**1        MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION :**

- 1.1 In accordance with Section 161 of The Licensing Act 2003 ('the Act'), a senior police officer may make a closure order in relation to any relevant premises if he reasonably believes that (a) there is, or is likely imminently to be, disorder on, or in the vicinity of and related to, the premises and their closure is necessary in the interests of public safety, or (b) a public nuisance is being caused by noise coming from the premises and the closure of the premises is necessary to prevent that nuisance. A closure order is an order requiring relevant premises to be closed for a period not exceeding 24 hours beginning with the coming into force of the order. In determining whether to make a closure order in respect of any premises, the senior police officer must have regard, in particular, to the conduct of each appropriate person in relation to the disorder or nuisance.
- 1.2 Copies of the closure order and documentation received from the Police are attached as Annex 01.
- 1.3 In accordance with Section 164 of the Act, the responsible senior police officer must, as soon as reasonably practicable after a closure order comes into force in respect of any relevant premises, apply to the relevant magistrates court for it to consider the order.
- 1.4 In accordance with Section 165 of the Act, the relevant magistrates court must as soon as reasonably practicable after receiving an application from the responsible senior police officer : (a) hold a hearing to consider whether it is appropriate to exercise any of the court's powers in relation to the closure order, and (b) determine whether to exercise any of those powers. The relevant magistrates' court may : (a) revoke the closure order; (b) order the premises to remain, or to be, closed until such time as the relevant licensing authority has made a determination in respect of the order; (c) order the premises to remain or to be closed until that time subject to such exceptions as may be specified in the order; or (d) order the premises to remain or to be closed until that time unless such conditions as may be specified in the order are satisfied.
- 1.5 A copy of the order received from the Magistrates Court is attached as Annex 02.

2 **HEARING & RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS :**

- 2.1 In accordance with Section 167 of the Act, where the Council (as licensing authority) has received notice of the court order, the Council must review the premises licence. The Licensing Sub-Committee must hold a hearing to consider the closure order, the court order and any relevant representations.
- 2.2 In accordance with Nos. 4 & 5 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee must be commenced within ten working days of the Council receiving the court order.
- 2.3 In accordance with No. 38 of The Licensing Act 2003 (premises licences and club premises certificates) Regulations 2005, this review of premises licence following closure order was advertised for seven consecutive days commencing on 12 February 2014.
- 2.4 The premises licence holder, any responsible authority and any other person may attend the hearing, in person, to make their relevant representations to the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- 2.5 In accordance with Section 167 of the Act, relevant representations means representations which are relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives and, if they are made by a person (who is not also a responsible authority), are not, in the opinion of Licensing Sub-Committee, frivolous or vexatious.

3 **RELEVANT LAW, GUIDANCE & POLICIES :**

- 3.1 The paragraphs below are extracted from either :  
3.1.1 the Licensing Act 2003 ('Act'); or

**General Principles :**

- 3.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives [Act s.4(1)].
- 3.3 The licensing objectives are :  
3.3.1 the prevention of crime and disorder;  
3.3.2 public safety;  
3.3.3 the prevention of public nuisance; &  
3.3.4 the protection of children from harm [Act s.4(2)].
- 3.4 In carrying out its functions, the Sub-Committee must also have regard to :  
3.4.1 the Council's licensing policy statement; &  
3.4.2 guidance issued by the Secretary of State [Act s.4(3)].

**Decision :**

- 3.5 Having considered the closure order, the court order and any relevant representations the Licensing Sub-Committee must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are :  
3.5.1 to modify the conditions of the licence (for this purpose the conditions of a premises licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added);  
3.5.2 to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;  
3.5.3 to remove the designated premises supervisor  
3.5.4 to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;  
3.5.5 to revoke the licence [Act s.167].

I am Police Constable Martyn Fisher and I have worked for the Metropolitan Police Service for over 25 years. For the past five years I have been in post as the Licensing Enforcement Officer for Enfield Borough Police, dealing with all the licensed premises across Enfield borough. My role involves proactive patrols of these premises, offering help and reassurance to both patrons and management, as well as ensuring premises fully uphold the licensing objectives.

This statement is submitted in support of the expedited review application for Club 303, 1 Jute Lane, Enfield, Middlesex, EN3 7PJ. It details the issues of serious crime and disorder regarding violent disorder, directly associated with the venue, which triggered the need for Police to call for the expedited review.

I have made a brief chronology of events of the night in question, to assist the licensing sub committee. I also have included written statements from police and copies of the crime report and 999 CAD call to police.

The criminal investigation into this incident is in the early stages and therefore further relevant information may come to light as the investigation progresses.

Club 303 is situated on an industrial estate next to the level crossing at the end of Green Street in Enfield. The venue is spread across the ground floor with VIP seating areas and has a capacity of 250 people including staff. It currently holds a late licence for the supply of alcohol and all regulated entertainment until 03.00, seven days a week and should be closed by 03:30. The premises licence holder (PLH) and designated premises supervisor (DPS) is a Mr Aydogan Islamoglu who applied to transfer the licence and vary the DPS in to his name on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2013 with the licence being granted on 12<sup>th</sup> December 2013.

I submit a copy of the application process formally recorded on Enfield Councils M3 system with my interactions with Mr Islamoglu reference number WK/213070254, (Reacted) as my exhibit MGF/1. This worksheet refers to an email I sent to Mr Islamoglu with a list of all conditions on the licence and a meeting at the club with Mr Islamoglu and the new leaseholder, Mr Coskun. The meeting detailed was held to discuss conditions on the licence, operating hours and the use of SIA approved contractors as door staff. An existing booking was also discussed and Mr Islamoglu was informed that the event was due to finish beyond the terminal hours on the licence and as such the promoter would have to be

informed that the event would have to finish at 03:00 which Mr Islamoglu confirmed he would do. The worksheet also provides details of the new SIA approved contractors as provided by Mr Islamoglu.

WK/213079862, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/2. Gives details of a complaint made to police (CAD 4129/27Dec13) by a member of the public referring to numerous altercations, drug taking and criminal damage by customers attending Club 303.

The venue has come to the notice of police licensing enforcement recently regarding the use of in house door supervisors instead of SIA approved contractors as stipulated on the licence (Condition number 25) this matter was only bought to a satisfactory conclusion as late as Friday 24th January 2014.

WK/213084905, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/3. Refers to information that the club was not using SIA approved contractors but their own in-house team. This worksheet gives details of my contact with Mr Islamoglu and an email sent to him outlining the breach of condition relating to this matter. The worksheet also gives details of the new approved contractors engaged and confirmation from me that they had taken up the contract to work at the club.

On Saturday 1st February 2014 at 05:25, a call was made to Police by an anonymous female to a fight in progress at Jute Lane in the club. No calls were made to Police to attend by management or staff from Club 303.

Upon arrival of police, officers were told by staff that it was 'kicking off bad inside!' There were large numbers of people exiting the club, some of whom were running obviously in fear for their own safety. As officers entered the foyer area there was a large group of males gathered together who were immediately hostile towards the officers. Door staff told one of the officers that a male was inside, unconscious and in need of CPR. Officers described the customers as drunk and dishevelled and some of them with blood on their clothing. It was obvious that a number of them had been involved in a fight.

One male was identified as being wanted for another matter and was detained whilst trying to exit the club. He became violent and had to be restrained. Another male then intervened and started throwing punches at officers. This male was also subsequently detained. Officers commented that whilst this was taking place, they were being abused and sworn at by other customers and felt that they were going to be attacked by the group of males gathered. Two of the officers had to deploy their tazers in order to recover the situation. Many officers commented on the lack of assistance offered by door staff on scene.

I have formally requested CCTV footage covering the incident and other paperwork relating to conditions for the club by email to Mr Islamoglu. I have also tried to contact him on his mobile phone but it is not being answered at this time.

A significant number of police resources were called upon to assist in restoring law and order to the situation, including India 99 (Helicopter) and most of the available officers from Enfield with a number of other units accepting the urgent assistance request from neighbouring boroughs. London Ambulance service (LAS) also attended.

I have attached copies of statements from the following officers who highlight the aggressive and violent behaviour towards themselves and colleagues throughout the incident as follows;

Statement from PC Derek Ewart, (Redacted) as exhibit DE/1. PC Ewart describes large numbers of people outside of the club, some of whom were running and a report of a male inside requiring CPR. Upon entering the club, PC Ewart describes the hostile atmosphere and aggression towards officers. PC Ewart witnesses the arrest of a male and the ensuing struggle including his involvement in restraining another suspect who got involved. PC Ewart then describes why he was forced to employ his tazer for his own and his colleague's safety. PC Ewart also mentioned the lack of assistance by security staff

Statement from PC Gareth Bowen, (Redacted) as exhibit GB/1. PC Bowen described a large number of excitable males leaving the club on his arrival and being informed by a doorman that a male was inside requiring CPR. PC Bowen stated that in his opinion that a large number of customers were drunk and dishevelled. PC Bowen then describes seeing two males being detained by colleagues and the ensuing fracas with 5 to 10 males looking to become involved in the incident, one of whom shouted 'Let's fucking have it!. PC Bowen fearing for his colleague's safety also drew his tazer in to a high profile position and conducted a red dot challenge. One of the door staff shouted tazer and the group backed away. PC Bowen then sees a male approaching a colleague with a bottle in his hand and how he removed it from him and gave it to a staff member to put away. PC Bowen mentions one particular female member of staff shouting and swearing towards him and other officers and that she was taken away by an unknown male. PC Bowen stated that although there was a number of security staff present, they did not get involved or prevent the group of males who were attempting to get at Police officers or assist with the disorder. PC Bowen also mentions the male who needed CPR as being safe and well and did not require medical treatment.

PC Cathy Asser, (Redacted) exhibit CA/1. States that upon arrival she was called by a doorman to enter the club as a fight was going on inside. PC Asser describes the arrest of a male and how she assisted other officers in restraining him. PC Asser then sees another male approach with a beer bottle in his hand and shouted for it to be taken from him as she feared it would have been used as a weapon. PC Asser mentions that no assistance was offered by staff and that one female staff member actually shouted 'You're too fucking late!' and was indeed quite obstructive.

PC James Robinson, (Redacted) as exhibit JR/1. Describes attending the venue and speaking to a member of the clubs security who informed him that a fight was taking place inside. Upon entering PC Robinson states that it was mainly males inside and that a number of them were bloodied and had been involved in a disturbance including one male washing in a nearby disabled toilet. PC Robinson mentioned that the wooden floor was extremely wet and slippery. PC Robinson then recognises a male that he knows to be wanted for a breach of Court Order and describes detaining him and a subsequent violent struggle including another male who had been washing in the disabled toilet earlier getting involved. PC Robinson also described other customers shouting abuse at him and colleague's before they were able to remove both suspects from the scene.

