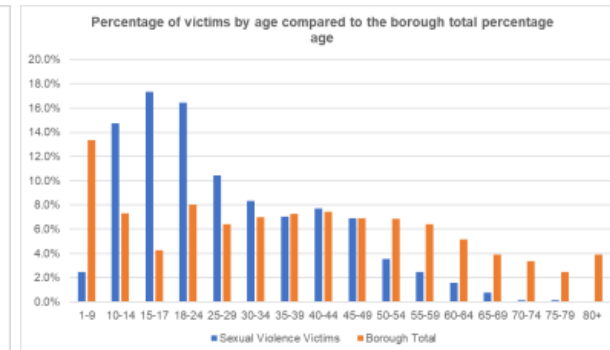
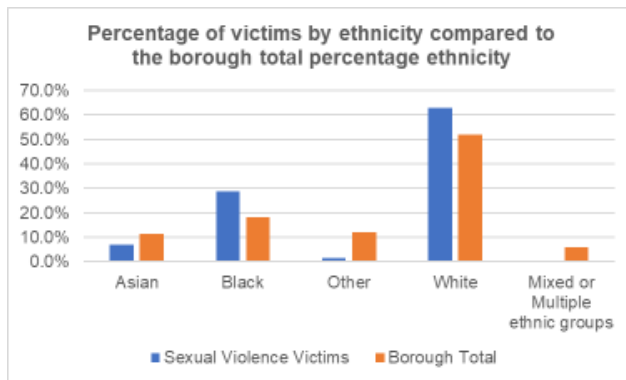
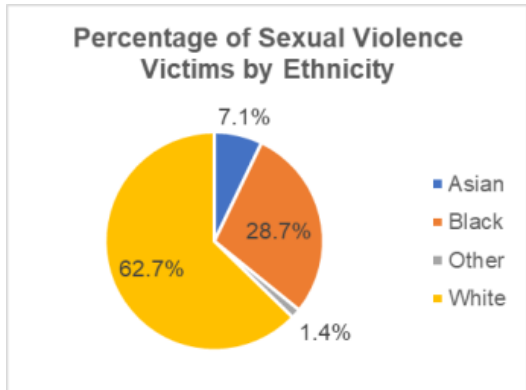

Sexual Violence Demographics - Victims



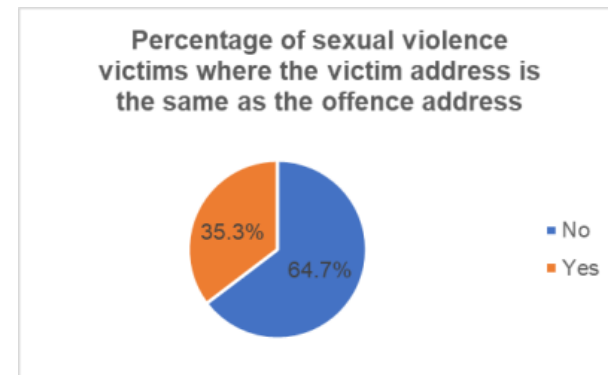
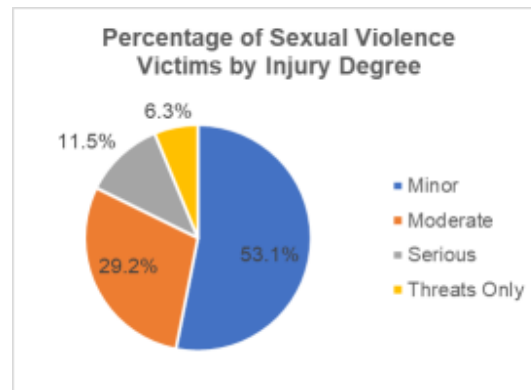
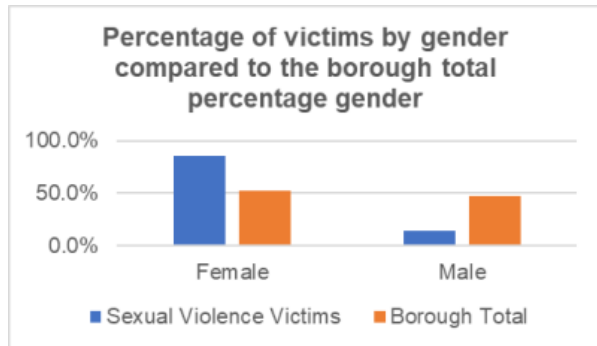
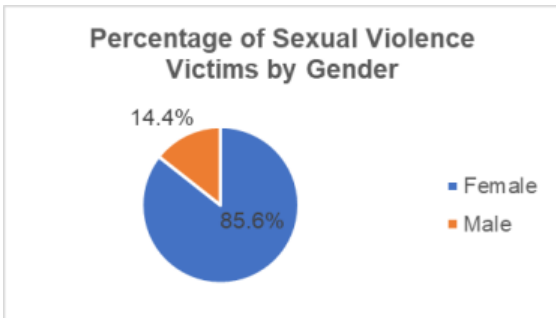
62.7% of victims of sexual violence in Enfield were white ethnicity. This is higher than the percentage of white ethnicity in Enfield (52.1%)

