers and about 50 people outside who appeared to be very drunk.

Exhibit JN/1. Statement from DC James Nakanda who attended the scene at approximately 07:00 hours and his involvement in dealing with the crime scene.

Exhibit IM/1. Statement from Trainee DC Ian Marston who attended North Middlesex hospital and his involvement in gathering evidence at that venue.

Exhibit DS/1. Statement from Inspector Skinner giving evidence of the numbers of officers involved in this incident, sixteen in total and the fact that 21 officers including Inspector skinner had to work in to their rest days incurring the equivalent of three months overtime for this one matter.

This statement outlines the extensive impact to Enfield borough Police both financially and in resources to deal with this serious incident that could have been avoided if the venue had not been open and trading after hours.

I myself have had further interaction with the premises licence holder Mr Ediz Hastunc since this incident as follows;

9. A copy of your personal licence to sell alcohol.

10. Details of how many people attending the event on Saturday 12th July 2014.

Wednesday 16th July 2014. I telephone called Mr Hastunc this morning at 08:00 hours and asked him if he could met me at Golden Palace today in order to conduct a full licence inspection. Mr Hastunc stated that he was too unwell to attend. I asked if the DPS Mr Huseyin Mustafa was available to attend as an alternative. Mr Hastunc informed me that Mr Mustafa was no longer part of the business as he had been living in Cyprus for the last year. (Further appointment made for Friday 18th July)

Friday 18th July 2014. I phoned Mr Hastune this morning to confirm our meeting this morning at Golden Palace to conduct a licence inspection. Mr Hastune again claimed he was too ill to make the appointment.

I asked him what events were due to take place between today and the review hearing on Wednesday 6th August. Mr Hastunc assured me that he would voluntarily not open until after the hearing on that date.

I was on annual leave between Saturday 19th July 2014 and Sunday 27th July 2014 hence no further updates during this period.

Monday 28th July 2014. I have spoken to Mr Ediz Hastunc today at 13:05 and asked why I had not received a response to my request made on 15th July 2014 for details of staff working on the 12th July and copies of staff training records. Mr Hastunc stated that all of the paperwork was with his legal representative.

I have also made an appointment for a PACE interview with Mr Hastunc and his legal representative on Wednesday 30th July 2014 at 10:00 as this was the first occasion that Mr Hastunc was available. I would like to present evidence from this meeting to the licensing sub - committee at the review hearing. This meeting has been arranged at the earliest opportunity that I could make with Mr Hastunc and I feel that the outcome of the interview will be relevant to the decision making process of the licensing sub – committee in this matter.

Monday 28th July 2014, 14:25 hours. I have phoned Mr Wayne Henry the security supervisor responsible for Golden Palace on the night of Saturday 12th July 2014. When asked, Mr Henry stated that he did not hold an SIA licence as it had recently lapsed. A check on the SIA licence holder's site does not show him as having held a licence either presently or in the past. (Please see exhibit JB/1)

Mr Henry stated that he regularly worked at Golden Palace for Mr Ediz Hastunc and that on Saturday 12th July he had provided 6 door staff to cover the night which was a birthday party but that the event was also open to

customers not on the guest list for a contribution of £10 at the door.

Mr Henry stated that he had counted in at least 270 people on his clicker on the night and that at 03:00 he had let two of his door staff go home as it was fairly quiet!

Mr Henry stated that alcohol was served until approximately 03:15 hours, the music continued until 03:45 and that hot food was sold until 04:00 as served by Mr Hastunc himself.

I asked Mr Henry if he had details of the other door staff working on the night and he informed me that he had passed on their details to Mr Hastunc the following week. I informed him that I had not been given their details and asked that he provide me with a further copy either by text or via a phone call. Mr Henry agreed to do this.