PC Jason Dellar, (Redacted) as exhibit JD/1. Describes attending the call to Club 303 and being told that twenty to thirty males were still inside fighting and that male had a head injury and was unconscious but was being assisted by staff. PC Dellar describes that a number of males inside had blood on them and there was clear signs that a fight had taken place. PC Dellar sees a colleague take hold of a male and a number of other males trying to get at the officer. One particular male with blood on his hands and face then tried to attack the officer. PC Dellar then restrained the male who then started to aim blows at him. This male was also detained by PC Dellar and PC Clarke but the male continued to resist arrest and broke free punching PC Dellar to the face and chest. The male was eventually subdued but continued to aim a torrent of abuse at officers before being removed from the scene.

PC Matt Clarke, (Redacted) as exhibit MC/1. States that he was informed by a female that a large fight was taking place inside of Club 303 involving twenty to thirty males and that one male in particular had a bad head injury and had fell unconscious and that she had given him CPR. PC Clarke then describes entering the club and seeing clear signs of a disturbance with a number of males loitering around, a number of whom seemed to be heavily intoxicated and abusive. PC Clarke describes another officer detaining a male inside and a group of males trying to get at his colleague as he did so. Another male then tries to get to his colleague and PC Clarke and PC Dellar both restrain him to prevent him from doing so. PC Clarke describes how the male struggled after being stopped and aimed a number of punches at both himself and PC Dellar. PC Clarke then describes how the male was subsequently restrained but continued to be hostile and abusive and aim punches at both himself and his colleague. PC Clarke described how other males tried to get involved and that the area they were in was quite small and poorly lit at the time and that he had to move these other males out of the way as he feared for his safety. PC Clarke states that whilst outside with an ambulance crew who were treating his prisoner, an Irish male made himself known and stated he had been beaten up inside and had a large wound to the back of his head. The male was described as being intoxicated and didn't provide any further information. PC Clarke then states that he went to the managers' office to view the CCTV footage and noted that only six of the eighteen cameras were in operation, none of which covered the area where the arrests had taken place.

PC Ben Wale, (Redacted) as exhibit BW/1. Describes his arrival at the club and seeing a number of people leaving who he described as being slow moving and staggering and that many of them appeared to be drunk. PC Wale describes recognising a male he knew to be wanted for another matter. PC Wale then describes how he attempted to detain the male who tried to resist arrest and break away and the ensuing struggle. PC Wale mentions that he saw a number of other males approach him and his colleagues in a menacing fashion and push him away from the male he had detained and that they were shouting 'Fuck off, leave him, get the fuck off him!' PC Wale stated that the floor was wet and was fearful that if he fell over the other males would attack him. PC Wale also sees another colleague, PC Dellar restraining another male and goes to their assistance and that a female wearing a Club 303 uniform was shouting at officers 'Do your fucking job properly!' PC Wale mentioned that with the assistance of staff that the group were eventually ushered away.

PC Michelle Debnam, (Redacted) as exhibit MD/1. Describes attending the scene and seeing a number of people leaving and that they were waved over to the club by a male standing at the door and that on approaching him he stated that twenty to twenty five people were inside still fighting and that a male was also inside who needed CPR. PC Debnam then enters the club and witnesses colleagues detaining a male and how a crowd had gathered around them as they did so. Fearing for the safety of both herself and colleagues, PC Debnam activated the emergency button on her radio requesting that further units attend the venue. PC Debnam then describes assisting colleagues in detaining one of the males and that a female with a black polo shirt with 'Club 303' thereon was shouting and swearing at officers before she was removed by another member of staff.

Insp Skinner, (Redacted) as exhibit DS/1. Gives evidence of a group of twenty males causing a disturbance outside of the club on his arrival and speaking to the PLH/DPS Mr Aydogan Islamoglu who was shouting at an unknown female at the time. Insp Skinner notes at least thirty people in the bar area and officers dealing with an abusive male on the floor. Insp Skinner mentions that officers were concerned that after they had entered the club, staff had shut the doors behind them preventing further other officers from coming to their aid. Insp Skinner states that after the crowd had been dispersed, he went to the managers office with Mr Islamoglu and asked him what time his licence finished at and was told 03:30. Insp skinner inform asked why the first call to the club was at 05:30 some two hours after the licence should have finished. Mr Islamoglu could not give a satisfactory answer. Insp Skinner also asked Mr Islamoglu why the clubs doors had been shut so that Police could not enter and was told that

he opened them as soon as he was aware of officers trying to get in. Insp Skinner then asked to view the clubs CCTV system and noted that out of eighteen cameras, only six appeared to be switched on and that Mr Islamoglu did not know if they were actually recording as he was awaiting further equipment to make the system work.

Insp Skinner also issued Mr Islamoglu with a closure order under Sec 161 Licensing act 2003, closing the club for a period of twenty four hours from Saturday 1st February 2014, 06:00 to Sunday 2nd February 2014, 06:00. Copy of closure notice attached as exhibit DS/2.

WK/213089146, (redacted) as my exhibit MGF/4. Refers to emails sent to Mr Islamoglu requesting a full report relating to the incident on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2014 and a request for various documents and CCTV footage covering the same evening. Also a copy of a text response from Mr Islamoglu confirming that he had received the emails and was acting on them.

CRIS: 5202391/14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/5. Details the arrest of a male for assaulting and obstructing a Police officer inside of Club 303 on Saturday 1st February 2014 at 05:20.

CRIS: 5202392/14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/6. Details the arrest of a male from within Club 303 on Saturday 1st February 2014 for possession of cocaine

CRIS: 5202607/14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/7. Details a report relating to the serious violent disorder that took place at Club 303 on Saturday 1st February 2014.

CAD 1981/01Feb14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/8. 999 phone call made to Police from an anonymous female stating that a fight was in progress at Club 303. This report records the time of police arrival and a request for urgent assistance made at 05:40 and a request for a dog van at the same time. At 05:44 an officer comments that the doors to the club are locked and wants to know what is happening. At 05:51 a comment is made regarding the unconscious male not being found despite the club being searched in order to locate him.

CAD 2001/01Feb14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/9. 999 phone call made to Police from an anonymous female to a fight at Club 303

CAD 2006/01Feb14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/10. 99 phone call made to police to attend Club 303 as the fight was now taking place both inside and outside.

CAD 2011/01Feb14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/11. Call from LAS asking if they are required to attend Club 303. Response to attend regarding a male knocked unconscious and receiving CPR.

CAD 2028/01Feb14, 05:39, (redacted) as my exhibit MGF/12. Call relating to an urgent assistance request made by PC 668YE

CAD 2054/01Feb14, (Redacted) as my exhibit MGF/13. Request for an officer to speak with LAS to see if HEMS is required to assist.

The evidence presented in this statement outlines a serious and total breakdown in management procedures at the venue on the 1st February 2014 which resulted in very serious and unacceptable violent disorder. Police have no confidence in the ability of the premises licence holder to manage the premises effectively and promote the licensing objectives. The MPS seek immediate suspension of the premises licence to prevent any further serious crime and disorder occurring.

On SATURDAY 01st FEBRUARY 2014 I was on duty in uniform with PC DELLAR 167YE, we were assigned to a marked police vehicle callsign Y3N. At approx 0525 hours, police received a call to attend CLUB 303 on JUTE LANE, BRIMSDOWN, next to BRIMSDOWN BR to assist with a group of 30 people fighting. Other police units were assigned and began to make their way, as did we. Whilst on the journey there, I heard updates from colleagues that said security staff had told them that the fight inside was large and officers were waiting for assistance before they entered the club. PC CLARKE had also requested the Ambulance service attend because he had been told that someone was receiving CPR inside the club.

We pulled up outside the club just before 0540 hours and was met by 2 - 3 police cars already there, there was also a number of people stood around on the road and footway leading to the club. Many of them were slow moving, staggering and I could hear shouting from amongst some of the crowd. It was apparent to me that many people there were drunk.

Members of security staff were talking to police officers near a barrier between the club entrance and footway and began to walk towards the club, I was telling an IC1 male to stay away from the club as it had now been closed. I had seen him walk away when we turned up and then 'tailgate' us as we walked towards the club, I was fearful that he was going to try and slip back in towards the entrance and as I didn't know his intentions, I decided to try and tell him to stay away to give the people leaving some space and room and prevent him getting injured as I had been given information suggesting the fight was still ongoing. A member of security staff then blocked his path as I joined my colleagues at the entrance to the club. I and some of my colleagues had put on protective latex gloves, I did this because I had heard CPR was being given and that a large fight was in progress. I put gloves on outside so that should there be anyone requiring first aid inside the premises, my assistance would not be delayed by the need to put the gloves on when inside.

We walked into the foyer of the club at approx 0540 hours. The entrance is like an old industrial unit. The door entrance was approx 2 metres wide and led into a larger waiting area with seats. This continued around to the left

hand side with another door leading into what looked like the main club area. From the foyer and the dance floor area, we were met again by a large number of people. I was surveying the people coming towards us to check on their behaviour, to see if any of them were committing offences and offer help to anyone that presented themselves to us as injured. I was stood close to the LEFT CORNER of the foyer near to the entrance when I saw a short IC1 MALE walking at speed towards us. He was trying to disguise his identity by staying close to someone in front and skim along the wall to my left hand side. I immediately recognised this male as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had appeared on our briefing within the last two weeks or so as being wanted by police. I was very familiar with his face as I had been present at incidents with him and his brother [REDACTED] on previous occasions. I had in fact, stopped [REDACTED] [REDACTED] just the shift before, the 30th JANUARY 2014 on BULLSMOOR LANE and so knew that this was [REDACTED]. I put my hand out and said "STOP THERE", he walked into my hand and had his back towards the exit. I said "WHATS YOUR NAME?" He said "[REDACTED]". I said "NO ITS NOT, YOUR [REDACTED] AND YOUR WANTED". With that, [REDACTED] made a very good attempt at escaping me. He backed his hips away and with his arms, swooped over his body to push me away. I tried to keep hold of his arms, as that is all I could reach and that quickly slipped onto his top, such was the speed at which he was trying to escape. I managed to get a hold of his top around the shoulders area but [REDACTED] was becoming extremely violent in his attempts to escape. I tried to pull him back into the foyer area as that is where my colleagues were and next to me was a large group of unknown persons. [REDACTED] is a relatively short male but he was resisting with such strength I believed he was probably under the influence of drugs and or alcohol.

