WELCOME AND APOLOGIES**

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. There were no apologies for absence.

**2
DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

There were no declarations of interest.

**3
MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING**

AGREED the minutes of the previous Licensing Sub-Committee meetings held on Wednesday 7 February 2024 and Wednesday 14 February 2024.

**4
EDMONTON CORBACISI, 30 STERLING WAY, LONDON, N18 2XZ**

NOTED

1. The introduction by Ellie Green, Principal Licensing Officer, including:
 - a. The sub-committee were to consider a variation application from the premises known as Edmonton Corbacisi, 30 Sterling Way, London N18 2XZ.
 - b. The current premises licence had been in operation since 4 March 2024.
 - c. The Premises Licence Holder was Mr Memik Gilgil. No DPS was required as there was no sale of alcohol at the premises, which was a restaurant.

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- d. The variation application sought extended opening hours and late night refreshment times, so that the premises could be open 24 hours daily.
 - e. Current opening hours permitted were 06:00 - 00:30 Sunday to Thursday and 06:00 – 02:30 Friday and Saturday.
 - f. The Police had objected to any extension of current hours, as it would undermine the licensing objectives. The Police representation was set out in Annex 3 of the report.
 - g. Mr Gilgil had offered one additional condition arising from the variation application: 'An intruder alarm with an emergency button, which when pressed alerts the Police, shall be installed and in use throughout the times of licensable activity'.
 - h. Mr Gilgil did not respond in writing to the Police representation, but did confirm he would like consideration of the application by Licensing Sub-Committee, and was present at the meeting.
2. Mr Memik Gilgil, the applicant, made the following statement:
- a. The premises served hot food, namely soup.
 - b. The premises' customers were mainly working people, from his (Turkish) community, travelling from London to home at night after work.
 - c. The premises was located on a busy road, where there was already a lot of traffic movement and parking at night.
 - d. The customers did not make a lot of noise: they came to the premises after work for soup and then left.
 - e. The restaurant did not serve any alcohol and did not play any music in the premises. There was nothing at the premises to lead to any problems.
 - f. There had been no incidents at the premises.
3. In response, the following question was received:
- a. Cllr Savva asked whether everything was in good order to operate the licence at the premises.
 - b. Mr Gilgil confirmed that everything was correctly in place, including 24 hour cctv, fully trained staff, and an alarm.
4. Sergeant Danni Jones, on behalf of the Police, made the following statement:
- a. The Police objected to the variation application seeking 24 hour opening seven days a week.
 - b. The original application for a premises licence was received on 29 January 2024, and the Police had detailed their concerns in respect of that application, objecting to the hours of the application. Following mediation, terms were agreed with Mr Gilgil and the Police and the current licence was granted on 4 March 2024.

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- c. On 18 April, a variation application was received to vary the hours of the premises licence. Police were surprised at the application at this time, as the operation was so new and the original application had been objected to on proposed timings.
 - d. The Police could see the same issues arising from the variation application and had submitted a representation opposing 24 hour opening and late night refreshment under the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objectives.
 - e. The variation application was lacking in information. In respect of additional steps to promote the licensing objectives as a result of this variation, the applicant had only submitted one under Part B, that “we have installed alarms connected to the Police”. This was not considered sufficient.
 - f. The Police considered that the licence should be operated for much longer before a variation application was made; for the licence holder to prove their ability to properly operate the licence sufficiently. This would be the advice given to any new licence holder.
 - g. This premises was located near a busy transport hub, with Silver Street station and bus routes by the venue, and there was seating opposite. The ward in which the premises was located was the second highest ward for crime and disorder in the borough. The area was affected by anti-social behaviour, violence, vehicle crime and sex trade, and there had been gang crime previously in this location. There were concerns the premises with late hours could attract more people in an already crime-impacted area.
5. In response, the following questions were received:
- a. In response to the Chair’s queries whether there had been any complaints received during the period the premises had had been operating, or incidents of criminal activities at the premises, it was advised there had been no reported incidents in the premises in the six weeks it had been operating, but that Sterling Way attracted a lot of crime.
 - b. In response to the Chair’s query, the licence holder confirmed that the premises had 24 hour cctv.
 - c. Members asked why the premises needed to have all night opening hours, and how granting the variation would help the business. The licence holder described his customers as finishing work late, at around midnight, often in kebab restaurants, and then travelling home which took them around 30 to 60 minutes. They wished to have something lighter to eat at that time. Granting the variation would help the business to serve these customers. If there was not such custom, the premises would not want to open at those late hours.
 - d. Members asked for confirmation in respect of provision of alcohol at the premises. The licence holder advised that there was no alcohol provided at the premises. There was also no music at the premises; the

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atmosphere was quiet and more like a home environment. They heated and served soup to their customers.