When asked what had happened during the night, Mr Henry stated that although he had not heard any gunshots, he heard from guests that shots had been fired and that when he went to the fire escape where he was told the incident had taken place, he saw groups of males pushing each other. He stated that he saw a little blood on the floor and separated the groups and pushed them towards the car park area. He asked if anyone was injured and was told that everything was okay. Mr Henry went on to say that he only found out about the shooting and stabbing when Police turned up and remained on scene to assist until 07:00 hours.

Lastly, when asked why people were still inside of the venue at 06:30 when police arrived, he said that they were the party organisers and birthday girl.

Police are seeking the revocation of the premises licence for 'Golden Palace' under the licensing objectives relating to 'The prevention of Crime & Disorder' and 'Public safety', for the following reasons.

Despite Police intervention and advice to the Premises licence holder Mr Ediz Hastunc regarding intelligence that the premises was attracting known gang members from all over London at a meeting held on Tuesday 15th April 2014, Mr Hastunc chose to ignore the advice given and the undertakings he promised to adhere to as set out in a follow up letter sent on 2nd April 2014 (Please see exhibit MGF/10)

A number of breaches of the licence have also been identified as a result of this application as follows;

The designated premises supervisor (DPS) Mr Huseyin Mustafa no longer has any involvement with the business and has not lived in this country for over a year and as such cannot realistically be responsible for the supervision

of the sale/supply of alcohol and day to day overseeing of the licence. Enfield councils licensing were not informed of this information and no applications have been made to vary the DPS during this period.

Mr Hastunc no longer resides at the address given on the licence and again has not informed Enfield councils licensing team of his change of address.

As has been mentioned in my previous statement, this venue is being run, for all intents and purposes, as a night club with inadequate conditions to suit such an undertaking.

Even with the relatively conditions in place, it has become apparent that a number of these are also in breach.

Condition 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence. (Mr Hastunc states that he holds a personal licence but despite my requests has yet to provide me with proof)

Condition 5. A digital CCTV system must be installed at the premises. (The CCTV system was not working on the night of 12th July 2014 and by Mr Hastunc's own admission, had not been working for some time. Had the system been working, it would have provided investigating officers with invaluable evidence to assist them with their enquiry in to the shooting/stabbing on the night of 12th July 2014)

Conditions 16 & 17. Despite my request to Mr Hastunc's solicitor on Tuesday 15th July 2014, I have as yet to be provided with records of members of staff and/or their training records.

The head doorman Mr Wayne Henry was acting in his capacity without holding a relevant SIA licence. He stated that he had engaged six other door staff to work on the night of the 12th July 2014 and that he himself became actively involved in breaking up a disturbance which appeared to be shortly after the shooting and stabbing had taken place by the fire escape at the back of the venue.

Further to the above it has become apparent that the Golden Palace was open and in breach of its terminal hours. Mr Henry stated that alcohol was served until approximately 03:15 hours when the licence only provides for the supply of alcohol until 02:00. The music continued until 03:45 when all music is only authorised until 03:00 hours. Lastly, Mr Henry stated that late night refreshment was sold by way of hot food 04:00 as served by Mr Hastunc himself. Late night refreshment should have ceased at 01:30 hours.

The shooting/stabbing took place at approximately 05:30 hours with one of the victims stating that he was still dancing at the time which would show that the premises was still operating at this hour despite what Mr Henry

has said in relation to the ceasing of licensable activity in my phone call to him.

At no time were Police called to the venue by management or staff to the incident on Saturday 12th July 2014. I find it very difficult to believe that no one working on the night was unaware of such a serious incident despite saying otherwise. Valuable time was wasted by the lack of a phone call to Police that may well have resulted in securing better evidence and also may well have led to the apprehension of the suspects involved and provision of immediate medical care to the victims.

In conclusion, it is quite apparent that this premise is associated with gang activity. Police Intelligence reports corroborate this statement. In guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. Section 11.27 states 'There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously.' Included in the list is the use of licensed premises 'as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs'.