The majority of victims of sexual violence are in younger age groups. This is at a much higher level than the percentage of younger age groups within the borough.



Most victims of sexual violence in Enfield were female (85.6%). This is proportionately higher than the percentage of females in Enfield (52.3%)

Of those that disclosed, just over half (53.1%) of victims of sexual violence disclosed a minor injury. Most offences occurred outside of the victim's address.

Sexual Violence Demographics - Suspects



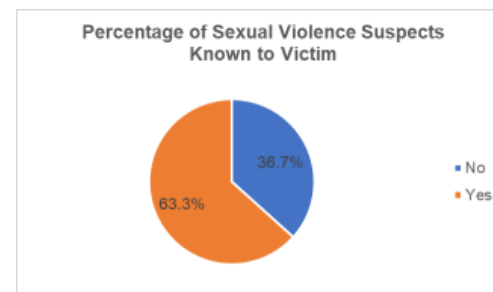
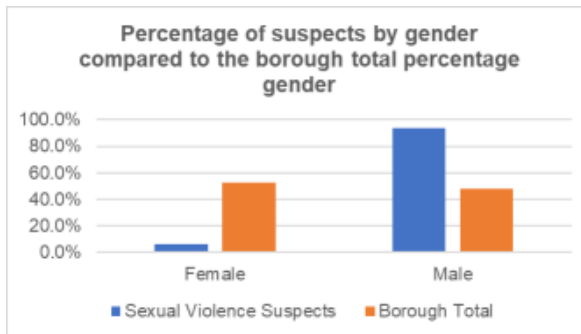
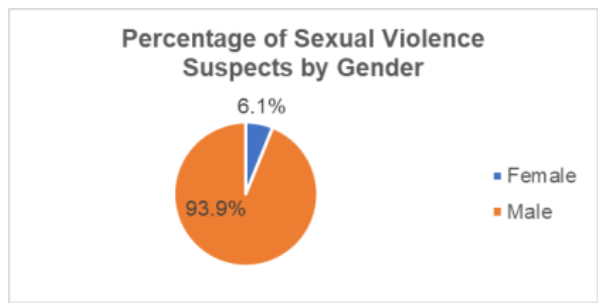
Just over half of sexual violence suspects are of white ethnicity (53.3%). This is overrepresented slightly when compared to the white ethnicity of the borough (52.1%).

15.0% of sexual violence suspects are aged between 18 and 24 years. This is a significantly higher representation when compared to the population of 18-24 year olds in the borough (8.0%).



93.9% of suspects of sexual violence offences are male. This is significantly higher than the proportion of males in the borough (47.7%).

Most suspects of sexual violence offences are known to the victim (63.3%). Of those suspects that were known to the victim, the table below demonstrates the top 10 relationships they had to the victim. 20.9% of suspects were defined as an acquaintance of the victim.

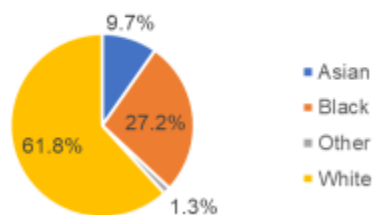
Domestic Violence Demographics - Victims



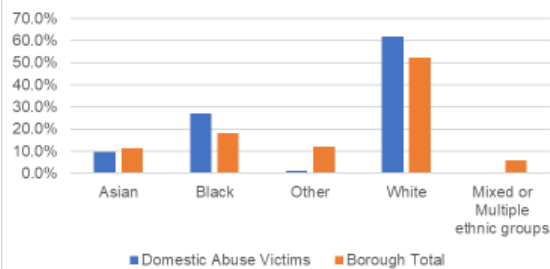
Most victims with a flagged domestic abuse offence were of white ethnicity (61.8%). This is higher than the white ethnicity in Enfield (52.1%)

16.4% of victims with a flagged domestic abuse offences were aged 18 to 24 years. This is much higher than the percentage of 18-24 year olds in the borough (8.0%). There are less domestic abuse victims identified in the older age brackets.