- e. Members asked about any complaints from local residents since the licence had been operating. The Principal Licensing Officer confirmed that no complaints had been received by the authority from local residents, including those living above the premises, and that no residents had made representations to this application.
6. The following closing summaries/points were made:
- a. The Principal Licensing Officer outlined, having read and heard the representations, the next steps available to the sub-committee, and directed them to the relevant guidance.
 - b. Sergeant Jones confirmed that the Police would like to see the premises operating for at least a year before considering any variation to timings. In principle they were not opposed to the premises operating and they did support new premises. However, this licence had been granted very recently and the current operating hours had been agreed in mediation with the Police. The Police position remained unchanged from a few weeks ago when objections were submitted in response to the original premises licence application with regard to the licensing objectives.
 - c. Mr Gilgil clarified that the operation was not ready to open longer hours at the time the hours were agreed originally. He had wanted to install more cameras and an alarm, and for staff to be fully trained. Now those were in place, the business needed to be improved so he had applied for the variation. He confirmed all of the licence conditions were complied with since March, but the staff team and staff training had not been ready. He confirmed the staff training was done by himself and an external person who also advised on health and safety. The training was on a personal basis as the licence holder considered fit.

The Chair thanked everyone for their time and adjourned the meeting at 10:26 while the sub-committee went away to deliberate. The Panel retired with the legal adviser and committee administrator to consider the application further, and then the meeting reconvened in public at 11:03.

The Licensing Sub-Committee **RESOLVED** that the application be **GRANTED** as follows:

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- (ii) Conditions:
11. An intruder alarm with an emergency button, which when pressed alerts the Police, shall be installed and in use throughout the times of licensable activity.
- (iii) *Formal training of all staff including induction and refresher training relating to all staff at the Premises and duly recorded and available for inspection by the Licensing Authority and Police.*

The Chair made the following statement:

“The Licensing Sub-Committee (LSC) having listened to and considered written and oral submissions made by the Licence Holder, Memik Gilgil, and the Metropolitan Police and in particular the evidence that there are no recorded incidents concerning crime and disorder or public nuisance concerning the Premises. Additionally, it has been noted that the Licensing Authority has not made any objections and nor have any objections been received from local residents. The Licence Holder to ensure all the Mandatory conditions of the licence are complied with including the display of relevant notices particularly concerning being respectful of local residents and leaving the premises quietly.

Accordingly, on balance, the LSC has made the **decision to GRANT THE VARIATION to the Licence** held by **MR MEMIK GILGIL**.

The LSC has taken into account the statutory guidance and the London Borough of Enfield’s Policy Statement in making its decision and has made its decision in promoting all of the four licensing objectives and in particular that of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance and the Protection of Children from Harm.”

The Chair thanked everyone for their time and contributions and the meeting ended at 11:06.

1.0 LICENSING HISTORY OF CURRENT LICENCE: LN/200501811

- 1.1 On 13 March 2006, an application by JD Weatherspoon, Wetherspoon House, Reeds Crescent, Watford, WD24 4Q to convert an existing Justices On Licence to a Premises Licence, which was not subject to any representations, was granted by the Licensing Authority (LN/200501811).
- 1.2 The premises licence was transferred in 2016, and then transferred to the current premises licence holder, Tiger Bay Estates Limited, on 23 August 2021.
- 1.3 A vary Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) application was granted on 30 August 2021, naming Mr Prashanth Thavatheva.
- 1.4 Mr Prashanth Thavatheva is the Director of Tiger Bay Estates Limited.
- 1.5 No reviews or formal licensing action has been taken in respect of this premises licence.
- 1.6 The premises licence currently permits:

- 1.9 The premises is located in the Edmonton Cumulative Impact Policy area, in accordance with the council's Licensing Policy Statement.