I was then aware of PC ROBINSON coming to my assistance and between us we tried to take control of [REDACTED]. The floor was extremely slippery and I was struggling to stay on my feet and get any good control of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was jumping up and down with vigour, thrashing his limbs about trying to shake us off and was being pulled from us. Amongst the large crowd, a few males then began to come at us and were trying to push me away from [REDACTED] and take him from our grasp. Due to me concentrating on [REDACTED] I was unable to see who exactly was pushing us away. They were shouting "FUCK OFF. LEAVE HIM. GET THE FUCK OFF HIM" and the like and more colleagues then came to our assistance. The floor was slippery and I was fearful of falling onto the floor due to the large crowd who were clearly not pleased or fans of the police, I feared that if I were to fall, I would come under attack from some of the crowd. I was aware then that some more colleagues were also involved in an altercation with another person due to the crowds dynamics, some were moving towards one group of officers and some towards others. I was afraid for the safety of myself and colleagues as we were very outnumbered and when my grip of [REDACTED] was lost, I shouted loudly at the group 'STAY BACK, STAY BACK' and raised my arms and palms into a defensive stance. I was joined in this action by other officers, as I heard the command "STAY BACK" being shouted. I looked to my right to see PC DELLAR and PC ASSER were detaining a male on the floor near to the door into the club area. To my left was the male that I recognised as

PC WALE

[REDACTED], being detained by PC ROBINSON and PC DEBNAM. Above them, was an IC1 MALE shouting loudly at them, telling them to let him go. I went over to them to offer assistance by telling the man to stop shouting and move away. He refused and said that he was waiting to take him home. With the assistance of security staff, the crowd eventually calmed down and began to disperse, slowly. There was often shouts made against us, mainly swearing and in particular an IC1 FEMALE wearing CLUB 303 uniform was shouting "DO YOUR FUCKING JOBS PROPERLY" and other expletives She was extremely aggressive in her shouting towards us, PC ASSER and I told her to be quiet as she was antagonising the situation and security staff pushed her into a room behind a closed door.

When the situation was calmer and quieter, I said to [REDACTED] "we'll stand you on your feet as soon as we can, be honest with me, whats your name?" He said "[REDACTED] [REDACTED], [REDACTED] WALTHAM CROSS". This seemed to me like a poor attempt to give false details as when I stopped [REDACTED] [REDACTED] on the shift before, he told me he lived on a particular road in WALTHAM CROSS, yet this man was unable to give that road or a date of birth. We stood [REDACTED] up and he said that we should put him on a fingerprint machine as that would reveal exactly who he is, [REDACTED].

When it was safe enough to do so, a fingerprint machine was brought to us and PC ROBINSON conducted the identity procedure. The result revealed his name was [REDACTED] [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED]. PC ASSER conducted a name check on this males details on my behalf and the result revealed that he was shown as Wanted on the police computer. He was wanted for FTA for breach of court order at ST ALBANS CROWN COURT on 13/09/2013. At 0554 hours I said to [REDACTED] "[REDACTED], YOU ARE WANTED. YOUR UNDER ARREST FOR BEING WANTED ON WARRANT FOR FAILING TO APPEAR FOR BREACH OF COURT ORDER AT ST ALBANS CROWN COURT ON 13TH SEPTEMBER 2013" I cautioned him and told him that his arrest was necessary to put him before the court and prevent his escape. He made no reply to caution.

[REDACTED] had been handcuffed in a rear stack position prior to me arresting him. PC ROBINSON and I led him out to a waiting police van and prior to placing him inside, I conducted a search of him under SECTION 32 PACE for D.I.E Insoide his right trouser pockets he had some cash. In the small tight pocket above that he had a small solid item which felt like a wrap of paper. I said to him "WHATS THAT IN YOUR POCKET?" He said "COCAINE, HONEST. IN a £20 NOTE". I pulled it out and discovered it to be a tightly wrapped £20 NOTE. He said "ITS COCAINE FOR PERSONAL USE". At 0600 hours I said to him "YOU ARE FURTHER ARRESTED ON SUSPICION OF POSSESION OF COCAINE BECAUSE OF WHAT I FOUND AND YOU SAID. YOUR ARREST IS FOR A PROMPT AND EFFECTIVE INVESTIGATION AND TO PREVENT DISPOSAL OF EVIDENCE". He made no reply to the caution.

He complained of being uncomfortable in his handcuffs and because of the extended travelling time to custody, PC ROBINSON and I moved the cuffs into a front stack position that were checked for tightness and double locked. TOOHEY was then transferred to WOOD GREEN CUSTODY in the police van with PC ROBINSON as

On Saturday 1st February 2014 I was on duty in uniform in the company of PC ASSER 222YE we were mobile patrols in a marked police vehicle call sign YE25N. At approx 0525 we accepted a call via the radio to attend BRIMSDOWN AVE with regards to a fight in progress CAD 1981 refers we made our way to the location and we were updated that approx 30 people were fighting. On route we were updated that it was outside CLUB 303 a nightclub. On our arrival shortly after I could see a number of people leaving the venue in JUTE LANE EN3. A black male of large build wearing a black jacket approached my car window he stated that it was all over and most people had left. We decided to wait at the location and we were joined by other units. Shortly after awhile a white male stood next to the door to the club began to wave us over. We then walked over to this male he stated approx 25 males were still fighting. A female also stated that a male inside needed CPR. We entered the club via the main door into the foyer on doing so I could see approx 20 people all stood in the foyer making their way out of the club I continued on towards the main hall of the club to see if anyone was inside fighting. On doing so I then heard a commotion behind me and officers struggling at this point a small white male approx 504" tall wearing a stripy top came past me in an attempt to get into the main hall I went after him to stop him from going inside. I then heard officers shouting and were on the floor struggling with a person I was aware other males in the foyer crowded round us and we were pushed into a corner. I immediately pressed my emergency button on my radio requesting further units to the venue. At this point PC ROBINSON 477YE was stood to my left struggling with the male in the stripy top a male I now know to be Mr **[REDACTED]** who I believed was wanted by police. I took out my handcuffs and tried to take a hold of TOOHEY's left arm he was struggling with myself and PC ROBINSON 477YE, PC EWART 277YE then assisted in detaining **[REDACTED]**, he was taken to the floor still struggling I knelt on his legs to stop him struggling and placed my hand cuffs onto his right wrist which I bought to his back and his left arm was also bought back and placed into the other cuff. At this stage a white male

with short hair wearing a body warmer was shouting at officers stating it was his cousin [REDACTED]. A female with blonde hair wearing a black CLUB 303 polo shirt was shouting and swearing at us that she knew the male [REDACTED] and he was not involved she was stating we were too late she would not stop shouting and swearing at us she was leaning over to where we were on the floor with [REDACTED] I was aware that males were still stood nearby us and I was fearful as I was crouched down on the floor Pc ASSER 222YE was telling her to stop shouting which she ignored, PC BOWEN 336YE even told her to stop shouting which she continued to ignore. A black male wearing a black jacket told her to stop and pushed her behind a door and closed it. [REDACTED] was then stood up on his feet PC WALE 365YE had joined us and was explaining to [REDACTED] that he believed he was wanted by police and a finger print machine was on its way. This arrived shortly after and confirmed [REDACTED] to be [REDACTED] and not [REDACTED] as he was claiming. He was then arrested for failing to appear at court and cautioned by PC WALE 365YE. Shortly after [REDACTED] was walked outside to the police van.

On Saturday the 1st February 2014 I was on duty employed as the Duty Officer for Enfield Borough Police. At about 0530hrs a 999 call came in stating there was large fights inside Club 303 at Jute Lane EN3. Officers arrived on scene and were told that there was a large disturbance inside the club. Officers entered the club and then requested more units due to fighting inside the club. A further call came in saying a male was receiving CPR after being assaulted inside the club. Officers then required urgent assistance inside the venue.

I made my way and when I arrived there were about 20 males outside the premises causing a disturbance. I spoke to the officers and was told there were 2 persons arrested. One for affray and assault on police and the other for fighting and being wanted. I made my way into the bar area and saw a male I was later told was the manager. He was called Aydogan ISLAMOGLU. He was shouting at a female who was in turn shouting at a female behind the bar. I could see alcohol on the bar area and there was about 30 persons in this area. I identified myself to this male but he continued shouting at the female. I could hear shouting back in the foyer area so I went back to see what was happening. Officers were dealing with an abusive male on the floor.

After speaking to the officers I was told that once they were inside dealing with the fight staff closed the doors of the premises. This prevented other officers from helping their colleagues because they could not get inside the club. Once the crowd was dispersed from outside, the remaining people from inside, apart from the staff were escorted out of the premises.

I then spoke to the manager and licence holder Aydogan ISLAMOGLU. I asked him what time his licence finished at. He stated 0330hrs. I told him that the first 999 call came in at 0530hrs some 2 hours after his licence should have finished and there were still about 40 persons in the club. He stated that they were trying to get them to leave but I explained this was 2 hours after the club should have closed and police had not been called in those two hours to get people out of the club. He could not give a satisfactory reason for it.


I told him about his staff shutting the doors to the club so that police could not enter the premises to help their colleagues. He stated that once he realised this and heard officers kicking the doors he did get his staff to open the doors.

I asked him if his CCTV system was working. He said he wasn't sure. I sent PS King to go with a member of staff to check the CCTV. Out of 18 cameras only 6 were switched on. ISLAMOGLU did not know if they were recording and could not provide police with a copy of the CCTV as he was waiting for further equipment to make the system work.


I also discussed with him that I saw him and a female shouting at each other and also a member of staff and as a result he was causing a disturbance in his own premises.

As a result of all of these points I informed him that under the Licensing Act I was closing his premises for a period of 24hrs (until 0600 On 02 February 2014). I served him with a form 690 which he signed. I fully explained the procedure as listed on the back of the form.

#### Club 303 Conditions

##### Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Where the licence includes a condition that individuals are required to carry out any security activity at specified times at the premises each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

##### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

4. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
5. The licence holder shall ensure that at all material times there shall be at least one suitably trained first-aider on duty at the premises.
6. A CCTV system shall be installed, operated and maintained at the premises. The system shall :
  - (1) The system must be a digital system;
  - (2) If the CCTV equipment is inoperative or not working to the satisfaction of the Police or Licensing Authority, the premises shall not be used for licensable activities unless with prior agreement from the Police;
  - (3) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors both inside and outside and all areas required by Police;
  - (4) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification - not less than 120% of screen;
  - (5) Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen;
  - (6) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises. They must be capable of detection i.e. not less than 10% of screen;
  - (7) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed;
  - (8) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image;
  - (9) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times;
  - (10) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises;
  - (11) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet;
  - (12) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality;
  - (13) Record images as near to real time as possible;
  - (14) Recorded images must be of sufficient quality that persons can be identified from the recorded pictures as well as the live view;
  - (15) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention;
  - (16) Comply with the Data Protection Act (DPA) and any applicable British Security Industry Association (BSIA) codes of practice;
  - (17) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation;
  - (18) Be operated by the correct procedures, to ensure an evidence trail is recorded and can be retrieved for evidential purposes;
  - (19) Digital images must be kept for 31 days;
  - (20) Checks should be frequently undertaken to ensure that the equipment performs properly and that all the cameras are operational and a log kept;
  - (21) The medium on which the images have been recorded should not be used when it has become apparent that the quality of the images has deteriorated;
  - (22) Access to recorded images should be restricted to those staff that need to have access in order to achieve the purposes of using the equipment;
  - (23) All access to the medium on which the images are recorded should be documented;
  - (24) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time;
  - (25) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request;
  - (26) Disclosure of the recorded images to third parties should only be made in limited and prescribed circumstances, law enforcement agencies, Prosecution agencies, relevant legal representatives and people whose images have been recorded and retained.
7. An alarm system (to EU50131) that incorporates a panic-button facility shall be installed and maintained at the premises.
8. The cloakroom at the premises shall be operated so as to assist the swift return of coats, particularly in the period prior to closing time.
9. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises. The notices shall be positioned at eye-level and in a location where they can be read by persons leaving the premises. The notices shall state "Customers are asked to respect the needs of local residents and to leave these premises and the area quietly."





10. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises. The notices shall be positioned at eye-level and in a location where they can be read by persons leaving the premises. The notices shall state "Drinks cannot be taken outside the premises."
11. Deliveries shall not be accepted at the premises other than between the hours of 09:00 and 20:00 each day.
12. The premises licence holder shall provide and maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence, which shall be provided to the Licensing Authority and any local residents on request. Any change to the number shall be notified to the Licensing Authority within seven days of the change.
13. A record shall be kept specifying the date of any regulated entertainment that takes place at the premises including the name, address and telephone number of the person/s who promoted and organised the entertainment.
14. Public transport information (including night-time travel options) shall be available to customers at the premises. The telephone number of an allocated taxi firm shall be displayed within the premises.
15. At least two door supervisors shall remain directly outside the premises until all patrons have left to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of patrons.
16. At the conclusion of all entertainment events a suitably worded announcement shall be made, requesting customers to behave in a quiet manner whilst they are leaving the premises.
17. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, is kept clean and free from litter at all material times to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.
18. Notices shall be clearly displayed at each public entrance to the premises detailing the policy on admission and searching at the premises.
19. The noise limiter shall be recalibrated annually to ensure that the music volume does not exceed the level at which a noise nuisance to neighbours will occur. A copy of the calibration certificate shall be kept on the premises and made available to the Police or Council Officer on request.
20. All doors and windows shall be kept closed but not locked during regulated entertainment, with the exception on entry and egress.
21. Drinking vessels shall be made of toughened glass or plastic and shall be designed not to have a sharp edge when broken.
22. All refuse and bottles shall be disposed of in bins quietly so as not to disturb neighbours or local residents. There shall be no disposal of glass bottles outside between 23:00 and 07:00.
23. Wall mounted ashtrays shall be provided outside the premises.
24. Incidents shall be logged and recorded in a logbook at the premises.
25. All door staff employed must be from contractors that appear on the Security Industry Authority's Register of Approved Contractors.
26. The designated premises supervisor or a member of the management shall monthly, check their door supervisors registration on the Security Industry Authority (SIA) website to ensure their licences are current. Written records of these checks shall be maintained, signed and dated by the person completing the checks. The records shall be kept for 12 months and made available to Police or the local authority upon reasonable request.
27. The management shall provide to the Police Licensing Officer the name, stage name, address and date of birth of all resident disc jockeys (DJs) employed at the premises and at all times that there is a change to the resident DJ's.
28. A sign shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises informing customers of the closing time and last time of entry to the premises.
29. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a member of the management shall personally monitor the actions and observations of the security staff at frequent intervals to ensure that searches are being properly carried out.
30. A minimum of six door supervisors shall be employed on the premises from the commencement of regulated entertainment until closing.
31. (1) All members of staff including door supervisors must enter their names in the Staff Register Book. All door supervisors must enter their SIA badge number and the company that they are employed by. These records shall be dated and made available to the Police and/or council upon request. All records shall be retained for a minimum of one year; (2) All door supervisors will enter the time they start and finish their shifts into the Staff Register Book; (3) Door supervisors will ensure fire exits are kept clear of real and potential hazards at all times; (4) Door supervisors will take it in turns to patrol the toilets every hour whilst the premises are open and to sign the toilet checklist to this effect; (5) Door supervisors will monitor the smoking area and car park on a regular



basis to ensure that no noise nuisance is being created; (6) Door supervisors will ensure that no alcohol is taken outside of the premises and that there is no smoking inside of the premises; (7) Under 18's shall not be allowed on the premises at anytime whilst the premises is open for licensable activities; (8) Search policies must be adopted and implemented by the door supervisors. This policy shall include, but is not limited to : (a) Female door supervisors shall be engaged to search hand bags, and female patrons; (b) Any drugs or weapons, found or confiscated must be handed into the police as soon as is practicable; (c) Door supervisors must ensure that only one person is permitted in the toilet cubicles at any one time. (Toilets, Attracts, Drugs!); (d) All patrons must be searched before entering the premises; (e) Hand held search wands and/or search arches shall be utilized at the point of entry to the club; (f) To remove from the premises any person found using drugs; (g) Trained in emergency procedures; (h) Refuse entry and re-entry after the last permitted time; (i) Use clickers to ensure capacity not breached; (j) Display the clubs entry and search policy at front of premises; (k) Door Supervisors will display their SIA badges at all time during their working shift; (l) Door supervisors will be identifiable at all times - reflective jackets or reflective armbands; (m) All staff will be made aware of the entry policy - i.e. over 18, over 21, over 25; (n) Keep a record of any drugs / weapons seized as well as any found during toilet checks; (o) Ensure customers leave the premises quietly without causing a disturbance or any ASB; (p) All staff will sign to show they have read and understand this policy.

32. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a personal licence holder shall be at the premises whenever licensable activities take place.

33. All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every 3 months) in the safe and efficient running of the premises.

34. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol must receive induction and refresher training (at least every 3 months), relating to the sale of alcohol. All training shall be documented and records kept. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

35. The maximum number of persons on the premises at any one time shall not exceed 250.

36. Management and door supervisors shall encourage those leaving the premises to do so quietly.

37. Toilets at the premises shall be checked for any sign of illegal drug use an average of every hour and a record shall be kept of the times, dates and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for one year. Records shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or police, upon reasonable request.

38. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises, including in all the toilets, warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.

39. A noise limiting device shall be installed to any amplification equipment in use on the premises and shall be maintained in effective working order. The noise limiter should be set so that noise does not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

40. A written record of refused sales must be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. Records must be kept for one year, and must be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request.

41. The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.

42. No more than 15 smokers to be permitted in the outside smoking area at any one time. A door supervisor must monitor this area at all times.

43. No drinks to be taken into the smoking area at any time.

44. A personal licence holder is to be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol, throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

45. The management at approximately hourly intervals shall make subjective assessments of noise levels whilst regulated entertainment is provided. The assessments should take place at the site boundary and at least as far as the residential properties at the junction of Green Street with Brimsdown Avenue. This is to ensure that noise from the premises does not cause disturbance to local residents. Records shall be kept of the times, dates, location of checks and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for one year. Records shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or police, upon request. Where monitoring by management identifies that noise from the premises is a disturbance at the premises boundary or Green Street/Brimsdown Avenue junction, measures shall be taken to reduce this i.e. turning the volume down.

46. When the premises are used for regulated entertainment there shall be no admission or readmission after 01:00.

**Comment** It was brought to my attention following a recent OOH inspection by the MSC that this club is using in house security despite a condition to use approved contractors.

I contacted the security company (OM Security) that was originally proposed when this club reopened and spoke to the managing director, Jay Jagatia, Mr Jagatia stated that his company does not work for any premises in the borough of Enfield and has never covered Club 303.

I then spoke to the PLH/DPS Mr Aydemir Aydogan re this issue and he confirmed that he was using in house security despite the condition regarding approved contractors.

Mr Aydogan stated that he had tyried to contact me about OM Security because they let him down on the first week they opened and he had to use Trojan security instead and has since been using his own security staff instead.

I explained that this was a breach of his licence and that the only way he can use other companies was to vary that particular condition on his licence and until such time it was varied, he would have to abide by the approved contractor condition.

I asked Mr Aydogan to contact me with details of any new approved contractor security company engaged before the club next opens.

Further to our telephone conversation on Monday 20th January 2014, I would like to confirm that you fully understand your responsibilities as the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor for Club 303 in relation to door supervisors and from whom they are engaged.

The following condition is on your licence;

25. All door staff employed must be from contractors that appear on the Security Industry Authority's Register of Approved Contractors.

As previously discussed, you must have door staff that are employed by an approved contractor on the SIA list before the club next opens. This condition was part of the licence when you transferred it in to your name. I went through all of the conditions on the licence with you in person on Tuesday 26th November 2013 before you reopened the club and discussed this condition in particular.

To reiterate our conversation, you cannot employ your own door staff or engage a company not on the SIA's list of approved contractors, as this would be in breach of your licence and may well result in the serving of a section 19 closure Notice with powers as set out below;

The Criminal Justice and Police Act originally gave the police powers to close unlicensed premises. The Licensing Act 2003 extended this to allow them and local authority staff to put outlets operating in breach of their licensing conditions on notice that they will be closed unless the illegal behaviour is stopped.

Please contact me at your earliest convenience to update me with details of any new door company employed. I will of course contact them to confirm that they have been engaged.

Lastly, if you feel that this condition is too much of an imposition on the licence, you are free to submit an application to vary the licence. Until such an application has been submitted and approved, you will still have to abide by all conditions currently held on the licence for the club.

On Saturday the 1st February 2014 at 0525hours I was on duty in full uniform in company with PC 336YE Bowen in a marked Police vehicle call sign YE22 Nights driven by PC Bowen .When we received a call to attend Club 303 situated in Jute Lane ,Enfield,EN3 to a call of 30 people fighting inside the club some believed armed with weapons .We arrived at approximately 0535 hours where I saw large crowds of people emptying out of the club and some people running from the club .Other officers arrived and we received more calls to people fighting inside the club with a report of a male receiving CPR inside .Due to the urgency of the situation despite the fact we only had around 8 officers present we entered the club where I saw numerous security staff standing around seemingly inactive whilst a large crowd of people had gathered in the foyer of the club directly opposite the entrance to the dance floor and club area .I pushed my way through the crowd towards the main club area door as I did so I noticed several males aggressively turn towards me and shout "Don't Fucking push me" ,I sensed the aggression in the air and could see several males standing close to one another square on as if to ready themselves to fight .I was standing in the immediate area of the club entrance/Dance area facing towards the foyer when a white male aged around 26 years old wearing a grey Dark T Shirt a male whom I now know as [ ] pushed passed officers into the dance floor area .He was swearing but I could not make out exactly what he said .I heard PC 668YE Debnam shout at the male to get back into the foyer .Upon hearing this I took hold of [ ] left arm and guided him back into the foyer .He pulled his left arm back in an attempt to shrug me off as he was taken back into the foyer .I looked into the dance area just in order to check there was no one requiring our assistance when I heard behind me a sound of a loud disturbance and fight with male voices shouting "Fuck off you cunts".I turned and walked back into the foyer where I saw PC 167YE Dellar and another officer struggling to detain a male as he fought them. I could also see PC 668YE Debnam and PC 477YE Robinson struggling with the male [ ] PC Robinson had hold of the males right arm and PC Debnam was struggling to hold his left arm . [ ] appeared to be struggling to get to the other male being detained by PC Dellar and at one point appeared to gain ground towards them .He was within 8 feet of PC Dellar .Fearing PC Dellar would get attacked I

quickly joined PC Robinson and Debnam and immediately grabbed [REDACTED] upper clothing around the neck and shoulder area ,Using my weight and my right arm to drag him backwards away from PC Dellar into a corner of the foyer next to a gaming machine .I could hear many other people nearby shouting and screaming at us and see many people starting to fight .I helped take [REDACTED] to the floor where after a brief struggle to get his hands behind his back with PC Robinson and Debnam he was handcuffed whilst resisting in the rear stacked position .Once he was detained I got to my feet and looked towards the entrance door to the club .Other officers were still struggling to detain prisoners .I saw a group of around 8 men walk towards us with fists clenched walking with a purpose and shouting “ lets fucking have it” again fearing for both myself and my colleagues safety and in order to prevent the group from getting to others being detained I upholstered my taser ,Drew it and engaged the safety catch to off illuminating the red laser and pointing the laser onto the chest of an unknown male advancing towards me .I shouted “ get back Police with taser .....

before I could finish my sentence I heard a security staff member shout at the males saying “get out before you get tasered man” .The group immediately retreated back to the entrance stopping their advance .I then turned my red dot off and re holstered my taser .I called for an ambulance for one of the males detained and updated control as to the situation .After a short time the two detained males were taken out and placed in Police transport and the rest of the club dispersed .The security staff did not help in any way and I observed them standing back sometimes mingling with trouble makers .They did not appear to detain or stop any violence within the club .I remained close by until Inspector Skinner attended and issued a closure notice upon the club .We all then left .