I would suggest that Police intelligence reports would be sufficient evidence to prove that the Golden Palace is a base for criminal gang activity alongside the serious nature of the incident on Saturday 12th July 2014.

A lack of compliance with conditions and hours have been highlighted throughout this report as well as the lack of a phone call to police to report the very serious incident on the morning of Saturday 12th July 2014 have led Police to have no confidence whatsoever in the ability of the premises licence holder Mr Ediz Hastunc to not only run this or any other licensed premises.

Police have grave concerns that should this venue be allowed to continue to operate, it would lead to further gang related activity taking place within and may well lead to further serious incidents of a similar nature.

However, should the licensing committee not be minded to revoke the premises licence in its entirety, it is requested that the licensable hours be reduced as detailed below:

Police would also seek to amend and implement extra conditions on the current licence in order to support the licensing objectives as follows.

To be added as a sub section to the current condition:

5. If the CCTV system is not operating and recording, no licensable activity shall take place.

Additional conditions:

- 1. The minimum age of patrons entering the premises shall be not less than 21 years.
- 2. There must be a written search and refusal of entry policy, which must be agreed by Police. All door supervisors must be fully trained in the policy and sign a document to that end.
- 3. Search wands or a search arch must be utilised to deter and detect weapons taken into the club.
- 4. At least one member of the staff located in the bar must hold a personal licence.
- 5. All door supervisors must be provided by a supplier listed on the SIA approved contractor list.
- 6. The designated premises supervisor or a member of the management shall monthly, check their door supervisor's registration on the Security Industry Authority (SIA) website to ensure their licences are current. Written records of these checks shall be maintained, signed and dated by the person completing the checks. The records shall be kept for 12 months and made available to Police or the local authority on request.
- 7. The Metropolitan Police risk assessment form 696 shall be completed and forwarded to the current email address on the form for all promoted events.
- 8. There shall be no entry to the premises one hour before closing time.
- 9. A sign shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises informing customers of the closing time and last time of entry to the premises
- 10. Upon entry to the premises every customer must be hand searched. These searches shall include the searching of the customers' person, wallets, purses, bags and any other items carried on or by the customer. To support this policy, hand held wands shall be used. I understand these items were submitted to the Metropolitan Police Service Forensic Firearms Unit (FFU) on the 16th July 2014.

I took possession of the items on the 18th July 2014.

DESCRIPTION OF ITEMS

LRS/2 and LRS/4 each contained a fired 9mm Short (.380 Automatic) calibre cartridge case bearing headstamp brand markings used by the Czech company Sellier & Bellot.

Using a microscope, I compared the firing marks made on LRS/2 and LRS/4 by the gun or guns that had fired them. I found significant matching detail in the firing marks; in my opinion these two cartridge cases had been fired in the same gun.

LRS/5 was a fired 9mm Short (.380 Automatic) calibre jacketed bullet that had been deformed by impact.

The bullet LRS/5 may have once formed part of a complete round of ammunition with either of the fired cartridge cases submitted. It is not usually possible to associate fired bullets and fired cartridge cases with any certainty; however, there is nothing to suggest the use of

more than one gun to fire the items recovered.

In my opinion, the firing marks present on the cartridge cases and bullet indicated that they had been fired by a self-loading pistol.

LRS/6 was a piece of non-firearms related metallic debris.

OPEN CASE FILE CHECK RESULT

LRS/2, LRS/4 and LRS/5 have undergone a national Open Case File (OCF) check using the IBIS automated searching system. In addition, LRS/2 and LRS/5 have been manually checked against all suitable samples held on this laboratory's OCF from incidents that occurred in 2014 and the previous two years.

No connections were detected.

LRS/2, LRS/4 and LRS/5 have been retained on the part of the national OCF held by the FFU, where they may be checked against suitable items that are submitted.

SUMMARY

From examination of the submitted items, it is my opinion that:

•One 9mm Short (.380 Automatic) calibre gun was discharged at least twice during this incident. •The gun used was most likely a self-loading pistol.