2.3 Each of the Responsible Authorities were consulted in respect of the application.

3.0 RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS:

3.1 **Licensing Authority** – Representation was received on behalf of the Licensing Authority, objecting to the extension of hours, under all four of the licensing objectives. The exception is that the Licensing Authority agree that the licensable activity, Performance of Dance can be added to the premises licence, as follows:

09:00 – midnight Sunday to Thursday

09:00 – 01:00am Friday & Saturday

A copy of the Licensing Authority representation can be found in Annex 3.

3.2 **Metropolitan Police** - Representation was received on behalf of the Metropolitan Police, objecting to the extension of hours, under all four of the licensing objectives. A copy of the Police representation can be found in Annex 4.

3.2 **Premises Licence Holder** – In response to the Licensing Authority's representation, the premises licence holder advised:

“We apologise for the 1st para in the operating schedule as this was inadvertently missed when editing the previous form. Whilst we understand that this application will now go for determination by the licensing committee, we would state that the current operation as food led venue with conditions to control noise, these premises will not undermine the licensing objectives.”

No other written representation has been received on behalf of Tiger Bay Estates Limited at the time this report was being prepared.

4.0 PROPOSED LICENCE CONDITIONS:

4.1 Conditions arising from this variation application is produced as Annex 5, which presents the conditions offered by the premises licence holder.

5.0 RELEVANT LAW, GUIDANCE & POLICIES:

5.1 The paragraphs below are extracted from either :

6.1.1 the Licensing Act 2003 ('Act'); or

6.1.2 the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State to the Home Office of April 2018 ('Guid'); or

6.1.3 the London Borough of Enfield's Licensing Policy Statement of January 2020 ('Pol').

General Principles :

5.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives [Act s.4(1)].

5.3 The licensing objectives are :

5.3.1 the prevention of crime and disorder;

5.3.2 public safety;

5.3.3 the prevention of public nuisance; &

5.3.4 the protection of children from harm [Act s.4(2)].

5.4 In carrying out its functions, the Sub-Committee must also have regard to :

5.4.1 the Council's licensing policy statement; [Pol]&

5.4.2 guidance issued by the Secretary of State [Act s.4(3)].[Guid]

Hours:

5.5 The Government acknowledges that different licensing strategies may be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in different areas. The 2003 Act gives the licensing authority power to make decisions about the hours during which premises can conduct licensable activities as part of the implementation of its licensing policy statement. Licensing authorities are best placed to make decisions about appropriate opening hours in their areas based on their local knowledge and in consultation with responsible authorities. However, licensing authorities must always consider each application and must not impose predetermined licensed opening hours, without giving individual consideration to the merits of each application.[Guid 10.13]

5.6 Where there are objections to an application to extend the hours during which licensable activities are to be carried on and the licensing authority determines that this would undermine the licensing objectives, it may reject the application or grant it with appropriate conditions and/or different hours from those requested. [Guid 10.14].

5.7 The Council will deal with licensing hours on the merits of each individual application, again, only if relevant representations are made and there is a hearing to consider them. Applicants are expected to provide details of the measures they intend to take in order to promote the Licensing Objectives. [Pol s.8.1].

5.8 The Council recognises that variable licensing hours for the sale of alcohol may be desirable to ensure that concentrations of customers leaving premises simultaneously are avoided. However, where this may lead to longer opening hours the Council also recognises the potential for additional crime and disorder and/or public nuisance that may arise. [Pol s.8.2].

5.9 However, there is no general assumption in favour of lengthening licensing hours and the four Licensing Objectives should be paramount considerations at all times. Where there are representations against an application and the

Sub-Committee believes that extending the licensing hours would undermine the Licensing Objectives, they may reject the application or grant it with appropriate conditions and/or different hours from those requested. [Pol s.8.3].

