1 LICENSING HISTORY & CURRENT POSITION:

- 1.1 Please refer to the Licensing Sub-Committee report for the new premises licence application for the full licensing history, which will be heard at the same time for the Temporary Event Notice (TEN) application.
- 1.2 On 24 August 2015, the Metropolitan Police submitted a summary review application, and at the hearing on 16 September 2015, the Licensing Sub-Committee **RESOLVED** it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to **REVOKE** the licence.
- 1.3 The Chairman made the following statement:
- 1.4 "Having read, heard, and fully considered the written and oral submissions of all parties, the Licensing Sub-Committee has determined that revocation of the licence is appropriate and necessary for the effective promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 1.5 It is the view of the sub-committee that the Metropolitan Police Service, in bringing this summary review, and the Licensing Authority in supporting it, have each made their respective cases in full. The Licensing Sub-Committee was fully persuaded by the arguments advanced and the evidence submitted to support the case for revocation...
- 1.6 ... Reinforcing the decision to revoke, the Licensing Sub-Committee applied strong weight to the statutory Home Office Guidance at sections 11.27 and 11.28 which states that revocation, even in the first instance, may be deemed appropriate in the event of serious criminality and actual crime and disorder taking place on licensed premises.
- 1.7 This was not the first time that these premises, in various guises, had been subject to review on account of serious criminal incidents occurring at the venue. We were further influenced by evidence of reported breaches of significant conditions, both over time as well as those evidenced on the night, particularly relating to controlling entry into the venue, that were said to have not been in compliance. If effectively managed, and indeed if the general management was properly exercised, the stabbing incidents which

- directly led to this review might have been prevented and the licensing objectives not so undermined.
- 1.8 These management failures were deemed as major aggravating factors in persuading the sub-committee to arrive at its decision."
- 1.9 The premises does not hold a premises licence.
- 1.10 A new premises licence application was received on 19 October 2015, and is also to be determined by this Licensing Sub-Committee.

2 **TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE**:

- 2.1 On 8 December 2015 **Mr Agron Xhauri** (via Dadds Solicitors) gave notice to the Council in respect of a proposed event at the premises from 20:00 on Thursday 24 December 2015 to 03:30 on Friday 25 December 2015. The notice is for the provision of late night refreshment, supply of alcohol and regulated entertainment.
- 2.2 A copy of the Temporary Event Notice is attached as Annex 01.

3 **OBJECTION NOTICE**:

- **3.1 Metropolitan Police:** The Police believe that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the Temporary Event Notice will undermine the licensing objectives. On 10 December 2015 the Police gave an Objection Notice.
- 3.2 A copy of the Objection Notice is attached as Annex 02.
- 3.3 **Environmental Health Responsible Authority:** The authority believes that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the Temporary Event Notice will undermine the licensing objectives. On 10 December 2015 the authority gave an Objection Notice.
- 3.4 A copy of the Objection Notice is attached as Annex 03.
- 3.5 The applicant has confirmed that he does not wish to withdraw the TEN application. However, if the committee are minded to grant the premises licence application at the hearing, the applicant will withdraw the TEN application.

4 RELEVANT LAW, GUIDANCE & POLICIES :

4.1 The paragraphs below are extracted from the Licensing Act 2003 ('Act').

General Principles:

- 4.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives [Act s.4(1)].
- 4.3 The licensing objectives are:
- 4.3.1 the prevention of crime and disorder;
- 4.3.2 public safety;
- 4.3.3 the prevention of public nuisance; &
- 4.3.4 the protection of children from harm [Act s.4(2)].

Decision:

- 4.4 Having heard all of the representations (from all parties) the Licensing Sub-Committee must, having regard to the Objection Notices, give the premises user a Counter Notice (to stop the event) if it considers it <u>appropriate</u> for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so [Act s.105].
- Where the Sub-Committee decides <u>not</u> to give a Counter Notice the Sub-Committee may impose one or more conditions on the TEN if: the Sub-Committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so; the conditions are also imposed on a premises licence that has effect in respect of the same premises; and the conditions would not be inconsistent with the carrying out of the licensable activities under the temporary event notice [Act s.106A].

In relation to the Temporary Event Notice (TEN) application WK/215064372 at Royal Venue, 1 Jute Lane, Enfield, EN3 7PJ. The Police would like to object on grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, protection of children from harm and public nuisance.

This venue has recently submitted a premise licence application. The Police have objected to this application on the grounds of all four of the licensing objectives. This is due to be heard by the Licensing Sub Committee on the 16th December 2015 at the Civic Centre, Silver Street, EN1 3XA.

This venue currently does not have a premise licence.

I note on the application that it states that the venue would abide by the following conditions for the duration of the TEN:

- 1. A 'Challenge 25' proof of age scheme shall be operated and relevant material shall be displayed at the premises.
- 2. A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall be made

available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request.

