1 LICENSING HISTORY & CURRENT POSITION

- 1.1 On 30 November 2007 an application by Mr Hamid Darbandi for a new Premises Licence, which was not subject to any representations, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.2 On 10 January 2013 an application by **Zed 1 Enterprises Limited** for transfer of the Premises Licence, which was not subject to a representation from the Police, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.3 The current Premises Licence permits:
- 1.3.1 **Hours the premises are open to the public**: Sunday to Saturday from 06:00 to 00:00.
- 1.3.2 Late night refreshment: Sunday to Saturday from 23:00 to 00:00.
- 1.4 A copy of a location map of the premises is attached as Annex 01.
- 1.5 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached as Annex 02.

2 THIS APPLICATION :

- Application is made by **Zed 1 Enterprises Limited** to vary the Premises Licence. The application seeks:
- 2.1.1 Hours the premises are open to the public: Sunday to Thursday from 05:00 to 01:00 the following day and on Friday and Saturday from 05:00 to 02:00 the following day.
- 2.1.2 **Late night refreshment**: Sunday to Thursday from 23:00 to 01:00 the following day and on Friday and Saturday from 23:00 to 02:00 the following day.
- 2.2 The application was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.3 Each of the Responsible Authorities were consulted in respect of the application.
- A copy of the application is attached as Annex 03.

3 RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS:

- 3.1 **Metropolitan Police**: Representation is made, against the application, on the grounds of the prevention of crime & disorder and the prevention of public nuisance licensing objectives.
- 3.1.1 A copy of the representation is attached as Annex 04.
- Licensing Authority (including Licensing Enforcement, Environmental Health, Trading Standards, Planning, Health & Safety and Children's Services): Representation is made, against the application, on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective.

- 5.13.2 to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- 5.13.3 to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor:
- 5.13.4 to reject the application [Act s.18].

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2. The footpath immediately; outside the front of the premises shall be kept clear of litter.
- 3. Parties for children shall not take place during the hours of late-night refreshment.
- The premises must be fitted with a digital Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system, which must conform to the following points: (1) If the CCTV equipment is inoperative or not working to the satisfaction of the Police or Licensing Authority, the premises shall not be used for licensable activities unless with prior agreement from the Police; (2) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors both inside and outside, the counter areas and floor areas; (3) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification - not less then 120% of screen; (4) Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less then 50% of screen; (5) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (6) They must be capable of detection i.e. not less than 10% of screen; (7) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (8) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (9) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (10) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (11) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (12) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (13) Record images as near to real time as possible; (14) Recorded images must be of sufficient quality that persons can be identified from the recorded pictures as well as the live view; (15) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (16) Comply with the Data Protection Act (DPA) and any applicable British Security Industry Association (BSIA) codes of practice; (17) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation; (18) Be operated by the correct procedures, to ensure an evidence trail is recorded and can be retrieved for evidential purposes; (19) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (20) Checks should be frequently undertaken to ensure that the equipment performs properly and that all the cameras are operational and a log kept; (21) The medium on which the images have been recorded should not be used when it has become apparent that the quality of the images has deteriorated; (22) Access to recorded images should be restricted to those staff that need to have access in order to achieve the purposes of using the equipment; (23) All access to the medium on which the images are recorded should be documented; (24) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (25) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to


ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request; (26) Disclosure of the recorded images to third parties should only be made in limited and prescribed circumstances, law enforcement agencies, Prosecution agencies, relevant legal representatives and people whose images have been recorded and retained.


- 5. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 6. Staff shall be sufficiently trained, to discourage patrons from congregating around the outside of the premises and from bringing open alcoholic drinks into the restaurant to consume with their meal.

- 9.22 Any applications for new premises licences and/or club premises certificates and/or provisional statements and any applications for variations of those authorisations for hours <u>outside</u> the limits set out (referred to as Core Hours) for premises and/or clubs inside the cumulative impact policy areas will, when

subject to relevant representations, be subject to the presumption against grant that is implicit in a cumulative impact policy.

Council records show the following history in relation to this premises:

11/09/10 – Licensing Enforcement Officers visited the premises. Licensed until 00:00 but till trading at 00:20. Shift Manager stated he has worked there for over a year and they have always closed at 01:00 on Friday and Saturday. Advised to close - done while we were there, variation application and offence notice issued.

13/09/10 - Phoned premises and spoke to Assistant Manager who was aware of the visit and confirmed papers had been past to the premises licence holder. Reiterated advise re licence and also advised re TENs and checking planning permission times. Advised more observations will be carried out. He confirmed that there had been a misunderstanding and that they are now closing at 00:00.

18/09/10 - Licensing Enforcement Officers visited the premises at 00:21 - closed.