- 5.10 Stricter conditions with regard to licensing hours may be required for licensed premises situated in or immediately adjacent to residential areas to ensure that disturbance to local residents is avoided. This will particularly apply in circumstances where, having regard to the location, size and nature of the licensed premises, it is likely that disturbance will be caused to residents in the vicinity of the premises by concentrations of people leaving, particularly during normal night-time sleeping periods. It is accepted that applicants' operating schedules may adequately provide for such circumstances and the Council will not seek to impose stricter conditions unless relevant representations are received, and a hearing takes place. [Pol s.8.4].
- 5.11 The Council takes the view that persons under 18 may be at risk by late night access to premises primarily used for the sale and consumption of alcohol. In particular, exposure to late night drinking may encourage illegal drinking and detrimentally affect studies and work. [Pol s.8.5].

CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY [POLICY]

- 9.1 The Guidance provides that the cumulative impact of licensed premises on the promotion of the licensing objectives is a proper matter for a licensing authority to consider in developing its licensing policy statement. Cumulative impact means the potential impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives of a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area.
- 9.2 The steps to be followed in considering whether to adopt a special policy relating to cumulative impact within the council's statement of licensing policy are as follows:
- 9.2.1 Identify concern about crime and disorder or public nuisance;
- 9.2.2 Consider whether there is good evidence that crime and disorder or nuisance is happening and is caused by the customers of licensed premises or, that the risk of cumulative impact is imminent;
- 9.2.3 Identify the boundaries of the area where problems are occurring;
- 9.2.4 Consult those specified in section 5(3) of the Act, and subject to the outcome of the consultation, include and publish details of the cumulative impact within the licensing policy statement.
- 9.3 The effect of adopting a cumulative impact is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new premises licences or club premises certificates or variations that are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact will normally be refused, following relevant representations, unless the applicant can demonstrate in their operating schedule that there will be no negative cumulative impact on the licensing objectives.

Identifying Concern about Crime and Disorder or Public Nuisance

- 9.4 In 2009 the Council's Community Safety Service, in partnership with the Metropolitan Police, identified two areas where there was a positive correlation between the concentrations of licensed premises and the levels of anti-social behaviour and crimes of violence against the person. After due consideration, it was not considered appropriate at that time to adopt those areas as being subject to cumulative impact within the Council's licensing policy.
- 9.5 Further work by the Community Safety partnership and the police in 2012 led to the conclusion that the cumulative impact of a concentration of licensed premises in four areas of Enfield is undermining the promotion of the licensing objectives in those areas.
- 9.6 Police statistics are known to underestimate the numbers of alcohol related crime because of the high level of under reporting. Government estimates suggest that almost a half of all violent crime is alcohol related. But nationally the burden of alcohol related crime goes much wider than that, because alcohol related crime and drunken offenders place a huge burden on the police and other public services:
- 9.6.1 from approximately 10.30pm to 3am the majority of arrests are for alcohol-related offences;
- 9.6.2 there is the potential for routine incidents of public nuisance to escalate to more serious, especially violent, offences;
- 9.6.3 dealing with intoxicated offenders can be difficult and time consuming. For example, they may have to be kept in cells long enough to sober up; while they are there the police have a duty of care and have to ensure the offender does not come to harm by choking on their own vomit. The offender may have to be checked every 15 minutes. Medical attention may be necessary. Female offenders need female police officers to attend certain procedures who may have to be taken off other duties;
- 9.6.4 intoxicated prisoners can be disruptive, uncooperative and may present severe hygiene problems, urinating or defecating in their clothing during or after arrest.
- 9.7 All local authorities must fulfil their responsibilities under section 17 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 when carrying out their functions as licensing authorities under the Licensing Act 2003. Section 17 places a duty on local authorities and the police to do all they reasonably can to prevent crime and disorder in their area.
- 9.8 The Guidance states that the four licensing objectives are paramount considerations at all times. But the Guidance also identifies a number of other key aims and purposes which it says should be the principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work. They include 'the necessary protection of the public and local residents from crime, anti-social behaviour and noise nuisance caused by irresponsible licensed premises.