- 3. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.
- 4. No alcoholic drinks or glass containers shall be taken outside at any time.
- 5. All refuse and bottles shall be disposed of in bins quietly so as not to disturb neighbours or local residents. There shall be no disposal of glass bottles outside between 21:00 and 07:00.
- 6. A personal licence holder is to be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol, throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.
- 7. The telephone number of an allocated taxi firm shall be displayed at the premises.
- 8. An agreement shall be made with the taxi firm for a suitable customer collection point so as to cause minimum disturbance to passing traffic and local residents.
- 9. Children under the age of 18 shall not be admitted to the premises unless they are accompanied by an adult.
- 10. The premises shall be used solely for pre-booked events. Customers shall not be able to pay for entry on the door.
- 11. The sale of alcohol shall only take place when ancillary to the use of the premises for substantial buffet or sit down meal.

However there is no premise licence at this venue so this cannot be enforced, as conditions can only be attached to a TEN at a venue that has a premise licence. This is not an option with this application.

What has been offered is also not sufficient to promote the licensing objectives.

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This is a TEN application at a former nightclub. It is requesting hours for licensable activity namely the sale of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment from 2000 hours until 0330 hours the following day.

The potential risk to public safety and instances of crime and disorder are high. This venue previously operated as a nightclub with these hours and offered the sale of alcohol and regulated entertainment as requested in this TEN, however even with the extra safety measures such as door staff, search wands, body searches, I.D scanning equipment and CCTV amongst others, there were still instances of serious crime and disorder. The risk to the public is made all the more clear with the final incident resulting in two people stabbed. One victim was stabbed inside and one victim stabbed just outside the venue.

As this is a TEN at a premise without a premise licence, if the applicant were to agree to add all of the extra safety conditions they cannot be enforced. This means that the police must put their trust solely in the applicant to do this. The applicants other venue in Enfield, Tirana 2 has recently failed three licensing visits in three months. The applicant is failing to promote the licensing objectives and committing criminal offences under the Licensing Act by operating in breach of his licence at this smaller venue.

The Police therefore have no confidence in the applicant to run this venue safely and responsibly.

The application states that no children will be admitted without being accompanied by an adult and that this is a function for families over Christmas. This suggests that children may be in attendance. There is no mention of safeguards to prevent access to children entering. There is also no mention of when children would be expected to leave if at all and what is due to take place inside whilst the event is operating.

This event is planned for Christmas eve going into the early hours of Christmas day. This is a public holiday and a time we know that young children and families look to enjoy waking early in the morning. With hours so late there is a real risk that the visiting patrons will make a noise nuisance either when they arrive and/or when they leave and this risk is exacerbated with the sale of alcohol so late. There is very limited parking space at this venue and as we know from previous experience this usually spills out into the residential side roads. The addition of children/families attending the event means there is a higher chance of private vehicles attending due to the use of child seats etc making the use of taxis less favourable. The nuisance caused to residents on a normal weekend was unbearable for some and the possibility of causing a nuisance on such an important day would only make this worse.

The Police contend that to grant this TEN would lead to a serious risk to the public. There is no way to attach conditions which would normally provide added safety. The hours on this TEN are also very late and give rise to suspicion that this will not be as suggested in the TEN as a family function. There is nothing that would stop this from being a promoted event and run as a nightclub. The TEN that has been applied for appears to have been applied for incase the premise licence is not granted.

This representation is made on behalf of Enfield's Environmental Health Authority. I confirm that I am authorised to speak at any hearing on behalf of the Environmental Health authority. I am employed by the London Borough of Enfield as a Senior Environmental Health Officer-Health and Safety and Licensing. The London Borough of Enfield's Licensing Team exercise all of the Council's responsible authority functions under the Licensing Act 2003 in consultation with and on behalf of: the licensing authority; the local enforcement agency for the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 etc; the local authority with responsibility for environmental health; the local planning authority; the body that represents those who are responsible for, or interested in, matters relating to the protection of children from harm; and the local weights and measures authority (trading standards).

I certify that I have considered the TEN application made on 8th December 2015 and that I wish to make representations that the likely effect of these TENs are detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the following reasons:

Background History:

There is currently a Premises Licence application in progress. There is due to be a hearing on 16th December 2015 as the application received objections from the Police and the Licensing team is seeking to amended the hours of operation applied for, as there has been a history of crime and disorder and public nuisance associated with the premises.

Mr Agron Xhaur is the Applicant and the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor and the applicant for these TENs.

The TENs applied for are:

24th December 2015 from 20:00 to 25th December until 03:30

And to allow the supply of alcohol and regulated entertainment.

On behalf of Environmental Health, I am satisfied that allowing the premises to be used in accordance with these notices would undermine the licensing objectives, Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the *Prevention of Public Nuisance*.

In light of the close proximity to local residents, the potential for noise disturbance from customers attending the premises up until 03:30am and also dispersal of customers at such a late hour will be extremely high.

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Given the history of the premises, it is also highly likely that there will be crime and disorder issues. Therefore, Environmental Health must object to these TEN applications. For further information, please refer to the full representation by the Licensing Authority for the new application.

Had the applicant applied for the premises to be open to the public until 00:30am instead of 03:30, it is likely that there would not have been an objection from Environmental Health.