Planning Information:

Permission for change of use from A1 to A3 was granted on 16/08/1989. Subsequent variation to the original consent regarding the condition governing opening hours have

taken the times from 06:00 to 00:00 seven days a week (granted 02/01/2005) to 05:00 to 01:00 Sundays to Thursdays and 05:00 to 02:00 Fridays and Saturdays (granted 22/03/2013). All permissions are for a limited period of one year only - at the end of the year if no new application is made the opening times revert to the last permission granted.

Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP)

This premises is located in the Edmonton Cumulative Impact Policy Area.

The CIP came into force in April 2012 and relates to all new and variation applications and states that the core hours granted for this type of premises in this particular location should not exceed the following:

Late night refreshment:

Mon - Sun 23:00 - 24:00

Indoors only

The hours applied for exceed those of specified in the CIP.

Where the hours applied for exceed those specified in the CIP there is a presumption that the application will be refused.

In summary I wish to make representation on the following:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

I believe that extending the hours of this premises, which is located in an area where there are already a large number of licensed premises will have a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

In line with the Council's CIP and to ensure that local residents are not disturbed I object to the applied for hours in their entirety. However, If this application were granted in full or part, I would recommend the following conditions be attached to the licence to promote the licensing objectives. These conditions are in addition to the proposed conditions in Annex 2 as indicated.

Statement regarding Cumulative Impact

- 1. This statement seeks to address the special policy in effect in relation to the Edmonton Cumulative Impact Policy Area. This provides that there will be a presumption against allowing fast-food restaurants to operate beyond midnight in that area.
 - 2. The Home Office Guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states that ".....applicants should give consideration to potential cumulative impact issues issues when setting out the steps they will take to promote the licensing objectives.....". This indicates that careful thought has been given to cumulative impacts and why the licensing authority can be confident that if the variation applied for is granted, it will not be "likely to add to the existing cumulative impact".
 - 3. The Edmonton Cumulative Impact Policy Area was designated based on statistics showing that there were a significant number of crimes (particularly alcohol-related crimes) occurring between 11pm and 3am and there was also public nuisance caused by noise from "intoxicated revellers".

Public Nuisance

- 4. This restaurant has been operating until midnight since around November 2007 and there have not been any complaints about noise generated by McDonald's. No representations have been made against this application by any local residents.
- 5. The representation submitted by the Police mentions the fact that the Licensing Officer has a general concern that the operation of

the premises during the extended hours <u>may</u> disturb residents but has provided no evidence that these premises are causing a problem. The data provided in the Licensing statement shows that most noise complaints within the Cumulative Impact Area relate to daytime and in particular mention the hours around 8pm, with very few noise complaints during the proposed extended hours of operation.

- 6. In addition, with regard to noise, it should be noted that McDonald's Restaurants do not serve alcohol and this restaurant has a strict policy not to allow customers to bring any open containers of alcoholic drinks onto the premises.
- 7. The doors of the restaurant are self-closing and there is a sufficient degree of sound insulation to prevent noise from within the premises being audible outside.
- 8. The primary potential for any additional noise generation would therefore be the possibility of customers congregating outside the restaurant. In relation to this, the restaurant already successfully operates a policy to prevent customers from congregating outside the store and to disperse those who do.
- 9. If Police assistance is required for any reason, staff are trained to give details and descriptions of any difficult customers to the operator.
- 10. Zed1 Enterprises Limited take their responsibilities to prevent public nuisance extremely seriously. The restaurant already takes active steps to prevent the generation of litter and it goes further to actively help to reduce and remove litter from other sources in addition to their own. McDonald's are constantly taking steps to reduce the amount of packaging of their products. All packaging carries the "bin-it" symbol to encourage customers to dispose of

their litter responsibly. Clearly marked bins are located in the dining area including at the exit of the restaurant. This restaurant currently operates litter patrols three times daily in the area near to the restaurant and this can be increased if the application is granted.

Crime & Disorder

- 11. McDonald's take reasonable steps to ensure that the restaurant is safe for customers and free from the threat of crime.
- 12. The restaurant has a strict zero tolerance policy relating to behaviour that threatens or disturbs staff and customers.
- 13. There is no crockery, metal or glass tableware that could be used to harm others.
- 14. The restaurant has an extensive CCTV system within the premises and signage is displayed notifying customers of this.

Public Safety

- 15. The premises will comply with all fire safety regulations.
- 16. All Shift Managers are trained in First Aid.

Protection of Children from harm

17. It is not anticipated that this application raises any concerns regarding the protection of children from harm.

Conclusion

The Applicant does not anticipate that the granting of this application will undermine any of the licensing objectives.

The Licensing Authority is therefore respectfully requested to arrange a hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee in the usual way so that the application can be considered further and brought to a conclusion.