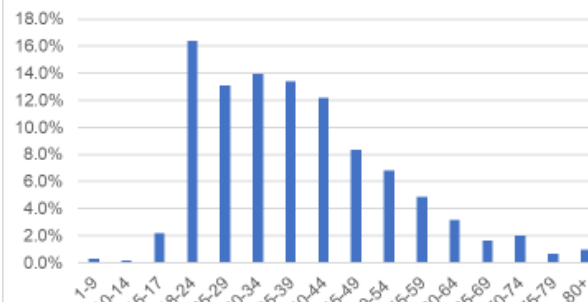
Percentage of Domestic Abuse Victims by Ethnicity



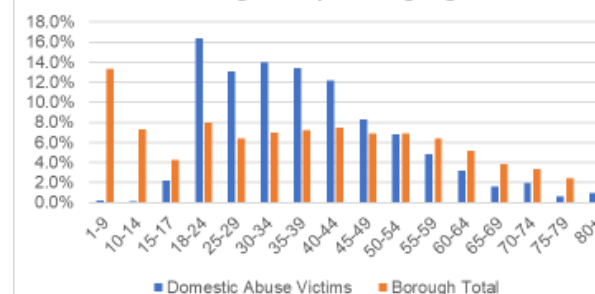
Percentage of victims by ethnicity compared to the borough total percentage ethnicity



Percentage of Domestic Abuse Victims by Age



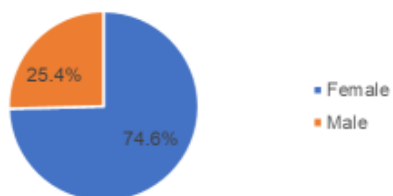
Percentage of victims by age compared to the borough total percentage age



Most victims with a flagged domestic abuse offence were female (74.6%). This is an over representation when compared to the percentage of females in the borough (52.3%).

Most domestic abuse victims who disclosed an injury type reported a minor injury (65.4%). The majority of domestic abuse victims lived at the same address where the offence took place (73.8%).

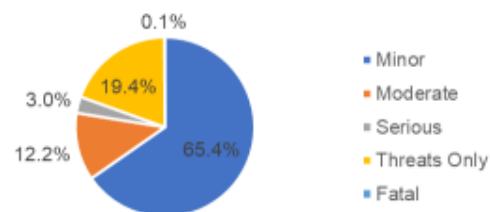
Percentage of Domestic Abuse Victims by Gender



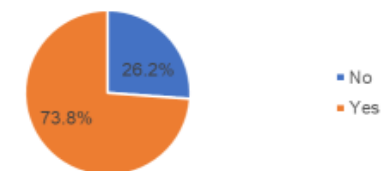
Percentage of victims by gender compared to the borough total percentage gender

Percentage of domestic abuse victims where the victim address is the same as the offence address



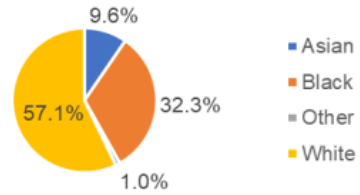

Domestic Violence Demographics - Suspects

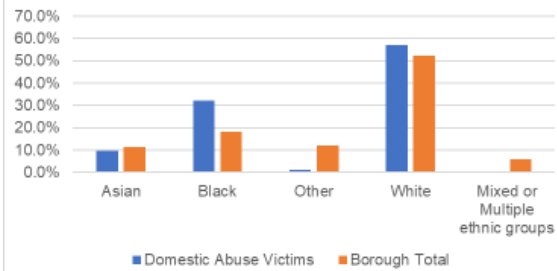


Over half of sexual violence suspects are of white ethnicity (57.1%). This percentage is slightly higher when compared to the white ethnicity of the borough (52.1%).