CUMULATIVE IMPACT POLICY

9.13 Any applications for new premises licences and/or club premises certificates and/or provisional statements and any applications for variations of those authorisations for hours within the limits set out below (referred to as Core Hours) for premises and/or clubs inside the cumulative impact policy areas will generally be granted, subject to consideration of any representations about the way in which the application will promote the licensing objectives.

9.14 Any applications for new premises licences and/or club premises certificates and/or provisional statements and any applications for variations of those authorisations for hours outside the limits set out below (referred to as Core Hours) for premises and/or clubs inside the cumulative impact policy areas will, when subject to relevant representations, be subject to the presumption against grant that is implicit in a cumulative impact policy.

9.15 Core Hours:

**9.15.1 Sale/supply of alcohol (off supplies only):
Monday to Sunday 08:00 to 24:00**

**9.15.2 Plays, Films, Indoor sporting events, Boxing or wrestling entertainments, Live music, Recorded music and/or Performance of dance:
Monday to Sunday 09:00 to 24:00**

**9.15.3 Sale/supply of alcohol (on supplies only or on & off supplies):
Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 24:00**

**9.15.4 Late night refreshment:
Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 24:00**

9.15.5 New Year's Eve: Any premises or club that is licensed for both the on supply of alcohol and for regulated entertainment may remain open and provide their licensed activities from the end of licensed hours on New Year's Eve to the start of licensed hours on New Year's Day.

6.0 DECISION:

6.1 As a matter of practice, licensing authorities should seek to focus the hearing on the steps considered appropriate to promote the particular licensing objective or objectives that have given rise to the specific representation and avoid straying into undisputed areas. A responsible authority or other person may choose to rely on their written representation. They may not add further representations to those disclosed to the applicant prior to the hearing, but they may expand on their existing representation

and should be allowed sufficient time to do so, within reasonable and practicable limits. [Guid 9.37].

- 6.2 In determining the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community, the Sub-Committee must give appropriate weight to:
 - 6.2.1 the steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives;
 - 6.2.2 the representations (including supporting information) presented by all the parties;
 - 6.2.3 the guidance; and
 - 6.2.4 its own statement of licensing policy [Guid 9.38].

- 6.3 Having heard all of the representations (from all parties) the Sub-Committee must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
 - 6.3.1 to grant the application subject to the mandatory conditions and such conditions as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives;
 - 6.3.2 to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - 6.3.3 to reject the application [Act s.18].

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

The Mandatory Conditions are attached and form part of the Operating Schedule of your licence/certificate. You must ensure that the operation of the licensed premises complies with the attached Mandatory Conditions as well as the Conditions in Annex 2 and Annex 3 (if applicable). Failure to do this can lead to prosecution or review of the licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2. CCTV shall be installed at the premises as follows:

(a) Cameras shall be sited to observe the entrance doors from both inside and outside.

(b) Cameras on the entrances shall capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.

(c) Cameras shall be sited to cover all areas to which the public have access including any outside smoking areas.

(d) Be able to provide a linked record of the date, time of any image.

(e) Be able to provide good quality images - colour during opening times.

(f) A monitor shall be in place to review images and recorded quality.

(g) The CCTV shall be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.

(h) A member of staff trained in operating CCTV shall be at the venue during times open to the public.

(i) Digital images shall be kept for 31 days.

(j) The equipment shall have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require.

(k) Copies of CCTV shall be made available to the Police within a reasonable.

3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:

(a) All crimes reported to the venue;

(b) All ejections of patrons;

(c) Any complaints received;

(d) Any incidents of disorder (reported or otherwise);

(e) Any faults in the CCTV system;

(f) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

4. The management shall make subjective assessments of noise levels outside at the perimeter of the premises approximately hourly from 22:00 to ensure that noise from the premises including the garden area, does not cause a disturbance to local residents.