•Fired ammunition components such as those submitted are not subject to restriction under the Firearms Act 1968 and its amendments. It is reasonable to assume in the circumstances that these items originally formed part of at least two live rounds of bulleted ammunition; in their unfired state the whole cartridges would have constituted ammunition as defined in section 57(2) of the Firearms Act 1968 and would have been subject to restriction under the provisions of section 1(1)(b) of that Act. •Although it is not possible to give a definitive classification of the gun used in this incident unless it is recovered,

I was initially advised that an IC3 MALE who I could see was being treated in bay 4 had given his details as XXXXXXXXX had been brought in by friends to the A and E and at this point it was believed he had two gun shot wounds. One to his lower abdomen and one to his upper leg.

I was also advised that the IC4 MALE in bay 2 had given his details as XXXXXXXXX had also come in but on

foot without anyone else but at the same time as XXXXX and it was believed XXXXXX had three stab wounds to his chest/stomach area but initially staff stated that these could be gunshot wounds.

I was aware at this point that two Haringey Police Constables who were present in the A and E when these MALEs were brought in had taken a MALE that had stated he was a family member of XXXXX to a side room to try and speak to him regarding this matter and I was also advised by A and E staff that when both MALEs were first brought in to the resus bays for treatment that XXXXX attempted to grab at XXXXXX therefore they made the assumption that their injuries were from the same incident which could have been from them being from rival gangs and feared that this matter would escalate between them and also XXXXXX friends outside the A and E.

I was aware from radio transmitions that a number of my response teams officers were outside the hospital attempting to speak to and deal with the group in the car park and I was also aware from the P.R that CCTV had seen XXXXXX enter the hospital on foot on his own but Mullins had been taken to A and E in a vehicle.

Once staff had initially dealt with both XXXXXX and XXXXXX I then attempted to speak to XXXXXX while PC Clark 248YE who was also present in A and E spoke with XXXXXX.

Mr XXXXXX would not respond to me at all and would not advise me of how he obtained his injuries or where he had been when he was injured.

I was advised by PC Clark that he had been told by XXXXXX that he had been shot at a night club venue called the Golden Palace, N18 and then conveyed to hospital in a friends vehicle.

This information was all updated on the P.Rs to the control room.

I requested pre-transfusion blood for XXXXXX from a Doctor XXXXX XXXX who advised me some had been taken prior to my attendance at the hospital and would be stored at the hospital if it was required as part of the investigation.

At this point firearms officers joined us in the resus area in order to protect both XXXXXX and XXXXX from any further assault.

I was updated by A and E staff that they could not confirm whether either XXXXX or XXXXX injuries were life changing/threatening but I was advised that they both needed to be conveyed to Royal London hospital with LAS for treatment.

This was arranged by A and E staff.

On arrival of the LAS ambulances XXXXX was placed in LAS H289 with a continuity officer present who obtained his clothing and XXXXX was placed in LAS G199 with PC 428YE Daws present as continuity who had also obtained his clothing.

Both MALEs then left the hospital to go to Royal London with firearms officers following for security/protection. When I left the A and E at NMH I saw that there was still a large group outside. I joined the other officers who were in various points around the ambulance bay vehicle access area in order to prevent any of this group getting at or in to any of the ambulances as they left the hospital.



On Saturday 12th July 2014 I was on duty in plain clothes working with PC Geraghty 395YE in an unmarked police vehicle call sign YE17N.

At about 06:20AM we accepted a call to attend the North Middlesex hospital where there was a report of disorder and a firearm had been mentioned.

We made our way to the hospital along with other police units and waited outside the hospital for an update from other officers.

They informed us that there was a victim who had been shot and it may have occurred near the warehouse nightclub. We made our way to the night club and found that it was closed and there was no one around.

We drove back onto Harbet Road N18 and drove east where we came to a number of people and vehicles blocking the road. The people were leaving the Hastingwood Trading estate and it was clear from the way they were dressed that they had attended a clubbing venue.