On Saturday 01st February 2014 I was on duty in full uniform in the company of Pc EWART 277YE as a driver of a marked police vehicle, call sign YE22 (N). At about 0525 hours we responded to a call to attend Club 303 on Jute Lane EN3, where there were reports of 30 people fighting at the location. We arrived at the location about 10 minutes later. Other units were on scene outside the club including Pc ROBINSON 477YE, PC CLARKE 248YE, PC ASSER 222YE, PC DEBNAM 668YE, PC WALE 365YE and PC DELLAR 167YE. There were large groups of excitable males leaving the club. I was told by bouncers of the club that there was fighting going on inside and a male needed CPR. We decided to enter the club, as we entered the foyer area I could see that there were numerous males who were drunk and dishelved. I then saw Pc WALE 365YE detaining a male, the male was an IC1, slim build, with short hair, other officers including Pc ROBINSON and DEBNAM 668YE were attempting to control the male who was attempting to escape and was swearing and shouting. I made my way to wards the club doors and saw that the main club was emptying. Another IC1 male then appeared and was attempted to get towards the other male being detained, he was throwing his arms around with force, Pc DELLAR 167YE, Pc CLARKE 248YE and Pc ASSER 222YE were attempting to control this male, he looked in a rage and there was blood on his face. I could hear shouting from the main door; I turned around and saw a group of drunken males, approximately 5 to 10 in number. These males were attempting to get to the males being detained behind us. I saw an IC1 male as part of this group, he was F600, medium build, he was grinding his teeth shouting "lets fucking have it to" to me. I shouted to the male to stand back, other males were also shouting towards us, they started to come forward, I was aware PC EWART 277YE had withdrew his TASER. I saw the male in the grey jumper coming towards me with fists clenched. I withdrew my TASER and conducted a red dot challenge on the male's chest, giving verbal commands to him to "stay back" and explained the red dot was from a TASER. I feared that if this male and group were to continue there behaviour that one of my colleagues would be seriously injured. They area of the incident was small and there were people coming into it from all directions. One of the security staff shouted TASER, the group retreated to the other side of the door, I then put my TASER into a high profile position until they left and re holstered it. I then turned to assist Pc DELLAR 167YE who was attempting to handcuff a male on the floor; the male was bleeding from his nose and was calling DELLAR a "fucking CUNT". I was then made aware of a male approaching Pc WALE 365YE with a bottle in his hand, I stopped the male and removed the bottle from his hand, a blonde female member of staff then started to shout at myself and other officers "you're fucking too late, I these ones" the female was immediately told to leave the area and a male ushered her into a cupboard. Although numerous security staff were present, they did not attempt to stop the group of males attempting to get to officers whilst assisting with disorder. The male who was said to need CPR was found safe and well, he did not as reported require medical treatment.

I walked in + started to make my way to the entrance of the bar area + suddenly lots of males were coming out. suddenly a male came out who I know to be [REDACTED]. I turned round + said to PC 4774C Rounson "That's [REDACTED]" HE was with another larger male wearing a Gilet. All of a sudden I could see OFFICERS struggling with a male who I know to be [REDACTED] + then the male that I had previously seen in the female toilet bending down was struggling with PC 1674C + PC 2484C Clarke. They ended up bringing him to the floor just where I was standing near to the main entrance of the bar. This male was still struggling so I placed my whole weight on his legs. As I believed + feared that he might of used it on officers. At this point PC 3364C removed it from him. A member of staff a female, blond was shouting "you've got the wrong people, let them go." She too appeared to be leaning over by the officers + [REDACTED]. PC 3364C appeared when we were with this white male + assisted PC 1671C in handcuffing him. This male was bleeding from his face. He was still shouting + swearing, however it was incoherent. The ambulance crew arrived + assisted with his injuries. At this point I was aware that PC 1671C had arrested him. I then became aware that [REDACTED] was wanted for failing to appear + was arrested by PC 3654C wife. I could see that there was lots of fresh blood from where PC 1671C prisoner was restrained. I would like to add that we received no assistance from the staff at 211. They all stood there whilst we were struggling with these two males. The female member of staff did not assist us at 211 + at one point she said "you're fucking too late, you've missed them." She also stated that she knew them. When she was shouting a black male, a doorman suddenly pushed her into a door.

On Saturday 1st February 2014 I was on duty in uniform in a marked police vehicle call sign YE21N with PC Clarke 248YE.

At approximately 0525 hours CAD 1981/01FEB14 was circulated via the P.R stating that a member of public had called in regarding a fight at Club 303 Jute Lane, Enfield, EN3.

On hearing this we stated we would attend and made our way.

I was aware other police units were attending.


After a short while we attended the location which is a night club in a warehouse type building on an industrial estate next to Brimsdown Railway station.

On arrival I saw a number of people and vehicles outside the location hanging around. There were a mixture of MALEs and FEMALEs and most of them appeared to be stumbling around as if they were drunk.

We got out of our vehicle and at this point I saw two other police units were on scene. I approached a MALE who appeared to be a member of the clubs security and asked him if there was any issues at the location. He advised us that there was a fight inside the club with a number of unknown people. On hearing this for our own safety we waited until a couple more police units joined us. After approximately two minutes I saw some more police units pull up at our location and we decided to enter the club to assist in stopping this fight and identify any victims or suspects regarding this matter.

On entering the foyer of the club which was about four metres wide by 2 metres long in size a large number of people were exiting the club from what appeared to be the main hall to the left of the foyer. These were mainly MALEs and I noticed that a number of them had blood marks on their clothing and some looked dishevelled and drunk and it appeared that a number of them had been involved in some sort of disturbance. I noticed two IC1 MALEs one of whom was washing his face in a sink in what appeared to be a disabled toilet with the door wide open which was situated to the right of the foyer next to a cloakroom.

As I walked in to this foyer I noticed there was a large amount of liquid all over the wooden floor which made the

floor extremely slippery and unstable as I walked.

Whilst the people were exiting the main hall I began to walk to the main hall to see who was in it. As I approached the hall a small IC1 MALE who I immediately recognised to be ~~PC 167YE~~ dob ~~1982~~ walked out of the main hall very swiftly and walked passed me. On recognising ~~PC 167YE~~ I was aware he was wanted for failing to appear at court so I turned to approach him and stop him as he had now passed me and was approaching the exit door very quickly. At this point I saw that PC Wale had stood in front of him and was attempting to speak to him. I was aware that PC Wale had stopped ~~PC 167YE~~ a day or two ago and that believed he was confirming this was ~~PC 167YE~~ in order to arrest him for being wanted.

As I approached them I heard PC Wale say to ~~PC 167YE~~ that he recognised him as being ~~PC 167YE~~ and in response to this ~~PC 167YE~~ replied by stating he was wrong and that he was ~~PC 167YE~~.

PC Wale pointed out that he was wanted for an offence at which point ~~PC 167YE~~ reacted to this by attempting to get past PC Wale towards the door.

At this point knowing that ~~PC 167YE~~ was wanted and believing he was trying to make off I took hold of his left arm with my right hand to prevent him making off with the intention of arresting him for this offence. As soon as I took hold of his arm he began pulling away from me and violently jumping up and down, jerking away from me and trying to loosen my grip to get away. Because of this I grabbed his left arm with my left hand as well to ensure he could not get away.

At this point there was a large number of people in the foyer including persons that appeared to be staff as well as customers.

PC Wale initially assisted me in trying to detain ~~PC 167YE~~ to arrest him however people from the foyer began trying to step in and were attempting to assist ~~PC 167YE~~ in getting away by pulling at ~~PC 167YE~~, myself and PC Wale and shouting abuse at us. Because of this PC Wale then turned to this group and attempted to stop them assisting ~~PC 167YE~~.

~~PC 167YE~~ continued violently jumping around trying his best to get away from my grip. Whilst he was doing this I kept hold of his arm but was getting pulled around myself by him and other people in the club and also slipping around on the wet floor.

I tried to pull him away from the exit door and into the main hall but as I was trying to do this I noticed some of the other officers including PC Dellar 167YE and PC Clarke were struggling with a MALE who I now know to be ~~PC 167YE~~ dob ~~1982~~. I believed ~~PC 167YE~~ was one of the two MALEs in the disabled toilet washing his face when we entered the foyer and recognised him as being the first person who tried to prevent me from keeping hold of ~~PC 167YE~~ by trying to get in between us when I initially took hold of him.

Whilst struggling with ~~PC 167YE~~ I could not believe his strength for such a small person and believed at this point he was under the influence of drugs being cocaine or speed which was helping him pull at me with such force and jump about so excitedly without tiring.

I lost my grip on him with my left hand a number of times and was unable to access my handcuffs in order to handcuff him to help detain him more easily.

Whilst he continued to struggle a large amount of people continued to pass us exiting the club and also shouting abuse at us and trying to involve themselves.

At this point every attempt I made to either pull [REDACTED] to the floor or place him against a wall to try and secure him better to then handcuff him and effect an arrest had failed and I was beginning to get tired.

Fearing that I was going to let go of him at any moment and believing he would either assault me or make off if I let go I then shouted for an officer to help me handcuff him.

At this point PC Debnam 668YE joined me and with her assistance [REDACTED] was placed on the floor and once secure on the floor he was handcuffed in a rear stack.

Once he was secured I tried to explain to him that he was wanted but there was still a lot of commotion going on in the foyer and I was unable to explain the situation.

After a short while things calmed down a bit. At this point we got [REDACTED] up on to his feet and checked the tightness of his handcuffs and double locked them.