- 5. A risk assessment must be conducted by the PLH/DPS as to what security will be needed for the amount of patrons on the premises during times of licensable activities**
- 6. At least one door supervisor shall remain directly outside the premises for 30 minutes after the premises has closed or until all customers have dispersed. All door supervisors (or marshals) shall be easily identifiable by wearing high visibility jackets or armbands.**
- 7. Security staff will be from a SIA registered company or recognised equivalent.**
- 8. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every six months) relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence.**
- 9. All training relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.**
- 10. A 'Think 25' proof of age scheme shall be operated, and relevant material shall be displayed at the premises.**
- 11. A record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall contain the date and time of the refusal, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year from the date of the last entry.**
- 12. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall regularly check the refusals system to ensure it is being consistently used by all staff.**
- 13. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.**
- 14. Signs shall be prominently displayed on the exit doors advising customers that the premises is in a Public Space Protection Order Area (or similar) and that they should not consume alcohol in the street if requested to stop by an authorised person. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where they can be read by those leaving the premises.**
- 15. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, is kept clean and free from litter at all material times to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.**

16. No deliveries shall be received between the hours of 19:00 and 07:00.
17. There shall be no removal of rubbish or glass bottles outside between 19.00 and 07.00.
18. Regulated entertainment shall not be provided in the smoking shelter.
19. No one under the age of 18 years shall be permitted in the smoking shelter.
20. Those under the age of 14 shall only be allowed inside the premises until midnight and only when accompanied by an adult.
21. No more than 5 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises after 22:30. The area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons and to ensure that they do not block the highway or cause a noise nuisance. Notices shall be displayed in the area specifying the terms of its use and asking patrons to use the area quietly.
22. There shall be no entry or re-entry of patrons to the premises after 11pm Sunday to Thursday and midnight on Friday and Saturday, except for those who have gone outside to smoke."
23. The premises shall have a written dispersal policy which includes that staff shall be outside of the venue when customers leave, directing and advising patrons to leave the area in a quiet and timely fashion so there is no obstruction and disorder. All staff shall be fully trained in the policy. This training shall be logged and records kept. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

2. No supply of alcohol may be made at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or the personal licence is suspended.
3. Every supply of alcohol under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
4. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

7. The responsible person must ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

8 (i) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

(ii) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 8(i) above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

(iii). Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

(iv). (1) Sub-paragraph 8(iv)(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8(ii)(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Supply of alcohol under a Club Premises Certificate

Suggest reworded as: Shutters shall be used to secure the premises when the premises is closed.

No other conditions are sought through this representation considering the existing conditions.

However, the Licensing Authority **object to the extension of hours across all activities (with the exception of performance of dance)** as the premises is situated in the Edmonton Cumulative Impact Policy area, as set out in the Council's Licensing Policy Statement. The policy states:

9.14 Any applications for ... for variations of those authorisations for hours outside the limits set out below (referred to as Core Hours) for premises ... inside the cumulative impact policy areas will, when subject to relevant representations, be subject to the presumption against grant that is implicit in a cumulative impact policy.

9.15 Core Hours:

This application is submitted by Tiger Bay Estates Ltd in regards to a variation of premises licence number LN/200501.

The police wish to make representations as we feel if the application is granted the following objectives will be undermined:

- **Protection of Children from Harm**
- **Prevention of Public Nuisance**
- **Prevention of Crime and Disorder**
- **Public Safety**

The proposed times and licensable activities applied for variation are as follows:

The application essentially extends terminal opening hours by a further 2 hours into weekdays and 2 hours at weekends, both into the small hours of the morning of the following days. Till 0230 hrs weekdays and 0330 hrs Friday and Saturday's .Essentially only allowing for a 4.5 hour break in trading weekdays and 3.5 hours weekends.

Venue location

These premises are is situated on the corner of what is in essence a residential street ,there are residential houses all around and it would be safe to say it is embedded within residential properties .There are other licenced premises within the vicinity but non with terminal times as late as applied for .

The previous premises known as "the picture palace "(taking its name from the fact historically this was a cinema) was a public house. All the residential properties are within earshot of these premises taking into consideration the licenced activities of recorded music, Performance of dance and films have been applied for with terminal times extending into the small hours of the morning both weekdays and weekends .

The London Borough of Enfield's statement of licensing policy 6th Edition 28 Jan 2020 is very plain in regards to extended licensing hours within residential areas and states thus,

"8.4 Stricter conditions with regard to licensing hours may be required for licensed premises situated in or immediately adjacent to residential areas to ensure that disturbance to local residents is avoided. This will particularly apply in circumstances where, having regard to the location, size and nature of the licensed premises, it is likely that disturbance will be caused to residents in the vicinity of the premises by concentrations of people leaving, particularly during normal night-time sleeping periods. It is accepted that applicants' operating schedules may adequately provide for such circumstances and the Council will not seek to impose stricter conditions unless relevant representations are received, and a hearing takes place".