We entered the trading estate and made our way to the venue were people were leaving which was The Golden Palace. We went up the stairs to the first floor where we was met by the owner a Mr Ediz Hastunc who said there had been about 300 people at the venue and there had been no problems and he was not aware of any incidents outside.

While speaking to Mr Hastunc the victim has told officers that the incident occurred behind the venue. I walked to the rear of the venue and discovered a pool of blood and spots of blood. I also found two bullet shell casings.

While trying to secure the crime scene a member of the public from one of the business units approached me and showed me a bullet which he had found when opening a gate for one of his workers.

A second walk through of the crime scene showed spots of blood on the fire escape stairs which leads into the Golden Palace. By this stage Mr Hastunc had left the keys to the venue with PC Geraghty and left.

When we got to the venue the event had finished and there was no music and the staff were in the process of cleaning up. The dance floor was covered in alcoholic containers and there was an area in the venue that had been serving food.

There were about 50 people outside the venue who appeared to be very drunk and rowdy. I did not see any security staff at the venue and I didn't ask if any had been present.

Mr Hastunc was not drunk and was asked about the CCTV outside the venue, he said it is controlled by the trading estate so if we want to view it then we should speak to the reception.

On Saturday 12th July 2014 at approximately 0700 hours, on my arrival to work I was informed by DS Hayes that there had been a firearms incident at The Golden Palace in the Hastingwood Trading Estate, N18. I was requested to attend the scene to assist with the initial investigation and assist colleagues. I attended the scene with T/DC Lisa Cook and PC Adam Traidia at approximately 0800 hours and was met with DC Beck and DC Trotman of SC&O8 Trident. I entered the scene which had already been cordoned off by uniform officers outside a large building I believed to be the Golden Palace. I could see a small amount of blood within this cordon, approximately ten (10) metres in front of Unit 22A. A cordon officer also pointed out a small builet shell close to this blooded area. I walked out of this scene and along the industrial estate making a note of any CCTV opportunities as well as looking for any further signs of evidence related to the offence such as blood or bullet shells. Initially I did not find any signs of further evidence and so turned my attention to contacting the management of the industrial estate for their assistance with CCTV. I was given the name and a telephone number by some of the occupants of a unit within the estate, who informed me that she managed the site. I spoke to **finant** on the phone who informed me that she was in Dorset but she would speak to her security manager **difference** and request he assist police. **Chippe** then attended the scene and together we reviewed CCTV footage of the incident. I requested this footage was burnt to disc which with completed and provided a statement exhibiting the footage. All master copies were sealed in his presence and he signed the exhibit bags for these. **Circum** then burnt off working copies of this footage for officers to view. I conducted an extended walk around the industrial estate now having seen CCTV which showed the possible suspects running towards the car park area. I noticed blooded splatter marks on the floor next to a parked vehicle outside Block A21. The blood trail led from this point, towards the entrance to The Golden Palace where a cordon had already been put in place. From seeing CCTV I could see that this had been the route taken by the believed victim. I extended the cordons already in place at 1300 hours to incorporate this blood splatter and requested Soco to photograph and swab this area which they did. Trident officers then closed the scene and at around 1700 hours I made my way back to Edmonton Police Station. I left the statement taken from **CONT** and CCTV exhibits with Edmonton CID Team 3 officers to be handed to DC Beck on his arrival.

On Saturday the 12th July 2014 I was on duty employed as the Duty Inspector for Enfield Borough Police. My team was about to finish their Friday night shift when CAD 2378 came in at 0615 hrs. This CAD was a call to the North Middlesex Hospital where a male had arrived with multiple gun shot wounds followed by another male with three stab wounds to the chest. Staff stated there was a large disturbance at the hospital and that the males were from rival gangs. Very shortly afterwards officers from Haringey Borough who were in A&E with a prisoner requested urgent assistance. This was due to large numbers of youths trying to get into the resus area.