PC Wale then joined us and informed [REDACTED] that he knew him to be [REDACTED] and that he was aware he was wanted for breach of court order. [REDACTED] again stated that we were wrong and that he was [REDACTED]

Because of this in order to confirm his identity I got one of the police officers with us to obtain the mobile ID fingerprint machine from my vehicle. This was obtained and I obtained his fingerprints on the machine and this confirmed we were correct and that he was [REDACTED]. A PNC check was conducted and this confirmed he was wanted for breach of court order on 13/09/13 at St Albans Crown Court and was not backed for bail.

At this point at 0554 hours PC Wale arrested and fully cautioned him for this offence.

No reply was made to caution.


I was also aware at this stage that [REDACTED] had been arrested for affray for his behaviour towards the officers and his attempts to prevent us detaining and arresting [REDACTED].

We then escorted him out of the club in order to place him in a police van to escort him to custody.


Once outside the club and at the rear of a police van PC Wale searched [REDACTED] under S.32 PACE whilst I kept hold of him. During this search I saw that PC Wale had taken a wrapped up twenty pound note out of [REDACTED] jeans money pocket. As he produced this he asked [REDACTED] what was wrapped up in it and [REDACTED] responded by saying it was cocaine and it was for personal use.

On discovering this at 0600 hours PC Wale further arrested [REDACTED] for possession of class A drugs namely cocaine.

I am Police const [redacted] E Jason Dellar of the Metropolitan police currently stationed at [redacted] Edmonton police station. On Saturday the 01st of February 2014 I was on duty in full uniform as the operator of a marked police Car Y3N in company with Pc 365YE Ben Wale the driver of the vehicle also in full uniform. At about 05.25 hrs we received a call to "Club 303" Jute Lane Enfield to a report of a large fight at the location involving 30 plus males Cad 1981 Refers. We accepted the call along with numerous other units and made our way to the location whilst en route I was aware that I99 were above the venue and they informed CCR that people were milling around outside, we also received further information that a fight was taking part inside the venue and a male was reported to be inside the club receiving CPR, due to this information an ambulance was requested over the radio to attend the location.

On arrival at the club Pc Wale parked the car close to the club and we walked over towards the entrance where several other marked units were waiting close by. On speaking with my colleagues I was advised that there was a large fight inside the club mainly between white males, some of which were believed to be Irish males and some English approximately 20 to 30 of them still fighting,

One male had a bad head injury who had been assisted by staff as he fell unconscious. I was also advised that security staff required our assistance as they were trying to clear the club as the males were still fighting inside.

Myself, along with Pc Clarke 248YE 167YE, PC ROBINSON 477YE, PC WALE 365YE, PC EWART 277YE, PC BOWEN 336YE and other officers made our way into the club to assist the security staff in clearing the venue and breaking up the fight. When we went into the club there was a small reception area approximately 30 Foot long and about 12 foot wide, which had a lot of males standing around.

I noticed that some of the males had blood on them and there was a clear sign of disturbance and a fight had taken place.

As I was standing in the reception area people were slowly coming out and making their way to the exit. A lot of the males were heavily intoxicated and were being abusive as they were coming out. In the reception area were the doors leading to the toilets. The floor was extremely wet and which I believed it to be alcohol making it very slippery. All of a Sudden I saw PC Wale and Pc Robinson start to struggle with a male who was leaving the club close to the main entrance. I could hear him shouting and swearing. This caused numerous other IC1 males to start pushing forward and trying to get to Police officers and the male was struggling with Pc Wale and Robinson. At this point an IC1 male, with short brown hair of slim build wearing a black shiny jacket and Dark jeans, who I now know to be [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED] come out of the toilet adjacent to the main entrance and started screaming and shouting and trying to attack PC ROBINSON and Pc Wale and I noticed that [REDACTED] had blood on his face and hands as if he had been fighting. Due to his aggressive behaviour I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] arm to stop him from getting near them as I believed that [REDACTED] was going to attempt to get to my colleges and assist the male in escaping. I shouted at [REDACTED] to stop and he refused, and so I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] and tried to pull him away and was aware that Pc Clarke had also took hold of [REDACTED] continued to struggle with us and we were joined by other officers were also trying to restrain him. [REDACTED] then turned around, shouting and threw a punch at Pc Clarke and he continued to be extremely aggressive towards police, [REDACTED] was lashing out and as I took hold of his arm he then turned around and threw a punch towards me nearly hitting me in the face. It was quite clear that [REDACTED] was under the influence of alcohol or drugs, as he was very aggressive and violent. Due to his violent behaviour and the fact that he was causing other males to become aggressive I decided to try and take [REDACTED] to the floor in order to restrain him. [REDACTED] was resisting and refused to comply with Police, with numerous officers shouting for him and the other males to move back. The area was very small and cramped and due to the wet floor it was difficult to stand up. Because of [REDACTED]s violent behaviour I believed that an officer may be badly injured and I feared for my college's safety as they were trying to deal with the other male and were not aware that [REDACTED] was trying to get to them and fight them from behind.

Due to the above both myself and Pc Clarke attempted to take [REDACTED] to the ground as it was safer to detain him while he was on the ground. I was shouting at [REDACTED] to get down on the floor and I could hear Pc Clarke shouting as well, but [REDACTED] was not listening and continued to fight with us. At this point, I had [REDACTED] around the head and he was still throwing punches towards me and trying to get away from me. [REDACTED] broke free and again threw several punches

at me hitting me on the chest and Head as a result of this I decided to use a distraction technique by punching him twice in the chest this didn't work, and [REDACTED] carried on aggressively swinging his arms, with clinched fists trying to punch myself and Pc Clarke. During the struggle I saw Pc Clarke also deliver two distraction strikes to his thigh in order to get [REDACTED] to the floor but he was still resisting. It was quite clear that [REDACTED] would not calm down and it was he was out to fight with police. [REDACTED] was continually shouting at us to "fuck off" and was calling me a "fucking cunt".

We eventually got [REDACTED] onto the floor and I and Pc Clarke managed to over power [REDACTED] and get him to the floor on his front. We were then attempting to get his arms behind his back to handcuff him and detain a violent male. [REDACTED] was still resisting and as a result he was banging his head on the ground and the wall next to our location I noticed that his nose was bleeding and he had a cut above one of his eyes [REDACTED] was still tensing his arms and torso and was kicking his legs out. And we needed the assistance of other officers to control him. We were joined by Pc 366YE Wilson, Pc 222YE Asser and Pc 336YE Bowen and eventually after struggling with [REDACTED], we managed to get his arms behind his back and handcuff him in a rear stack. [REDACTED] was still shouting and swearing and telling me to

"fuck off" and calling me a "Fucking cunt" [REDACTED] continued to struggle on the floor and in the process was banging his head, I was aware that other males were still being aggressive towards police but I focused my attention on [REDACTED] and was trying to calm him down Pc Bowen was standing next to me and he informed me that he was recording the incident on his body cam. Whilst [REDACTED] was on the floor at 05:45am I informed him that I was arresting him on suspicion of Affray and cautioned him to which he replied "Fuck you, Fuck you, you cunt" I then spoke with Pc 277YE Ewart and asked him to call an ambulance in order to treat [REDACTED]'s injuries. Whilst waiting for the ambulance he continued to struggle on the floor and was continuously abusive towards me. [REDACTED] continued to shout and swear and telling us to fuck off. Whilst waiting for the ambulance I could hear males outside the club still shouting and banging on the main doors to the club, when they were eventually moved on staff from LAS came into the club and we stood [REDACTED] up and they checked his injuries and requested that we take him to the ambulance in order for them to treat him.

I remained with [REDACTED] I led him to the ambulance and whilst in the ambulance he continued to be verbally abusive towards me swearing at me calling me a "nasty bastard" and a "fucking cunt"


On Saturday 1st February at approximately 0525hrs, I was on duty in full uniform, posted as the driver of a marked Police vehicle, call sign YE21 nights with PC ROBINSON 477YE. We are both taser trained officers and were carrying tasers.

We received a call to attend CLUB 303, DUTE LANE, ENFIELD as an unknown informant stated that there was a large fight at the club, CAD 1981/01FEB14 refers.

On arrival at scene, a female approached me and stated that there was a large fight inside the club mainly between white males, some of which were believed to be Irish males and some English. She stated that there were approximately 20 to 30 of them fighting. The female stated that one male had a bad head injury and she had assisted him as he fell unconscious and she had administered CPR. The female couldn't give me a good description of what the male looked like as she had put him in the recovery position and then got out the way as she was scared as the males were still all fighting. The security staff stated that there was still a fight taking place inside the club and they wanted our assistance to clear the club.

Myself, along with PC DELLAR 167YE, PC ROBINSON 477YE, PC WALE 365YE, PC EWART 277YE, PC BOWEN 336YE and other officers went into the club to assist. When we went into the club there was a small reception area approximately 6 meters long and 4 meters wide, which had a lot of males loitering around. Some of the males had blood on them and there was a clear sign of disturbance and a fight had taken place.

I was standing in the reception area, and people were slowly coming out and making their way to the doors. A lot of the

males were heavily intoxicated and were being abusive as they were coming out. There was one more main entrance to the main dance floor. In the reception area were the doors leading to the toilets. The floor was covered in liquid believed to be alcohol making it very slippery.


Suddenly I saw PC ROBINSON, and other officers start to struggle with a male to the right of the main dance floor entrance. I could hear him shouting and swearing. This caused numerous other IC1 males to start pushing forward and trying to get to Police officers and also the male officers were attempting to detain.

At this point an IC1 male, slim build with short brown hair, wearing a black jacket and blue jeans, who I now know to be [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED] of an unknown address come out of the toilet next to where I was standing, and tried to get past me, screaming and shouting and trying to attack PC ROBINSON and the other officers present. I could see that [REDACTED] had blood on his face and hands as if he had been fighting.

I took hold of [REDACTED] arm to stop him from getting near them due to the fact that I had a genuine honest held belief that [REDACTED] was going to attempt to get to my colleges and assist the male in escaping and in doing so use force on him due to his aggressive behaviour. I shouted for the male to stop and he refused, and so I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] and tried to pull him back. I am aware that PC DELLAR and other officers were also trying to stop [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then turned around, shouting and threw a punch in my direction. Fortunately I was far enough away to move and not get hit, but still [REDACTED] was lashing out, and I also saw him try to punch PC DELLAR in the face as well. [REDACTED] was clearly attempting to assault us. [REDACTED] was clearly under the influence of alcohol and due to his erratic behaviour, I also believe that he had consumed drugs, as he was very aggressive and violent.

[REDACTED] was refusing to resist and comply with Police , with numerous officers shouting for him and the other males to move back. The area was very small and cramped. The only good thing was that the lighting had gone back on and so people could see what was happening. I felt that there was a good chance that with [REDACTED] acting in this aggressive and violent way, an officer may be badly injured as I feared for my colleges safety as they were trying to deal with the other male and were not aware that [REDACTED] was trying to get to them and fight them from behind.