No other licenced premises within this geographical area have terminal hours as late /early as this application with the vast majority with terminal times of 11pm on weekdays, We the police therefore feel that if these hours were granted there would be a real possibility that **public nuisance** and possibly anti-social behaviour coupled with alcohol fuelled crime in the form of violence may proliferate by patrons leaving the premises and eating and drinking in outdoor spaces up until 3:30 am on weekends and also up until 2:30 am on what is for most a work day morning

Additionally these premises are situated within the London Borough of Enfield's Cumulative impact zone and as stated within the statement of Licensing Policy (6th Edition 28 Jan 2020) applications for extensions to terminal and licensing hours for premises that fall within the permit of the CIZ and that fall outside of the laid down "core hours ", with submission of relevant representations, there will be a presumption against granting the application.

In order to avoid any doubt the statement states thus,

9.14 Any applications for new premises licences and/or club premises certificates and/or provisional statements and any applications for variations of those authorisations for hours outside the limits set out below (referred to as Core Hours) for premises and/or clubs inside the cumulative impact policy areas will, when subject to relevant representations, be subject to the presumption against grant that is implicit in a cumulative impact policy.

9.15 Core Hours:

9.15.1 Sale/supply of alcohol (off supplies only): **Monday to Sunday 08:00 to 24:00** 9.15.2 Plays, Films, Indoor sporting events, Boxing or wrestling entertainments, Live music,

Recorded music and/or Performance of dance: **Monday to Sunday 09:00 to 24:00**

9.15.3 Sale/supply of alcohol (on supplies only or on & off supplies): **Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 24:00**

9.15.4 Late night refreshment: **Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 24:00"**

We acknowledge the applicants operating schedule however it cannot completely eradicate the risk to public nuisance caused at 3am and later in the early mornings given that other premises will have closed several hours earlier.

We therefore object in entirety to the submitted timings and terminal times and think they are excessive given the geographic location and the proximity to residents and we propose that the stipulated terminal times as laid down within the Enfield statement of licensing Policy Paragraphs 9.14 to 9.15.4 (above) be applied to this application, **we are mindful of the fact that the current licence hours do exceed stipulated Core Hours of a CIZ** ergo we feel not only are the current hours sufficient but also possibly excessive given the fact this is a CIZ location.

In summary

We the Police **object** to the applications on the grounds stated the applicant clearly has not considered the London Borough of Enfield's Statement of licensing Policy when submitting this application Nor Considered the guidance written pertaining to Cumulative Impact Zones and the more stringent responsibilities incumbent upon

licenced premises situated within such zones. We therefor hold no faith in this applicant's ability to effectively uphold the licensing objectives.

Conditions Arising from Variation Application

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

The Mandatory Conditions are attached and form part of the Operating Schedule of your licence/certificate. You must ensure that the operation of the licensed premises complies with the attached Mandatory Conditions as well as the Conditions in Annex 2 and Annex 3 (if applicable). Failure to do this can lead to prosecution or review of the licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

1. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

2. CCTV shall be installed at the premises as follows:
 - (a) Cameras shall be sited to observe the entrance doors from both inside and outside.
 - (b) Cameras on the entrances shall capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
 - (c) Cameras shall be sited to cover all areas to which the public have access including any outside smoking areas.
 - (d) Be able to provide a linked record of the date, time of any image.
 - (e) Be able to provide good quality images - colour during opening times.
 - (f) A monitor shall be in place to review images and recorded quality.
 - (g) The CCTV shall be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention.
 - (h) A member of staff trained in operating CCTV shall be at the venue during times open to the public.
 - (i) Digital images shall be kept for 31 days.
 - (j) The equipment shall have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that Police can make an evidential copy of the data they require.
 - (k) Copies of CCTV shall be made available to the Police within a reasonable.

3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) All crimes reported to the venue;
- (b) All ejections of patrons;
- (c) Any complaints received;
- (d) Any incidents of disorder (reported or otherwise);
- (e) Any faults in the CCTV system;
- (f) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

4. The management shall make subjective assessments of noise levels outside at the perimeter of the premises approximately hourly from 22:00 to ensure that noise from the premises including the garden area, does not cause a disturbance to local residents.

5. A risk assessment must be conducted by the PLH/DPS as to what security will be needed for the amount of patrons on the premises during times of licensable activities

6. At least one door supervisor shall remain directly outside the premises for 30 minutes after the premises has closed or until all customers have dispersed. All door supervisors (or marshals) shall be easily identifiable by wearing high visibility jackets or armbands.

7. Security staff will be from a SIA registered company or recognised equivalent.

~~8. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every six months) relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence.~~

~~9. All training relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.~~

~~10. A 'Think 25' proof of age scheme shall be operated, and relevant material shall be displayed at the premises.~~

11. A record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall contain the date and time of the refusal, a description of the customer, the name of the staff member who refused the sale, and the reason the sale was refused. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year from the date of the last entry.

12. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall regularly check the refusals system to ensure it is being consistently used by all staff.

13. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.

14. Signs shall be prominently displayed on the exit doors advising customers that the premises is in a Public Space Protection Order Area (or similar) and that they should not consume alcohol in the street if requested to stop by an authorised person. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where they can be read by those leaving the premises.

15. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, is kept clean and free from litter at all material times to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

16. No deliveries shall be received between the hours of 19:00 and 07:00.

17. There shall be no removal of rubbish or glass bottles outside between 19.00 and 07.00.

18. Regulated entertainment shall not be provided in the smoking shelter.

19. No one under the age of 18 years shall be permitted in the smoking shelter.

~~20. Those under the age of 14 shall only be allowed inside the premises until midnight and only when accompanied by an adult.~~

21. No more than 5 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the front of the premises after 22:30. The area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons and to ensure that they do not block the highway or cause a noise nuisance. Notices shall be displayed in the area specifying the terms of its use and asking patrons to use the area quietly.

~~22. There shall be no entry or re-entry of patrons to the premises after 11pm Sunday to Thursday and midnight on Friday and Saturday, except for those who have gone outside to smoke.~~

23. The premises shall have a written dispersal policy which includes that staff shall be outside of the venue when customers leave, directing and advising patrons to leave the area in a quiet and timely fashion so there is no obstruction and disorder. All staff shall be fully trained in the policy. This training shall be logged and records kept. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

PROPOSED BY THE PREMISES LICENCE HOLDER:

24. Shutters shall be used to secure the premises when the premises is closed.

AGREED BY LICENSING AUTHORITY

25. No regulated entertainment shall be provided in the smoking shelter after 23:00.

NOT AGREED BY LICENSING AUTHORITY, CONDITION 18 ABOVE STATES NO REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT IN THE SMOKING SHELTER AT ANY TIME, AND THIS IS STILL SOUGHT TO BE APPLIED TO THE LICENCE.

26. Under 18's shall only be permitted to remain on the premises if accompanied and supervised by an adult after 9pm.

THIS SHOULD REPLACE CONDITION 20 ABOVE AS CONTRADICTS THAT CONDITION.

27. A 'Challenge 25' policy shall be implemented where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a photo driving licence, passport, PASS accredited proof of age card or military ID card, and relevant material shall be displayed at the premises.

THIS CONDITION WOULD REPLACE CONDITION 10.

28. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every six months) relating to the sale of alcohol, including checking ID is authentic, and the times and conditions of the premises licence.

THIS CONDITION WOULD REPLACE CONDITION 8.

29. All training relating to the sale of alcohol, including checking ID is authentic, and the times and conditions of the premises licence shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.

THIS CONDITION WOULD REPLACE CONDITION 9.

30. There shall be no entry or re-entry of patrons to the premises after Midnight on Sunday to Thursday and 0100 on Friday and Saturday, except for those who have gone outside to smoke.

THIS CONDITION WOULD REPLACE CONDITION 22 BUT IS NOT AGREED BY THE RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES.