When officers from A Team arrived they dealt with the large crowd and moved them into the car park area of A&E. Officers also went into resus and secured both victims and dealt with them. After a short while one of these victims stated he had been shot outside Club Warehouse. As a result of this I deployed an unmarked unit to the Warehouse area and an ARV.

Further information revealed that the venue of the shooting was actually the Golden Palace banqueting suite. The unmarked car was redeployed to this location. On arrival the officers searched the area and recovered bullet casings and blood trail.

In total sixteen officers were deployed in relation to the shooting/ stabbing. Their deployments were as follows:

Two officers at the Golden Palace securing the venue and bullet casings. Two officers securing a vehicle at the NMH which had blood covered clothing inside. Two officers securing a vehicle at the NMH which had blood covering the outside of it. Two officers securing a vehicle at the NMH which had splattering of blood on the outside. Two officers securing the resus bay and clothing of the shooting victim. Two officers securing the resus bay and clothing of the stabbing victim. Two officers dealing with the crowd in the car park.

When the early shift came on duty they deployed 4 officers immediately to go with the victims on a fast run to the Royal London Hospital acting as continuity officers. This prevented further A Team officers being deployed. After briefing A/Inspector Hamill she deployed her officers to relieve A Team officers.

Due to the large number of officers needing to be relieved as a result of this incident a further four A Team officers could not be relieved. Two were dealing with a 136 patient at Chase Farm Hospital and two were dealing with a RTC in Plevna Road.

In total 20 officers (21 including myself) worked into their rest day until 0900hrs. As a result of this each officer was entitled to four hours plus travelling overtime. The cost for dealing with the initial incident will be close to the equivalent of three months allocation of overtime for A Team.

I handed the incident over to A/Inspector Hamill to deploy her resources to which I am aware had a massive impact on her ability to respond to calls during her shift.

I certify that I have considered this review and I wish to make representations supporting the review application as activities at the premises are detrimental to the following Licensing Objectives:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety

Background History:

This review application, submitted by the police is to revoke the licence following a violent incident which occurred at the premises at approximately 05:30 on Saturday 12th July 2014. The incident resulted in one male being stabbed and another being shot. These are serious, potentially life changing injuries and are referred to in the police report as attempted murder.

The premises is currently licensed for the following activities and times:

When police officers arrived at the premises at 06:20 there were approximately 50 people inside and a large crowd outside the premises despite the fact that the premises should have closed almost 3 ½ hours before hand. The Police report states that the incident occurred at approximately 05:30 with a fight starting inside the premises causing all of the patrons to run towards the exits. A rear fire exit was then the scene of the shooting and stabbing. There was no temporary event notice in place on this occasion and the premises should have closed at this time.

The Premises Licence Holder (PLH) was on site during the event. The fact that he allowed people to remain on the premises after the permitted licensed hours and did not ensure that the crime scene was preserved leads to a lack of confidence in his ability to responsibly manage a licensed premises. According to the police report the Premises Licence Holder claimed he did not know that the incident had occurred. Despite staff having cleaned up blood and a bullet and two spent cartridges being found at the scene no call was made to the police by the premises licence holder, staff or door supervisors.

The DPS Mr Huseyin Mustafa was not on the premises at the time of the incident and has not worked at the premises for approximately 2 years.

The police were notified of the incident by hospital staff who feared that further incidents may occur at the hospital as both victims were attempting to fight with each other once they arrived there. This put public safety at risk.

On arrival at the premises police discovered that the CCTV system was not working which is a breach of condition 5 of the licence. The lack of CCTV footage could have serious implications on the police investigation seriously reducing their chance of catching those responsible for these criminal activities.

In a letter dated 22nd April 2014 PC Fisher reminded the licence holder that it was his responsibility to ensure that all of the licence conditions were adhered to and that a review application may be submitted should he fail to uphold the licensing objectives.

