EXISTING CONDITIONS

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendations made : (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) where the film has been classified by that Board; or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20 (3) (b) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.
4. Immediately before each exhibition of a film passed by the British Board of Film Classification there shall be exhibited on a screen for at least five seconds in such a manner as to be easily read by all persons in the auditorium a reproduction of the certificate of the Board or, as regards a trailer advertising a film, of the statement approved by the Board indicating the classification of the film.
5. Where the licence includes a condition that individuals are required to carry out any security activity at specified times at the premises each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

6. With the exception of Amusement with Prizes Machines, there shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
7. The forecourt shall be monitored by management to assess noise levels.
8. An effective counting system shall be employed to ensure the capacity limit is not exceeded.
9. If a disc jockey is used on any night, then he/she shall ask customers to leave quietly.
10. Free drinking water shall be available at all times.
11. Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks shall be available for sale at all times.

12. All loose bolts, bars, padlocks, and chains are to be removed from the exit doors whilst the premises are open to the public.
13. All moveable external seating shall be removed, where practicable, by 23:00.
14. At least one door supervisor shall remain at the main door of the premises for a period of 30 minutes after the premises has closed, to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of patrons.
15. Signs shall be prominently displayed on the exit doors and immediately outside the premises in the outside seating area advising patrons that the premises are in a 'Drinking Control Area' and that alcohol should not be taken off the outside seating area and consumed in the street.
16. A risk assessment shall be carried out to establish the maximum number of persons that may be safely permitted on the premises.
17. When children are allowed on the premises any entertainment offered shall be suitable for young persons.
18. The premises must be fitted with a digital Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system, which must conform to the following points: (1) The CCTV equipment must operate to the satisfaction of the Police; (2) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors both inside and outside, the bar areas, all floor areas including the function room and stairs leading to it; (3) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification; (4) Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen; (5) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (8) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (11) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (12) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (13) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation; (14) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (15) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (16) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.
19. A noise-limiting device shall be installed to any amplification equipment in use on the premises. The noise-limiting device shall be maintained in effective working order and set to interrupt the electrical supply to any amplifier should the volume of the music be audible at the perimeter of the premises.

20. Signs shall be displayed in all toilets throughout the premises warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.
21. Air-conditioning shall be installed within the upstairs function room to enable all windows to remain closed during any musical entertainment.
22. Toilets shall be inspected for any sign of drugs use or anti social behaviour an average of hourly from 21:00 hours until the premises close each night the premises are open. Written records will be kept of all toilet inspections which shall be kept for 28 days. These records shall be made available to the Police and the Local Authority on request.
23. A daily log shall be kept to ensure all conditions on the premises licence are adhered to. This log will be signed by the person carrying out this activity and monitored regularly by the management who shall also sign the log.
24. One member of staff shall be situated in the front garden area and one in the rear car park area from 03:00 until 03:45 on Saturday and Sunday mornings, to ensure noise levels are kept to a minimum.

REQUESTED BY METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE :

25. A maximum of 15 patrons shall be allowed in the front garden area after 23:00 in a clearly marked designated smoking area. The designated area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons so as to not cause noise nuisance. Notices shall be displayed in the area requiring patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to use the area quietly.
26. There shall be no new entry to the premises after 01:00.
27. Separate lines for new entrants and smokers seeking access shall be maintained.
28. Management shall maintain a good working relationship with the local Safer Neighbourhood Team.
29. A monitored alarm system to EU 50131 must be installed at the premises.

REQUESTED BY TRADING STANDARDS SERVICE :

30. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits, the car park and front garden area requesting patrons respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly.
31. Supervisory staff shall ensure that patrons do not remain in the external drinking area to the front of the premises after 23:00, except to enter or leave the premises. An exception to this is that after this time a maximum of 10 smokers at any one time shall be permitted in a designated smoking area situated at the front of the premises. This area shall be cordoned off and clearly sign posted as the smoking area.

32. Supervisory staff shall ensure that patrons do not remain in the external drinking area to the rear of the premises after 23:00.
33. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the Police and recorded in an incident logbook.
34. When regulated entertainment is provided a member of staff shall carry out noise assessments outside of the premises every hour and records shall be kept of the times, dates and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for a minimum of 6 months. Staff shall be trained in the action to take if they believe the premises may be causing a disturbance to local residents.
35. A minimum of two door supervisors shall be employed on the ground floor of the premises during regulated entertainment. The duties of these staff will include the supervision of persons leaving and entering the premises to ensure that this is achieved without causing nuisance to local residents. A further two door supervisors shall be employed at times when the first floor function suite is in use.
36. Records of pre-booked functions including the name and contact details of the person hiring the function room shall be kept for a minimum of 28 days.
37. The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.
38. During regulated entertainment all external windows and doors shall be kept closed but not locked, except for access and egress. The exception to this shall be the front left entrance doors where either the inner or outer lobby door shall be kept closed.
39. Children under 18 years old shall be allowed to attend regulated entertainment events without being accompanied by an adult if alcohol is prohibited from such events.
40. Drinks shall not be allowed outside after 23:00.
41. All staff involved in alcohol sales must receive induction and refresher training, relating to the sale of alcohol.
42. All training shall be documented and records kept for 12 months. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.
43. From 23:00 a door supervisor shall monitor the outside smoking area to ensure that those using the smoking area do not create a noise disturbance to local residents.
44. Any children on the premises must be there for the purpose of consuming a substantial table meal and be accompanied by an adult or be attending a private function in an area that has been hired out for that purpose.

45. Children shall not be permitted on the ground floor of the premises after 23:00 in any case.
46. Bottles shall not be disposed off outside the premises between 21:00 – 07:00.