At this stage, both myself and PC DELLAR attempted to take [REDACTED] to the ground as it was safer to detain him while he was on the ground, due to the small area and slippery floors. I was shouting at [REDACTED] to get down on the floor and I

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

could hear PC DELLAR shouting as well, but [REDACTED] was not listening and continued to fight us. I had [REDACTED] round the body and was trying to pull him away as he was skinny and was wriggling away from me and was pumped up and very worked up. Once I was closer to [REDACTED], I considered a red dot challenge to try and stop [REDACTED] but the area was too small, there were too many people and officers around, and it wasn't a suitable use of force. I also considered my baton and CS but both would not work as the close proximity of others, and so I kneed him twice in the fleshy part of his left thigh as a distraction technique to get [REDACTED] to stop trying to attack PC ROBINSON and get him to the floor. This didn't work and had no affect on [REDACTED] and he carried on aggressively swinging his arms, with clinched fists trying to punch us. I saw PC DELLAR also deliver distraction strikes to [REDACTED] to get him to the floor but he was still resisting. Due to the close area that we were trying to restrain [REDACTED] in and stop him fighting us, I couldn't see where PC DELLAR struck [REDACTED], but whatever we did, [REDACTED] would not resist and it was clear he was out to fight us. [REDACTED] was continually shouting at us to "fuck off" and calling PC DELLAR "a fucking cunt". Finally myself and PC DELLAR managed to over power [REDACTED] and get him to the floor on his front. We were then attempting to get his arms behind his back to handcuff him and detain a violent male. [REDACTED] was still resisting, tensing his arms and torso and was kicking his legs out. I think he may have kicked another officer in the leg. Eventually after struggling with [REDACTED], we managed to get his arms behind his back and handcuff him in a rear stack. [REDACTED] was still shouting and swearing and telling us to fuck off and so PC DELLAR held onto [REDACTED]'s handcuffs and kept him on the floor as [REDACTED] was still trying to get up.

I then got up as [REDACTED] was detained, and started to push the males back into the dance floor area as they were trying to get out. I was continually shouting at two IC3 males and an IC1 male in particular that were being aggressive. I could hear that people were banging on the main doors which had been shut to stop anyone else coming in.

Eventually the club was emptied and [REDACTED] was taken to an ambulance outside as he had sustained injuries believed to be from where he was fighting earlier in the club. An Irish male then made himself known to LAS with a large cut wound to the back of his head. The male was also very intoxicated and stated that he had been beaten up by some white lads in the club. The male didn't give any other information to me and was being dealt with by other officers on scene.

I went back into the club and spoke to the manager about the CCTV. I attended the manager's office and viewed the CCTV. Although the club has approximately 18 cameras, there were only 6 working, none of which showed any of the areas where the fighting took place or where the arrests of the two males had taken place. I asked the staff to confirm that the CCTV



**1        MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION :**

- 1.1 In accordance with Section 161 of The Licensing Act 2003 ('the Act'), a senior police officer may make a closure order in relation to any relevant premises if he reasonably believes that (a) there is, or is likely imminently to be, disorder on, or in the vicinity of and related to, the premises and their closure is necessary in the interests of public safety, or (b) a public nuisance is being caused by noise coming from the premises and the closure of the premises is necessary to prevent that nuisance. A closure order is an order requiring relevant premises to be closed for a period not exceeding 24 hours beginning with the coming into force of the order. In determining whether to make a closure order in respect of any premises, the senior police officer must have regard, in particular, to the conduct of each appropriate person in relation to the disorder or nuisance.
- 1.2 Copies of the closure order and documentation received from the Police are attached as Annex 01.
- 1.3 In accordance with Section 164 of the Act, the responsible senior police officer must, as soon as reasonably practicable after a closure order comes into force in respect of any relevant premises, apply to the relevant magistrates court for it to consider the order.
- 1.4 In accordance with Section 165 of the Act, the relevant magistrates court must as soon as reasonably practicable after receiving an application from the responsible senior police officer : (a) hold a hearing to consider whether it is appropriate to exercise any of the court's powers in relation to the closure order, and (b) determine whether to exercise any of those powers. The relevant magistrates' court may : (a) revoke the closure order; (b) order the premises to remain, or to be, closed until such time as the relevant licensing authority has made a determination in respect of the order; (c) order the premises to remain or to be closed until that time subject to such exceptions as may be specified in the order; or (d) order the premises to remain or to be closed until that time unless such conditions as may be specified in the order are satisfied.
- 1.5 A copy of the order received from the Magistrates Court is attached as Annex 02.

2 **HEARING & RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS :**

- 2.1 In accordance with Section 167 of the Act, where the Council (as licensing authority) has received notice of the court order, the Council must review the premises licence. The Licensing Sub-Committee must hold a hearing to consider the closure order, the court order and any relevant representations.
- 2.2 In accordance with Nos. 4 & 5 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005, the hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee must be commenced within ten working days of the Council receiving the court order.
- 2.3 In accordance with No. 38 of The Licensing Act 2003 (premises licences and club premises certificates) Regulations 2005, this review of premises licence following closure order was advertised for seven consecutive days commencing on 12 February 2014.
- 2.4 The premises licence holder, any responsible authority and any other person may attend the hearing, in person, to make their relevant representations to the Licensing Sub-Committee.
- 2.5 In accordance with Section 167 of the Act, relevant representations means representations which are relevant to one or more of the licensing objectives and, if they are made by a person (who is not also a responsible authority), are not, in the opinion of Licensing Sub-Committee, frivolous or vexatious.

During this time Viw3 a doorman at the location became freed up from his duties as more of the patrons left the location. He stated that he had witnessed exactly what had happened. He informed police that he saw 6-7 Albanian males attacking both Viw1 and 2 while they were on the floor, they were all punching into both males and throwing glasses on top of them and SUS1 smash a glass into the back of Viw2's head while he was unconscious on the floor. Viw4 the grabbed two of the males and dragged them off, and all of the suspects ran out of the bar barging into everyone as they

left. They ran through the bar to the front entrance and then onto the main road Chase Side in an unknown direction.

Once Viw1 and 2 were in the ambulance, police spoke to both males again. Viw2 was adamant that he could not recall anything. Viw1 stated that they were standing on the dance floor when he bumped into SUS1 who then punched him in the face and then hit Viw2 but did not think the suspect used a bottle glass or weapon.

Both victims were taken to North Middlesex Hospital by H101 with PC LAW 300YE as continuity officer.

*I am a Police Inspector attached to an Emergency Response Team at Enfield Borough. My role requires me to attend the scenes of serious incidents including assaults on licensed premises. Under certain circumstances I the power to inspect any such premises and if appropriate serve a closure notice under section 161 of the licensing act 2003.*

*On Sunday 9th February 2014, I was on duty in uniform carrying out my normal duties as Borough Duty Officer when about 0150hrs, I heard a call via my PR (CAD ref 889) from the London Ambulance Service (LAS) were on their way to the Rising Sun Public House in Chase Side, N14 where a 25 year old male had been assaulted. I was aware that a number of police units responded to this call and the first officer on scene asked for more units as they felt there was an officer safety risk within the pub due to the number present and the general mood of the participants.*

*I started to make my way to the pub as officers updated the call stating the injuries sustained amounted to a GBH, I also heard Police Sergeant **Lucey** ask for a further unit in order to gain full control of the incident.*

*As I arrived about 0210hrs, I noted that a large group of men and women remained in the street outside the pub, most of who appeared to be under the influence of alcohol but remained reasonably calm.*

*I was met inside the pub by PS **Lucey** who explained what she and officers had established and what assistance had been given by staff within the pub. I was subsequently introduced to Mr **Kevin McIntyre** the designated supervising officer and **Nandi Rooney** the assistant manager, Ms **Rooney** confirmed that she had called the LAS but not police*

*A copy of the licence was produced, which I read in order to check the most relevant points my attention was drawn to a*

*condition that required staff to call police following any disorder or when persons on the premises had taken part in any offence.*

*When asked about this Ms **Rooney** stated that she had told the LAS there had been an assault. I felt that failing to call police may have put members of the LAS at risk as they would be required to enter a potentially hostile and violent environment whilst delaying the possible apprehension of offender and their criminal behaviour. As a result of this I served a form 690 and accompanying notes (via PS **Lucey**) on Mr **McIntyre** which outlined the closure of the Maze Inn, otherwise known as the Rising Sun, 7 Chase Side, N14. This was to remain in place until 1200hrs, on 09/02/14.*

*The grounds for the closure were as follows.*

- 1. The assistant manager did not alert police to the assault and so created a potential for it to continue either inside or outside the venue and cause unnecessary danger to first responders.*
- 2. I have attended a near identical incident at this venue albeit sometime ago.*
- 3. This incident took place in the presence of security staff within the bar and led to two victims of assault one of which amounted to GBH.*
- 4. Groups remained in the vicinity and had potential to return to the venue.*

*Having served to notice we were joined by MSC Inspector **Matthew Appleton** and is licensing team who inspected the licence copy whilst arranging a full licensing inspection whilst on the premises.*

*I have identified two other CAD calls to the venue relating to this incident. The first is CAD 882 at 0144hrs, during which an unidentified male asks if an ambulance had been called. The second is CAD 902 at 0149hrs, from an [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who states he had seen a male lying on the floor with lots of blood.*

*It is worth noting that staff appeared to be closing the pub when I arrived, that said I could not guarantee it would not re-open when officers left and so I felt it necessary to serve the notice.*

A senior police officer has decided to make this closure order under the terms of section 161 of the Licensing Act 2003, requiring the relevant premises specified in the order to be closed for the period of time specified in the order.

Your attention is drawn to section 161(6) of the 2003 Act. This makes it an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse, to permit relevant premises to be open in contravention of this closure order or any extension of it, and any person found guilty of such an offence shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both.

By virtue of section 171(2) and (3) of the 2003 Act, relevant premises are to be regarded as open, for the purposes of this order, if any person other than the holder of the premises licence for the premises, any designated premises supervisor, the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, a manager of the premises, any person who usually lives at the premises or any member of the family of any of the former, enters the premises and buys, or is otherwise supplied with food or drink or any item usually sold on the premises or, while he is on the premises, they are used for the provision of regulated entertainment.

**Section 162 – 168 of the Licensing Act 2003**

This part of the closure order now explains the effects of sections 162 – 168 of the 2003 Act as required by section 161(4)(d) of that Act.