Percentage of Domestic Abuse Suspects by Ethnicity

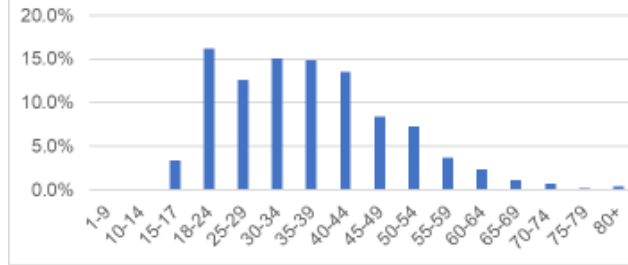


Percentage of suspects by ethnicity compared to the borough total percentage ethnicity

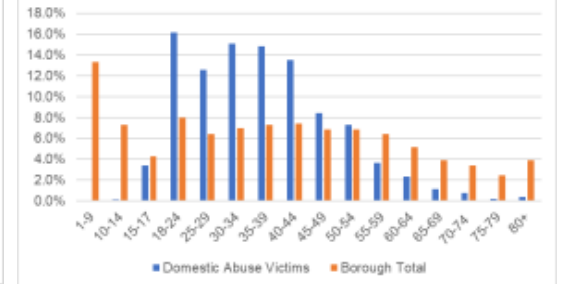


16.2% of domestic abuse suspects were aged 18 to 24 years old. The percentage of suspects in the younger age bandings are much higher than the borough population in these age bandings. Conversely there is a much higher percentage of older aged individuals in the borough compared to those identified as a domestic abuse suspect.

Percentage of Domestic Abuse Suspects by Age

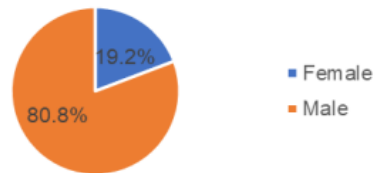


Percentage of suspects by age compared to the borough total percentage age

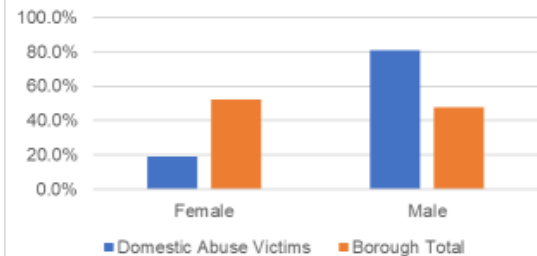


Most suspects of domestic abuse flagged offences are male (80.8%). This is a much higher representation when compared to the percentage of males within the borough (47.7%).

Percentage of Domestic Abuse Suspects by Gender

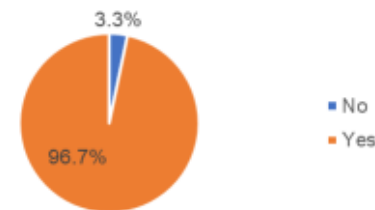


Percentage of suspects by gender compared to the borough total percentage gender



The majority of suspects are known to the victim (96.7%). The table identifies the top 10 relationships that the suspect had to the victim with 25.4% of suspects were the ex-boyfriend of the victim.

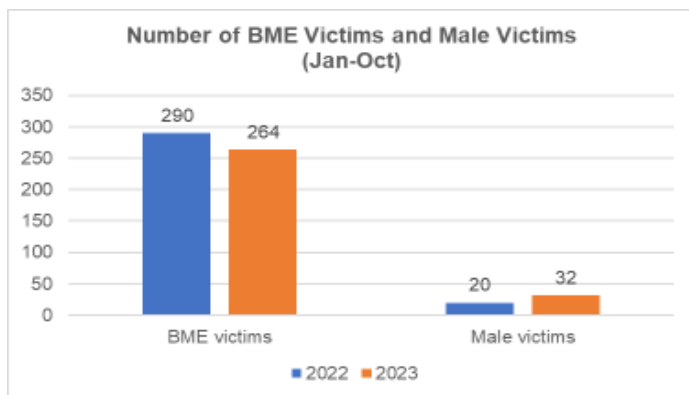

Enfield MARAC Performance

- Between January and October 2023, there have been 264 cases discussed at MARAC where a victim was from a black and minority ethnic community (9.0% decrease on the same period the previous year). There have also been 32 cases discussed where the victim was male (60% increase on the same period the previous year).



Note: The BME data may not be a true representation as this information is collected by what is disclosed in the referral forms.

Independent Domestic Violence Advocate Referrals

- In the most recent year up to October 2023, Solace has received 735 referrals. This is a 5.6% decrease on the number of referrals reported in the same period the previous year (779 cases January – October 2022).
- In the most recent year up to October 2023, Victim Support has received 498 referrals. This is a 26.7% decrease on the number of referrals reported in the same period the previous year (679 cases January – October 2022).