Police intelligence over the last year suggests that this premises is attended by rival gangs and that fire arms are being taken to the premises. This incident appears to be proof that this intelligence is correct.

I have serious concerns that following this attempted murder, revenge attacks could take place should the premises be permitted to retain it's premises licence. Innocent members of the public could be put at risk should they attend events at the premises and be caught up in the cross fire of potential future gun fights.

In the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 section 11.27 states 'There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously.' Included in the list is the use of licensed premises 'as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs'. Although there may not be sufficient evidence to prove that the Golden Palace is a **base** for criminal gang activities police intelligence and this recent incident suggest that events being held at the premises is attracting criminal gang activity.

Section 11.26 of the guidance also states 'The Licensing authority's duty is to take steps with a view to the promotion of the licensing objectives in the interests of the wider community and not those of the individual licence holder'.

27/02/13 – 10:15 – 10:30 – Licensing Enforcement Officer (CPX) visited premises re non payment of annual fee. Left information with staff and also advised that inspection due. Asked for owner to contact officer.

01/03/13 – Officer received a phone call from PLH who said they have not been receiving any of their post as it was going to a neighbouring property and they were returning it to the sender. Has now paid the annual fee. Booked full inspection for 2pm 12th March 2013.

12/03/13 – 14:00 – 14:30 Licensing Enforcement Officer (CPX) - arrived to carry out full licence inspection at pre-arranged appointment. PLH did not turn up, phoned him and left a voicemail message to contact officer. Attempted to carry out inspection but most conditions need to be checked during an event. Unable to check 11, 12, 13, 14, 18 as related to events. Also unable to check C5, 13, 16, 17 as staff unable to assist. One male member of staff on premises during visit - did not know where training records were etc. Alcohol on display in fridge in cafe area. Advised that it can only be sold during prearranged events AND when there is a substantial buffet or table meal. Advised to remove from cafe area or cover up at times that pre-arranged events are not taking place. Could only see 1 drugs poster - 3 more given. Think 25 poster given to display.

25/08/14 – 00:15 – 00:40 - Out of Hours Licensing Enforcement officers (JF) visited the premises to check the outstanding conditions. The following issues were discovered: C5 - Unable to check CCTV, C16, 17 – Training book was unavailable (owner claimed someone from the council had taken it away but did not know who).

24/07/14 – 10:05 – 12:00 Licensing Enforcement Officer (CPX) and Planning Enforcement Officer (RH) - arrived to carry out full licence inspection at pre-arranged appointment with Premises Licence Holder. The following issues were discovered:

C5 – Unable to check CCTV as the Premises Licence Holder did not know the password, the one he had did not work. He said that a fuse had blown which was the reason it was not working at the time of the incident and that had now been fixed.

C7 – Drugs posters – only 1 of 4 on display. PLH stated that the premises had been painted 3 days before the incident and posters had been taken down to decorate.

C13 – The Banqueting Hall does not have it's own alarm however the whole unit is apparently covered by the alarm which was installed by the site managers.

C15 – One 'No ID, No Sale' sticker seen on fridge. Advised that the council promotes 'Think 25' and to download and display posters from the council's website – details provided on inspection report.

C17 – Training records not available – advised that he has past these to his legal representative.

Part B of the licence not on display – PLH stated this was with his legal representative and that he had lost Part A. Advised to write to Licensing Team requesting a duplicate copy and pay £10.50 admin fee.

The PLH has not lived at the address listed for him on the licence for the last 9 months. The PLH advised that he still owns the property but that it is rented out and that he will be returning there in 2 months time. The PLH was advised by the officer that it is a legal requirement to advise the Licensing Team of a change of residential address.

When asked the PLH confirmed that the DPS left the premises approximately two years ago. The officer advised him that the DPS should have day-to-day control over the sale of alcohol and that a vary DPS application should be submitted. The PLH claimed that he himself is a personal licence holder. A BBIAB qualification certificate was on display on the wall but the PLH did not have a personal licence on him at the time of the inspection.