## Initial hearing

- The senior police officer who made the closure order is under a statutory duty to apply to the magistrates' court for it to consider the order, or any extension of it, as soon as reasonably practicable after it comes into force.
- The magistrates' court must consider the closure order made by a senior police officer as soon as practicable after receiving the application, by holding a hearing and determining whether to exercise its powers under section 165 of the 2003 Act.
- Under law on human rights, you are entitled to attend the hearing, to be legally represented, and to make representations to the court before any decision is taken. The chief executive to the magistrates' court will be able to advise you about the details of the procedures which apply in your area.
- A discretion is provided for the magistrates to revoke the order and any extension of it, if it is still in force; or to order that the premises remain closed or be closed until a review of the licence has taken place; or to order that the premises remain closed until a review of the licence has taken place but subject to such exceptions or conditions that they may specify. The last of these powers would enable the court to allow premises to re-open but subject to certain new terms and conditions which they may decide to impose.
- When deciding whether the premises should be allowed to re-open or remain closed, the court must consider whether closure of the premises is necessary in the interests of public safety to prevent disorder or likely disorder (where the closure order was made for this reason) or to prevent further public nuisance caused by noise (where the closure order was made for this reason).
- It is an offence for any person who permits the premises to open in contravention of an order made by the magistrates for the closure of the premises, and the 2003 Act provides for an offender on conviction to be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to three months imprisonment or to both.
- It is an offence for any person who fails to comply with or does an act in contravention of any order made by the magistrates in relation to the premises in these proceedings, and provides for an offender on conviction to be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to three months imprisonment or to both.
- Where, for whatever reason, the courts are unable to consider a closure order before it expires, the senior police officer concerned may extend the order for up to another period of 24 hours if certain circumstances obtain. These are that the officer reasonably believes that the closure of the premises continues to be necessary in the interests of the public safety to prevent disorder, or likely disorder, or to prevent further public nuisance caused by noise. Such extensions can be made on an indefinite number of occasions.
- The senior police officer is required to give notice to the holder of the premises licence for the premises, or to any designated premises supervisor, or the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, or a manager of the premises of such extensions of the closure order.
- The senior police officer may cancel his closure order or any extension of it at any time after he has issued it, but before it has been considered by the court. If he does so, the court must still consider the closure order originally served, and the licensing authority will still be obliged to review the premises licence.
- The senior police officer is required to cancel the order if he reasonably believes that closure of the premises is no longer necessary in the interests of public safety to prevent disorder or to prevent further public nuisance; and is required to give notice to the holder of the premises licence for the premises, or any designated premises supervisor, or the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, or a manager of the premises when he decides to cancel it.

## Review hearing

- The licensing authority must review the premises licence in respect of the premises no later than 28 days after it is notified of the magistrates' court's determination. The authority is empowered, if necessary, to promote the licensing objectives, to modify the conditions of the premises licence, exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence, suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months or revoke the licence. Their consideration is not confined solely to the incident which gave rise to the service of the closure order. They may examine any issues which are relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- Where a decision has been made to revoke the premises licence, the decision has no effect until the expiry of the time permitted for appealing against the decision; and if an appeal is made until the appeal is disposed of.

In considering the closure of a premises for disorder the following should be taken into account;

- The conduct of the person in charge i.e. what have they done to prevent the disorder, has their action or inaction contributed to the problem, do you have faith in their offer to close?
- Whether the premises has a history of disorder, as opposed to a one off incident?
- Whether the disorder can be attributed to the premises or has it simply occurred in its general vicinity?
- If the disorder is not already occurring what are the grounds for suspecting it is imminent?
- Will the closure order solve the problem or are there other alternatives? .
- The potential to aggravate the disorder by ejecting a large and possibly aggrieved crowd from a premises at once, as a consequence of a closure order.

If after giving these matters consideration and the decision to close the premises is taken then a **form 690** should be completed and handed to the appropriate person which will be the person in control of the premises and could be; the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) a personal licence holder, a manager or a Temporary Event Notice User.

Consideration should be given to the length of time the order should remain in force. The closure order should not be made for longer than is required for the disorder/ public nuisance matter to be resolved, for a maximum period of 24 hours.

A closure order only prohibits licensable activity i.e. the sale or supply of alcohol, hot food/drink after 11pm, or the provision of regulated entertainment. There is no power in the legislation for officers to use reasonable force to physically close a premises.

**Extension of a section 161 closure order (section 162 LA 2003)**

If before the closure has expired, a senior officer reasonably believes that by the end of the closure period, a Magistrates' Court will not have been able to consider the order and the criteria for the order continue to apply, they may order an extension of the order up to a further 24 hours.

**Cancellation of a section 161 closure order (section 163 LA 2003)**

A closure order **must** be cancelled if the senior officer reasonably believes that the matters relating to its issue have been resolved.

### **Closure Orders S161 Licensing Act 2003**

Several recent incidents have highlighted a lack of consistency in the use of Closure Orders issued by officers under section 161 Licensing Act 2003 (LA 2003).

The powers contained within this section are a useful tool when dealing with disorder occurring, or likely imminently to occur, at, or in the vicinity of, licensed premises where there is a risk to public safety and closure of the premises is deemed necessary to alleviate this risk. (A flow chart outlining the process is available and should be used in conjunction with this guidance)

An order under section 161 LA 2003 is for use at any licensed premises including premises benefiting from a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) however this does not include a club premises certificate. A section 161 order is a valuable reactive tool for an officer dealing with spontaneous disorder at an identified premises. If however there is disorder occurring, or more likely, anticipated in a geographic area, an alternative power can be used under section 160 LA 2003. This enables a Superintendent to apply to the Magistrates' Court for an order requiring all licensed premises within a specific location to close for up to 24 hours where they are satisfied such an order is necessary to prevent disorder. Again this does not apply to premises with a club premises certificate.

#### **Procedure**

A closure order under section 161 must be made by an officer of **at least the rank of Inspector**, who must be satisfied that the closure is necessary in the interests of public safety in the case of disorder, or to prevent nuisance in the case of public nuisance caused by noise.

A closure order must be in writing and can be served by a constable of any rank. In exceptional circumstances it may be appropriate for the Senior Officer to make the order remotely and ask an officer at the scene to deal with service of the Order. However given the serious implications of such an Order and the fact that the Officer making the Order will be accountable for a decision to close a premises, it is envisaged that an Inspector will generally be in attendance at the scene, to make a full assessment of the situation before deciding to deploy this particular operational tactic.

As the issue of a closure order under section 161 has serious implications, including automatically triggering a Court hearing and a licence review, careful consideration should be given to their use. Where possible and appropriate, immediate voluntary closure of the premises should be sought by the person in charge.

The order and any copy of it should be endorsed 'cancelled' and signed and dated by the senior officer who made the closure order and give notice of the cancellation to the Premises Licence Holder /Designated Premises Supervisor /manager of the premises.

**Application to a magistrates' court (section 164 - 165 LA 2003)**

The officer responsible for making the order **must**, as soon as practicable after the closure order comes into force, apply to a relevant magistrates' court for it to consider the order and any extension of it.

The legislation is slightly ambiguous regarding the position with regards to an application to Court if the closure order has been cancelled at any point prior to the hearing. Based upon legal advice, the MPS position in such a situation is that an application **must** still be made to a Magistrates' Court **irrespective of any cancellation or expiry of the order.**

Legal representation for this court hearing is available from the DLS. The Court will require at the bare minimum, a copy of the closure order and a details of the incident that gave rise to the closure.

The Officer must also notify the relevant Licensing Authority (Part of the local authority) that;

1. a closure order has come into force.
2. the contents of the order and any extension of it
3. and that application has been made to a magistrates' court.

**Licence Review Hearing (section 167 LA 2003)**

A full licence review hearing will be convened within 10 working days after the day that the local authority receives notification from the magistrates' court of their decision.

All closures of licensed premises under section 161 LA 2003 should be brought to the **immediate** attention of the Borough Licensing Officer who will be responsible for managing the review process and any subsequent action involving the premises.

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### **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.**
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**
- 3. Where the licence includes a condition that individuals are required to carry out any security activity at specified times at the premises each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.**

### **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- 4. With the exception of Amusement with prize machines, there shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.**
- 5. Regulated entertainment by way of live music shall be restricted to a maximum of two performers at any one time.**
- 6. If a disc jockey is used on any night, then he/she shall ask customers to leave quietly.**
- 7. Additional patrols shall take place by members of staff internally and externally to limit any noise pollution when regulated entertainment is being offered within the premises.**
- 8. Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks shall be available.**
- 9. An additional CCTV camera to be placed at the front of the premises to cover the front drinking area.**
- 10. Children under 18 years of age shall not be permitted in the public areas of the premises after 23.00.**
- 11. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.**
- 12. At least 6 prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises including the toilets warning customers that drugs will not be tolerated.**
- 13. A digital CCTV system must be installed at the premises complying with the following criteria: (1) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside, the counter, alcohol displays and all the floor area; (2) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification; (3) Cameras**

viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of the screen; (4) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (5) Cameras facing the entrance door must capture a minimum of 16 per second; (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (8) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (11) Provide a monitor to in full view of customers entering the premises. This monitor must display the images of said customers; (12) Have a separate monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (13) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (14) Have signage displayed on the front entrance door and in the customer area to advise that recorded CCTV is in operation; (15) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (16) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (17) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

14. All doors and windows shall be kept closed (but not locked) during regulated entertainment, except for access to and egress from the premises.

15. The Management shall make subjective assessments of noise levels at the perimeter of the premises approximately hourly, whilst regulated entertainment is provided to ensure that noise from the premises does not cause a disturbance to local residents. Records shall be kept of the times, dates and any issues discovered. These shall be kept for six months. Records must be made available to an authorised officer of the Council, upon request. Where monitoring by staff identifies that noise from the premises audible at the perimeter, measures shall be taken to reduce this i.e. turning down the volume.

16. All staff at the premises shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every three months), relating to the sale of alcohol.

17. All training relating to the sale of alcohol shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

18. All instances of crime & disorder shall be reported to the Police and be kept in an incident logbook.

19. Toilets at the premises shall be checked for any sign of drug use on average every hour between 20:00 and closing time. A record shall be kept of the times, dates, and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for six months. Records must be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or the police upon request.

20. A minimum of three door supervisors shall be employed on the premises on Friday and Saturday from 21:00 until the premises is closed. The duties of these staff will include the supervision of persons entering and leaving the premises to ensure that this is achieved without causing a nuisance. Door Supervisors shall be easily identifiable by wearing either reflective jackets or reflective armbands.

21. Any door supervisors employed shall be from SIA approved contractors.

22. Signs shall be prominently displayed on the exit doors advising customers that the premises is in a 'Drinking Control Area' and that alcohol should not be taken off the premises and consumed in the street. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.

23. Children under 14 years of age shall not be permitted in the public areas of the premises after 21:00. Children under 18 years of age shall be supervised by an accompanying adult at all times.

24. A challenge 21 policy shall be employed whereby those who appear to be under the age of 21 and are asking to purchase alcohol will be asked for identification to prove their age. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.

25. There will be no new entry to the premises after 01:00 on Friday and Saturday.

26. The rear garden at the front of the premises shall not be used after 23:00 Monday to Saturday and 22:30 on Sunday.

27. An external area at the front of the premises shall be designated for the use of smokers from 23:00 until closing time on Mondays to Saturdays and from 22:30 until closing time on Sundays. Exceptions to this condition are customers entering or leaving via the doors at the front of the premises and those using the designated smoking area. There shall be no more than 15 persons using this designated area during these times and no alcoholic drinks or glass containers shall be permitted in the smoking area during these times. The designated area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons so as to not cause noise nuisance. Notices shall be displayed in the area specifying the terms of its use and asking patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to use the area quietly.

28. At least one door supervisor shall remain directly outside the premises for 30 minutes after the premises has closed on Fridays and Saturdays to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of patrons.

29. A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request.