Plan attached to the licence is not accurate, the bar area, office and a fire escape are not shown on the plan. Advised to submit new plan to the licensing team who will advise what type of application is needed to update the plans. (See Appendix 1 for CPX amended plan)

Inspection report issued detailing the above and asking that evidence that CCTV now works and training records be provided by Monday. (See Appendix 2)

During the inspection the PLH advised that they usually allow 370 – 400 into the premises and do not go over 450 (C11 allows a maximum capacity of 480). He stated

that when there are 400 people they have 6-8 door staff and that there are 4 clicker counters (two in and two out) to track the number of people inside the premises. The officer then asked the PLH whether the 5 actions set out in PC Fishers letter dated 22nd April 2014 were being done.

- 1. No under 25's The PLH said they then still do this and door staff ask for ID, however he went on to say that this does not apply if those under 25 attend the premises with other older family members.
- 2. Minimum of 10 door staff at all promoted events PLH had already advised 6-8 door staff. Advised that they have female door staff and that the person who provides the door staff is called Wayne did not know the name of the company.
- 3. Searches PLH said door staff use hand held metal detectors.
- 4. Form 696 PLH stated he advises PC Fisher of which DJs are preforming at the premises.
- 5. Booking inform of hirers PLH stated that he saw the necessary paperwork of the person who hired the premises on 12th July 2014 and that the police had taken the booking details from him. He advised that the event had been a 30th Birthday party for a female.

The officer then advised the PLH that PC Fisher would like him to attend a interview under caution and that he would contact him the following week to arrange this. The officer advised that the interview would be under caution and would be recorded. The PLH confirmed he would be happy to attend and would not need a translator. The officer advised him to bring his legal representative with him to the interview.

The Planning Enforcement Officer then discussed planning matters with the PLH asking what events take place at the premises. The PLH confirmed that food is served at all events however a flyer found at the premises gave the impression that some events held at the premises are more like night club events (see Appendix 3). The Planning Enforcement investigation continues and further advice will be issued.

Location:

This premises is located on an industrial estate in Edmonton. There are no residential properties in the immediate vicinity. However a nightclub is also located on the estate.

Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP)

This premises is not located in the any of Enfield's Cumulative Impact Policy Areas.

Planning Information

From a review of the Council's data base planning permission was granted on appeal, to the refusal of an application referenced TP/09/0135, for the change of use from a warehouse to abanquet hall at Unit C38 with unit C42 used as part of the Banguet hall.

Condition 3. imposed by the Planning inspector in his decision dated 20/10/2009 (ref; APP/Q5300/A/09/2105109) states:

The banquet hall use hereby permitted shall not be open to customers between the following times: Monday to Friday 06:00 - 18:00 (except Bank and Public Holidays) Saturdays 06:00 - 14:00 For clarification of use the Oxford English Dictionary online give definitions of Banquet and Night Club as follows:-

Banquet -

1.trans. To entertain at a banquet or banquets; to provide a banquet for, to feast, regale.

2.intr. To take part in a banquet or banquets; to regale oneself; to feast, carouse.

Night Club -

A club or similar establishment that is open at night, usually for drinking, dancing, and other entertainment; (in later use) spec. a club with a bar and discotheque.

Recent events at the premises suggest that the premises may be being used as a nightclub rather than a banqueting hall. The Planning Enforcement Team are investigating this matter.

In summary this incident, the lack of compliance with the licence conditions and the other issues discovered during the recent licence inspection have led to a lack of confidence in the Premises Licence Holder's ability to responsibly run a licensed premises. I am concerned that allowing the premises to continue to be licensed could lead to further gang activity taking place at the premises. I therefore support this licence review on the ground of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety licensing objectives.

Should the licensing committee not be minded to revoke the premises licence in its entirety, it is requested that the licensable hours be reduced as detailed below:


