Club 303 Conditions

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Where the licence includes a condition that individuals are required to carry out any security activity at specified times at the premises each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

4. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
5. The licence holder shall ensure that at all material times there shall be at least one suitably trained first-aider on duty at the premises.
6. A CCTV system shall be installed, operated and maintained at the premises. The system shall :
 - (1) The system must be a digital system;
 - (2) If the CCTV equipment is inoperative or not working to the satisfaction of the Police or Licensing Authority, the premises shall not be used for licensable activities unless with prior agreement from the Police;
 - (3) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance doors both inside and outside and all areas required by Police;
 - (4) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification - not less than 120% of screen;
 - (5) Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of screen;
 - (6) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises. They must be capable of detection i.e. not less than 10% of screen;
 - (7) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed;
 - (8) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image;
 - (9) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times;
 - (10) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises;
 - (11) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet;
 - (12) Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality;
 - (13) Record images as near to real time as possible;
 - (14) Recorded images must be of sufficient quality that persons can be identified from the recorded pictures as well as the live view;
 - (15) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention;
 - (16) Comply with the Data Protection Act (DPA) and any applicable British Security Industry Association (BSIA) codes of practice;
 - (17) Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation;
 - (18) Be operated by the correct procedures, to ensure an evidence trail is recorded and can be retrieved for evidential purposes;
 - (19) Digital images must be kept for 31 days;
 - (20) Checks should be frequently undertaken to ensure that the equipment performs properly and that all the cameras are operational and a log kept;
 - (21) The medium on which the images have been recorded should not be used when it has become apparent that the quality of the images has deteriorated;
 - (22) Access to recorded images should be restricted to those staff that need to have access in order to achieve the purposes of using the equipment;
 - (23) All access to the medium on which the images are recorded should be documented;
 - (24) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time;
 - (25) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request;
 - (26) Disclosure of the recorded images to third parties should only be made in limited and prescribed circumstances, law enforcement agencies, Prosecution agencies, relevant legal representatives and people whose images have been recorded and retained.
7. An alarm system (to EU50131) that incorporates a panic-button facility shall be installed and maintained at the premises.
8. The cloakroom at the premises shall be operated so as to assist the swift return of coats, particularly in the period prior to closing time.
9. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises. The notices shall be positioned at eye-level and in a location where they can be read by persons leaving the premises. The notices shall state "Customers are asked to respect the needs of local residents and to leave these premises and the area quietly."

10. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises. The notices shall be positioned at eye-level and in a location where they can be read by persons leaving the premises. The notices shall state "Drinks cannot be taken outside the premises."
11. Deliveries shall not be accepted at the premises other than between the hours of 09:00 and 20:00 each day.
12. The premises licence holder shall provide and maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence, which shall be provided to the Licensing Authority and any local residents on request. Any change to the number shall be notified to the Licensing Authority within seven days of the change.
13. A record shall be kept specifying the date of any regulated entertainment that takes place at the premises including the name, address and telephone number of the person/s who promoted and organised the entertainment.
14. Public transport information (including night-time travel options) shall be available to customers at the premises. The telephone number of an allocated taxi firm shall be displayed within the premises.
15. At least two door supervisors shall remain directly outside the premises until all patrons have left to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of patrons.
16. At the conclusion of all entertainment events a suitably worded announcement shall be made, requesting customers to behave in a quiet manner whilst they are leaving the premises.
17. The premises licence holder shall ensure that the pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including the gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, is kept clean and free from litter at all material times to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.
18. Notices shall be clearly displayed at each public entrance to the premises detailing the policy on admission and searching at the premises.
19. The noise limiter shall be recalibrated annually to ensure that the music volume does not exceed the level at which a noise nuisance to neighbours will occur. A copy of the calibration certificate shall be kept on the premises and made available to the Police or Council Officer on request.
20. All doors and windows shall be kept closed but not locked during regulated entertainment, with the exception on entry and egress.
21. Drinking vessels shall be made of toughened glass or plastic and shall be designed not to have a sharp edge when broken.
22. All refuse and bottles shall be disposed of in bins quietly so as not to disturb neighbours or local residents. There shall be no disposal of glass bottles outside between 23:00 and 07:00.
23. Wall mounted ashtrays shall be provided outside the premises.
24. Incidents shall be logged and recorded in a logbook at the premises.
25. All door staff employed must be from contractors that appear on the Security Industry Authority's Register of Approved Contractors.
26. The designated premises supervisor or a member of the management shall monthly, check their door supervisors registration on the Security Industry Authority (SIA) website to ensure their licences are current. Written records of these checks shall be maintained, signed and dated by the person completing the checks. The records shall be kept for 12 months and made available to Police or the local authority upon reasonable request.
27. The management shall provide to the Police Licensing Officer the name, stage name, address and date of birth of all resident disc jockeys (DJs) employed at the premises and at all times that there is a change to the resident DJ's.
28. A sign shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises informing customers of the closing time and last time of entry to the premises.
29. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a member of the management shall personally monitor the actions and observations of the security staff at frequent intervals to ensure that searches are being properly carried out.
30. A minimum of six door supervisors shall be employed on the premises from the commencement of regulated entertainment until closing.
31. (1) All members of staff including door supervisors must enter their names in the Staff Register Book. All door supervisors must enter their SIA badge number and the company that they are employed by. These records shall be dated and made available to the Police and/or council upon request. All records shall be retained for a minimum of one year; (2) All door supervisors will enter the time they start and finish their shifts into the Staff Register Book; (3) Door supervisors will ensure fire exits are kept clear of real and potential hazards at all times; (4) Door supervisors will take it in turns to patrol the toilets every hour whilst the premises are open and to sign the toilet checklist to this effect; (5) Door supervisors will monitor the smoking area and car park on a regular

basis to ensure that no noise nuisance is being created; (6) Door supervisors will ensure that no alcohol is taken outside of the premises and that there is no smoking inside of the premises; (7) Under 18's shall not be allowed on the premises at anytime whilst the premises is open for licensable activities; (8) Search policies must be adopted and implemented by the door supervisors. This policy shall include, but is not limited to : (a) Female door supervisors shall be engaged to search hand bags, and female patrons; (b) Any drugs or weapons, found or confiscated must be handed into the police as soon as is practicable; (c) Door supervisors must ensure that only one person is permitted in the toilet cubicles at any one time. (Toilets, Attracts, Drugs!); (d) All patrons must be searched before entering the premises; (e) Hand held search wands and/or search arches shall be utilized at the point of entry to the club; (f) To remove from the premises any person found using drugs; (g) Trained in emergency procedures; (h) Refuse entry and re-entry after the last permitted time; (i) Use clickers to ensure capacity not breached; (j) Display the clubs entry and search policy at front of premises; (k) Door Supervisors will display their SIA badges at all time during their working shift; (l) Door supervisors will be identifiable at all times - reflective jackets or reflective armbands; (m) All staff will be made aware of the entry policy - i.e. over 18, over 21, over 25; (n) Keep a record of any drugs / weapons seized as well as any found during toilet checks; (o) Ensure customers leave the premises quietly without causing a disturbance or any ASB; (p) All staff will sign to show they have read and understand this policy.

32. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a personal licence holder shall be at the premises whenever licensable activities take place.

33. All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every 3 months) in the safe and efficient running of the premises.

34. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol must receive induction and refresher training (at least every 3 months), relating to the sale of alcohol. All training shall be documented and records kept. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

35. The maximum number of persons on the premises at any one time shall not exceed 250.

36. Management and door supervisors shall encourage those leaving the premises to do so quietly.

37. Toilets at the premises shall be checked for any sign of illegal drug use an average of every hour and a record shall be kept of the times, dates and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for one year. Records shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or police, upon reasonable request.

38. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises, including in all the toilets, warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.

39. A noise limiting device shall be installed to any amplification equipment in use on the premises and shall be maintained in effective working order. The noise limiter should be set so that noise does not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

40. A written record of refused sales must be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. Records must be kept for one year, and must be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request.

41. The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.

42. No more than 15 smokers to be permitted in the outside smoking area at any one time. A door supervisor must monitor this area at all times.

43. No drinks to be taken into the smoking area at any time.

44. A personal licence holder is to be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol, throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.

45. The management at approximately hourly intervals shall make subjective assessments of noise levels whilst regulated entertainment is provided. The assessments should take place at the site boundary and at least as far as the residential properties at the junction of Green Street with Brimsdown Avenue. This is to ensure that noise from the premises does not cause disturbance to local residents. Records shall be kept of the times, dates, location of checks and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for one year. Records shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or police, upon request. Where monitoring by management identifies that noise from the premises is a disturbance at the premises boundary or Green Street/Brimsdown Avenue junction, measures shall be taken to reduce this i.e. turning the volume down.

46. When the premises are used for regulated entertainment there shall be no admission or readmission after 01:00.

A007 - Meeting MFX 27/11/2013

Comment **I attended a meeting on Tuesday 26th November 2013 at Club 303 with the proposed new PLH/DPS Mr Aydogan Islamoglu and the new leaseholder Mr Guladi Coskun to discuss the conditions on the licence before the club reopens.**

Mr Islamoglu stated that they intended to open this Saturday (30/11/13) for a booking taken by the previous owners. Mr Islamoglu stated that it was a promoted event due to finish at 06:00. I explained that the club was only licensed until 03:00 and closed at 03:30 and that no application had been made for a temporary event notice to cover the event either. Mr Islamoglu stated that he would contact the promoter and inform him that the event would have to finish earlier.

I also explained that the last entry time of 01:00 should be adhered to and that any security engaged should be via the approved contractor scheme on the SIA website. Mr Islamoglu stated that he intended to engage Trojan Security (UK) LTD as his security team. I told Mr Islamoglu that I knew the company and did not believe them to have approved contractor status. I have since checked on the SIA website and can confirm that they do not hold the approved contractor status.

I explained to Mr Islamoglu that any paperwork required to be displayed at the club along with training manuals can be downloaded via the councils website and agreed to forward on to him the link.

I then told Mr Islamoglu that I expected all conditions to be complied with before the club opens and that I would arrange a visit to ensure compliance.

I contacted the security company (OM Security) that was originally proposed when this club reopened and spoke to the managing director, Jay Jagatia, Mr Jagatia stated that his company does not work for any premises in the borough of Enfield and has never covered Club 303.

I then spoke to the PLH/DPS Mr Aydemir Aydogan re this issue and he confirmed that he was using in house security despite the condition regarding approved contractors.

Mr Aydogan stated that he had tyried to contact me about OM Security because they let him down on the first week they opened and he had to use Trojan security instead and has since been using his own security staff instead.

I explained that this was a breach of his licence and that the only way he can use other companies was to vary that particular condition on his licence and until such time it was varied, he would have to abide by the approved contractor comdition.

I asked Mr Aydogan to contact me with details of any new approved contractor security company engaged before the club next opens.

Further to our telephone conversation on Monday 20th January 2014, I would like to confirm that you fully understand your responsibilities as the premises licence holder and designated premises supervisor for Club 303 in relation to door supervisors and from whom they are engaged.

The following condition is on your licence;

25. All door staff employed must be from contractors that appear on the Security Industry Authority's Register of Approved Contractors.

As previously discussed, you must have door staff that are employed by an approved contractor on the SIA list before the club next opens. This condition was part of the licence when you transferred it in to your name. I went through all of the conditions on the licence with you in person on Tuesday 26th November 2013 before you reopened the club and discussed this condition in particular.

To reiterate our conversation, you cannot employ your own door staff or engage a company not on the SIA's list of approved contractors, as this would be in breach of your licence and may well result in the serving of a section 19 closure Notice with powers as set out below;

The Criminal Justice and Police Act originally gave the police powers to close unlicensed premises. The Licensing Act 2003 extended this to allow them and local authority staff to put outlets operating in breach of their licensing conditions on notice that they will be closed unless the illegal behaviour is stopped.

Please contact me at your earliest convenience to update me with details of any new door company employed. I will of course contact them to confirm that they have been engaged.

Lastly, if you feel that this condition is too much of an imposition on the licence, you are free to submit an application to vary the licence. Until such an application has been submitted and approved, you will still have to abide by all conditions currently held on the licence for the club.

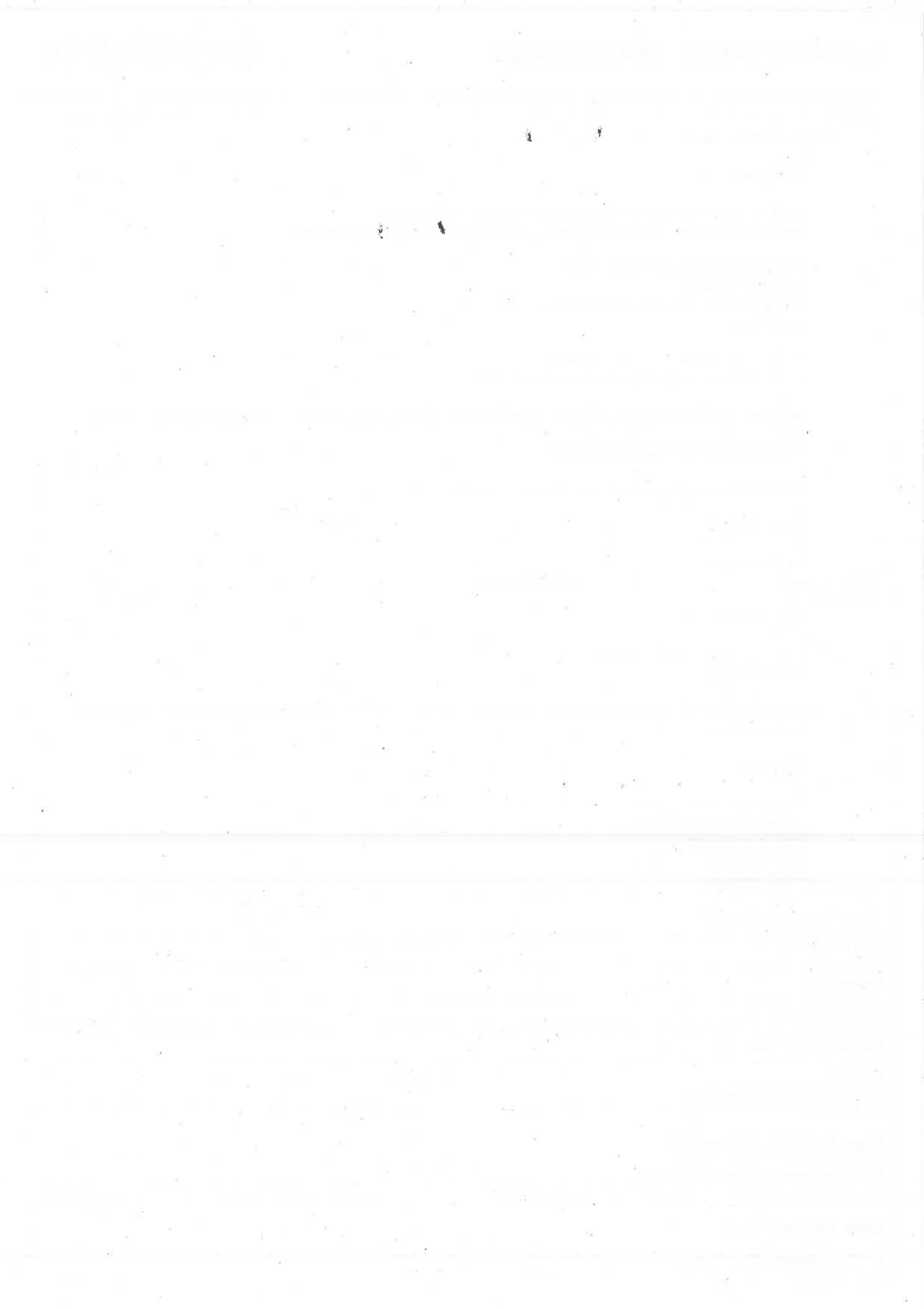

On Saturday the 1st February 2014 at 0525hours I was on duty in full uniform in company with PC 336YE Bowen in a marked Police vehicle call sign YE22 Nights driven by PC Bowen .When we received a call to attend Club 303 situated in Jute Lane ,Enfield,EN3 to a call of 30 people fighting inside the club some believed armed with weapons .We arrived at approximately 0535 hours where I saw large crowds of people emptying out of the club and some people running from the club .Other officers arrived and we received more calls to people fighting inside the club with a report of a male receiving CPR inside .Due to the urgency of the situation despite the fact we only had around 8 officers present we entered the club where I saw numerous security staff standing around seemingly inactive whilst a large crowd of people had gathered in the foyer of the club directly opposite the entrance to the dance floor and club area .I pushed my way through the crowd towards the main club area door as I did so I noticed several males aggressively turn towards me and shout "Don't Fucking push me" ,I sensed the aggression in the air and could see several males standing close to one another square on as if to ready themselves to fight .I was standing in the immediate area of the club entrance/Dance area facing towards the foyer when a white male aged around 26 years old wearing a grey Dark T Shirt a male whom I now know as [] pushed passed officers into the dance floor area .He was swearing but I could not make out exactly what he said .I heard PC 668YE Debnam shout at the male to get back into the foyer .Upon hearing this I took hold of [] left arm and guided him back into the foyer .He pulled his left arm back in an attempt to shrug me off as he was taken back into the foyer .I looked into the dance area just in order to check there was no one requiring our assistance when I heard behind me a sound of a loud disturbance and fight with male voices shouting "Fuck off you cunts".I turned and walked back into the foyer where I saw PC 167YE Dellar and another officer struggling to detain a male as he fought them. I could also see PC 668YE Debnam and PC 477YE Robinson struggling with the male [] PC Robinson had hold of the males right arm and PC Debnam was struggling to hold his left arm . [] appeared to be struggling to get to the other male being detained by PC Dellar and at one point appeared to gain ground towards them .He was within 8 feet of PC Dellar .Fearing PC Dellar would get attacked I

quickly joined PC Robinson and Debnam and immediately grabbed [REDACTED] upper clothing around the neck and shoulder area ,Using my weight and my right arm to drag him backwards away from PC Dellar into a corner of the foyer next to a gaming machine .I could hear many other people nearby shouting and screaming at us and see many people starting to fight .I helped take [REDACTED] to the floor where after a brief struggle to get his hands behind his back with PC Robinson and Debnam he was handcuffed whilst resisting in the rear stacked position .Once he was detained I got to my feet and looked towards the entrance door to the club .Other officers were still struggling to detain prisoners .I saw a group of around 8 men walk towards us with fists clenched walking with a purpose and shouting “ lets fucking have it” again fearing for both myself and my colleagues safety and in order to prevent the group from getting to others being detained I upholstered my taser ,Drew it and engaged the safety catch to off illuminating the red laser and pointing the laser onto the chest of an unknown male advancing towards me .I shouted “ get back Police with taser

before I could finish my sentence I heard a security staff member shout at the males saying “get out before you get tasered man” .The group immediately retreated back to the entrance stopping their advance .I then turned my red dot off and re holstered my taser .I called for an ambulance for one of the males detained and updated control as to the situation .After a short time the two detained males were taken out and placed in Police transport and the rest of the club dispersed .The security staff did not help in any way and I observed them standing back sometimes mingling with trouble makers .They did not appear to detain or stop any violence within the club .I remained close by until Inspector Skinner attended and issued a closure notice upon the club .We all then left .

On Saturday 01st February 2014 I was on duty in full uniform in the company of Pc EWART 277YE as a driver of a marked police vehicle, call sign YE22 (N). At about 0525 hours we responded to a call to attend Club 303 on Jute Lane EN3, where there were reports of 30 people fighting at the location. We arrived at the location about 10 minutes later. Other units were on scene outside the club including Pc ROBINSON 477YE, PC CLARKE 248YE, PC ASSER 222YE, PC DEBNAM 668YE, PC WALE 365YE and PC DELLAR 167YE. There were large groups of excitable males leaving the club. I was told by bouncers of the club that there was fighting going on inside and a male needed CPR. We decided to enter the club, as we entered the foyer area I could see that there were numerous males who were drunk and dishelved. I then saw Pc WALE 365YE detaining a male, the male was an IC1, slim build, with short hair, other officers including Pc ROBINSON and DEBNAM 668YE were attempting to control the male who was attempting to escape and was swearing and shouting. I made my way to wards the club doors and saw that the main club was emptying. Another IC1 male then appeared and was attempted to get towards the other male being detained, he was throwing his arms around with force, Pc DELLAR 167YE, Pc CLARKE 248YE and Pc ASSER 222YE were attempting to control this male, he looked in a rage and there was blood on his face. I could hear shouting from the main door; I turned around and saw a group of drunken males, approximately 5 to 10 in number. These males were attempting to get to the males being detained behind us. I saw an IC1 male as part of this group, he was F600, medium build, he was grinding his teeth shouting "lets fucking have it to" to me. I shouted to the male to stand back, other males were also shouting towards us, they started to come forward, I was aware PC EWART 277YE had withdrew his TASER. I saw the male in the grey jumper coming towards me with fists clenched. I withdrew my TASER and conducted a red dot challenge on the male's chest, giving verbal commands to him to "stay back" and explained the red dot was from a TASER. I feared that if this male and group were to continue there behaviour that one of my colleagues would be seriously injured. They area of the incident was small and there were people coming into it from all directions. One of the security staff shouted TASER, the group retreated to the other side of the door, I then put my TASER into a high profile position until they left and re holstered it. I then turned to assist Pc DELLAR 167YE who was attempting to handcuff a male on the floor; the male was bleeding from his nose and was calling DELLAR a "fucking CUNT". I was then made aware of a male approaching Pc WALE 365YE with a bottle in his hand, I stopped the male and removed the bottle from his hand, a blonde female member of staff then started to shout at myself and other officers "you're fucking too late, I these ones" the female was immediately told to leave the area and a male ushered her into a cupboard. Although numerous security staff were present, they did not attempt to stop the group of males attempting to get to officers whilst assisting with disorder. The male who was said to need CPR was found safe and well, he did not as reported require medical treatment.

I walked in + started to make my way to the entrance of the bar area + suddenly lots of males were coming out. suddenly a male came out who I know to be [redacted]. I turned round + said to PC 4774C Rounson "That's [redacted]" HE was with another larger male wearing a Gilet. All of a sudden I could see OFFICERS struggling with a male who I know to be [redacted] + then the male that I had previously seen in the female toilet bending down was struggling with PC 1674C + PC 2484C Clarke. They ended up bringing him to the floor just where I was standing near to the main entrance of the bar. This male was still struggling so I placed my whole weight on his legs. As I looked up to my left I could see OFFICERS PC 4774C + PC 3654C struggling with [redacted]. As I looked the male with the Gilet was standing over them + he was holding a bottle of budweiser. I said out "Get the bottle off of him"

As I believed + feared that he might of used it on officers. At this point PC 3364C removed it from him. A member of staff a female, blond was shouting "you've got the wrong people, let them go." She too appeared to be leaning over by the officers + [REDACTED]. PC 3364C appeared when we were with this white male + assisted PC 1671C in handcuffing him. This male was bleeding from his face. He was still shouting + swearing, however it was incoherent. The ambulance crew arrived + assisted with his injuries. At this point I was aware that PC 1671C had arrested him. I then became aware that [REDACTED] was wanted for failing to appear + was arrested by PC 3654C wife. I could see that there was lots of fresh blood from where PC 1671C prisoner was restrained. 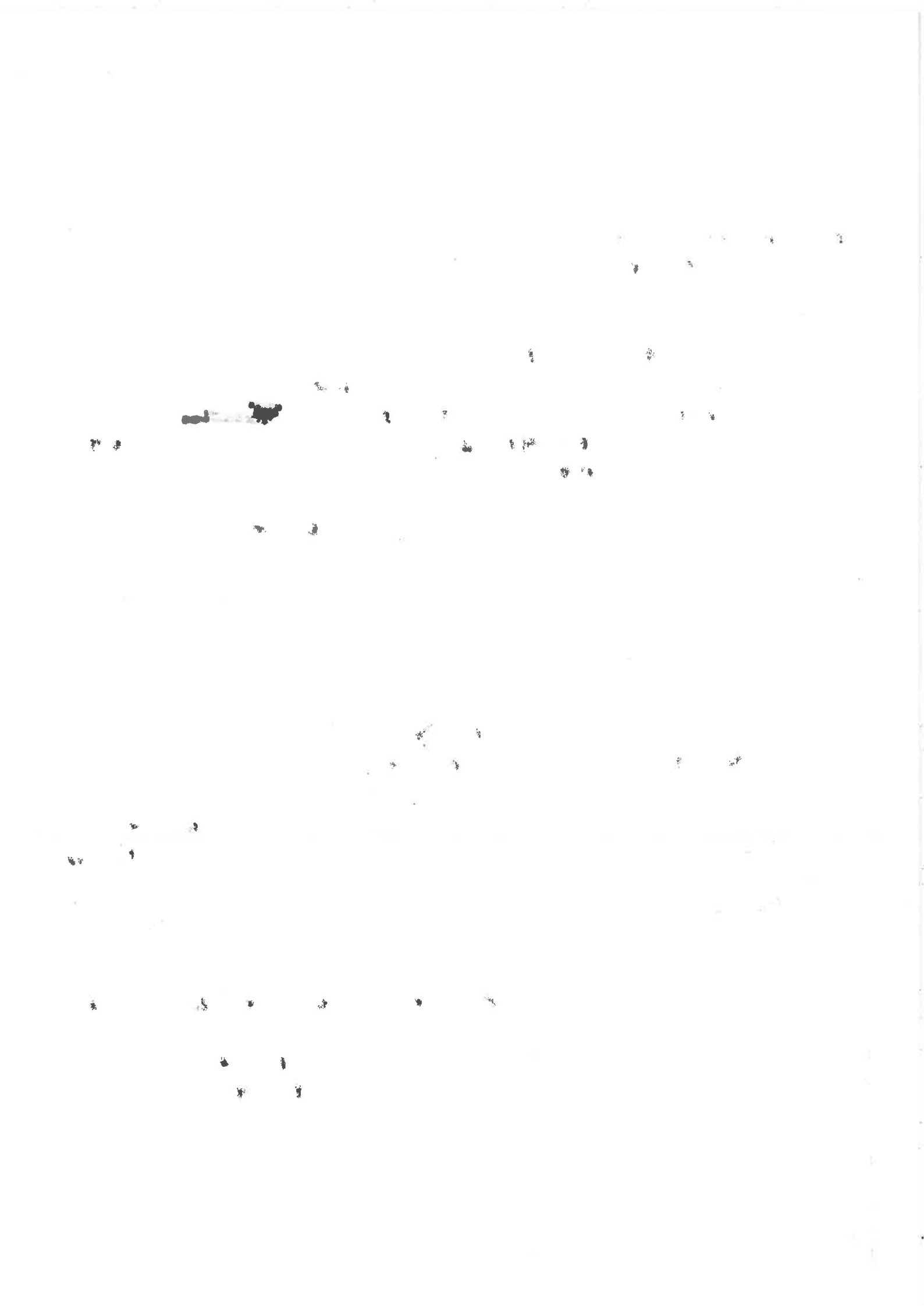

On Saturday 1st February 2014 I was on duty in uniform in a marked police vehicle call sign YE21N with PC Clarke 248YE.

At approximately 0525 hours CAD 1981/01FEB14 was circulated via the P.R stating that a member of public had called in regarding a fight at Club 303 Jute Lane, Enfield, EN3.

On hearing this we stated we would attend and made our way.

I was aware other police units were attending.


After a short while we attended the location which is a night club in a warehouse type building on an industrial estate next to Brimsdown Railway station.

On arrival I saw a number of people and vehicles outside the location hanging around. There were a mixture of MALEs and FEMALEs and most of them appeared to be stumbling around as if they were drunk.

We got out of our vehicle and at this point I saw two other police units were on scene. I approached a MALE who appeared to be a member of the clubs security and asked him if there was any issues at the location. He advised us that there was a fight inside the club with a number of unknown people. On hearing this for our own safety we waited until a couple more police units joined us. After approximately two minutes I saw some more police units pull up at our location and we decided to enter the club to assist in stopping this fight and identify any victims or suspects regarding this matter.

On entering the foyer of the club which was about four metres wide by 2 metres long in size a large number of people were exiting the club from what appeared to be the main hall to the left of the foyer. These were mainly MALEs and I noticed that a number of them had blood marks on their clothing and some looked dishevelled and drunk and it appeared that a number of them had been involved in some sort of disturbance. I noticed two IC1 MALEs one of whom was washing his face in a sink in what appeared to be a disabled toilet with the door wide open which was situated to the right of the foyer next to a cloakroom.

As I walked in to this foyer I noticed there was a large amount of liquid all over the wooden floor which made the

floor extremely slippery and unstable as I walked.

Whilst the people were exiting the main hall I began to walk to the main hall to see who was in it. As I approached the hall a small IC1 MALE who I immediately recognised to be ~~PC 167YE~~ dob ~~1982~~ walked out of the main hall very swiftly and walked passed me. On recognising ~~PC 167YE~~ I was aware he was wanted for failing to appear at court so I turned to approach him and stop him as he had now passed me and was approaching the exit door very quickly. At this point I saw that PC Wale had stood in front of him and was attempting to speak to him. I was aware that PC Wale had stopped ~~PC 167YE~~ a day or two ago and that believed he was confirming this was ~~PC 167YE~~ in order to arrest him for being wanted.

As I approached them I heard PC Wale say to ~~PC 167YE~~ that he recognised him as being ~~PC 167YE~~ and in response to this ~~PC 167YE~~ replied by stating he was wrong and that he was ~~PC 167YE~~.

PC Wale pointed out that he was wanted for an offence at which point ~~PC 167YE~~ reacted to this by attempting to get past PC Wale towards the door.

At this point knowing that ~~PC 167YE~~ was wanted and believing he was trying to make off I took hold of his left arm with my right hand to prevent him making off with the intention of arresting him for this offence. As soon as I took hold of his arm he began pulling away from me and violently jumping up and down, jerking away from me and trying to loosen my grip to get away. Because of this I grabbed his left arm with my left hand as well to ensure he could not get away.

At this point there was a large number of people in the foyer including persons that appeared to be staff as well as customers.

PC Wale initially assisted me in trying to detain ~~PC 167YE~~ to arrest him however people from the foyer began trying to step in and were attempting to assist ~~PC 167YE~~ in getting away by pulling at ~~PC 167YE~~, myself and PC Wale and shouting abuse at us. Because of this PC Wale then turned to this group and attempted to stop them assisting ~~PC 167YE~~.

~~PC 167YE~~ continued violently jumping around trying his best to get away from my grip. Whilst he was doing this I kept hold of his arm but was getting pulled around myself by him and other people in the club and also slipping around on the wet floor.

I tried to pull him away from the exit door and into the main hall but as I was trying to do this I noticed some of the other officers including PC Dellar 167YE and PC Clarke were struggling with a MALE who I now know to be ~~PC 167YE~~ dob ~~1982~~. I believed ~~PC 167YE~~ was one of the two MALEs in the disabled toilet washing his face when we entered the foyer and recognised him as being the first person who tried to prevent me from keeping hold of ~~PC 167YE~~ by trying to get in between us when I initially took hold of him.

Whilst struggling with ~~PC 167YE~~ I could not believe his strength for such a small person and believed at this point he was under the influence of drugs being cocaine or speed which was helping him pull at me with such force and jump about so excitedly without tiring.

I lost my grip on him with my left hand a number of times and was unable to access my handcuffs in order to handcuff him to help detain him more easily.

Whilst he continued to struggle a large amount of people continued to pass us exiting the club and also shouting abuse at us and trying to involve themselves.

At this point every attempt I made to either pull ██████ to the floor or place him against a wall to try and secure him better to then handcuff him and effect an arrest had failed and I was beginning to get tired.

Fearing that I was going to let go of him at any moment and believing he would either assault me or make off if I let go I then shouted for an officer to help me handcuff him.

At this point PC Debnam 668YE joined me and with her assistance ██████ was placed on the floor and once secure on the floor he was handcuffed in a rear stack.

Once he was secured I tried to explain to him that he was wanted but there was still a lot of commotion going on in the foyer and I was unable to explain the situation.

After a short while things calmed down a bit. At this point we got ██████ up on to his feet and checked the tightness of his handcuffs and double locked them.

PC Wale then joined us and informed ██████ that he knew him to be ██████ and that he was aware he was wanted for breach of court order. ██████ again stated that we were wrong and that he was ██████

Because of this in order to confirm his identity I got one of the police officers with us to obtain the mobile ID fingerprint machine from my vehicle. This was obtained and I obtained his fingerprints on the machine and this confirmed we were correct and that he was ██████. A PNC check was conducted and this confirmed he was wanted for breach of court order on 13/09/13 at St Albans Crown Court and was not backed for bail.

At this point at 0554 hours PC Wale arrested and fully cautioned him for this offence.

No reply was made to caution.


I was also aware at this stage that ██████ had been arrested for affray for his behaviour towards the officers and his attempts to prevent us detaining and arresting ██████.

We then escorted him out of the club in order to place him in a police van to escort him to custody.


Once outside the club and at the rear of a police van PC Wale searched ██████ under S.32 PACE whilst I kept hold of him. During this search I saw that PC Wale had taken a wrapped up twenty pound note out of ██████ jeans money pocket. As he produced this he asked ██████ what was wrapped up in it and ██████ responded by saying it was cocaine and it was for personal use.

On discovering this at 0600 hours PC Wale further arrested ██████ for possession of class A drugs namely cocaine.

No reply to caution.

██████ was placed in the van and conveyed to Wood Green custody where on arrival the arrest facts were relayed to the custody Sergeant and detention authorised. Custody reference- 01 YD/843/14.

I am Police const [redacted] E Jason Dellar of the Metropolitan police currently stationed at [redacted] Edmonton police station. On Saturday the 01st of February 2014 I was on duty in full uniform as the operator of a marked police Car Y3N in company with Pc 365YE Ben Wale the driver of the vehicle also in full uniform. At about 05.25 hrs we received a call to "Club 303" Jute Lane Enfield to a report of a large fight at the location involving 30 plus males Cad 1981 Refers. We accepted the call along with numerous other units and made our way to the location whilst en route I was aware that I99 were above the venue and they informed CCR that people were milling around outside, we also received further information that a fight was taking part inside the venue and a male was reported to be inside the club receiving CPR, due to this information an ambulance was requested over the radio to attend the location. On arrival at the club Pc Wale parked the car close to the club and we walked over towards the entrance where several other marked units were waiting close by. On speaking with my colleagues I was advised that there was a large fight inside the club mainly between white males, some of which were believed to be Irish males and some English approximately 20 to 30 of them still fighting. One male had a bad head injury who had been assisted by staff as he fell unconscious. I was also advised that security staff required our assistance as they were trying to clear the club as the males were still fighting inside. Myself, along with Pc Clarke 248YE 167YE, PC ROBINSON 477YE, PC WALE 365YE, PC EWART 277YE, PC BOWEN 336YE and other officers made our way into the club to assist the security staff in clearing the venue and breaking up the fight. When we went into the club there was a small reception area approximately 30 Foot long and about 12 foot wide, which had a lot of males standing around.

I noticed that some of the males had blood on them and there was a clear sign of disturbance and a fight had taken place.

As I was standing in the reception area people were slowly coming out and making their way to the exit. A lot of the males were heavily intoxicated and were being abusive as they were coming out. In the reception area were the doors leading to the toilets. The floor was extremely wet and which I believed it to be alcohol making it very slippery. All of a Sudden I saw PC Wale and Pc Robinson start to struggle with a male who was leaving the club close to the main entrance. I could hear him shouting and swearing. This caused numerous other IC1 males to start pushing forward and trying to get to Police officers and the male was struggling with Pc Wale and Robinson. At this point an IC1 male, with short brown hair of slim build wearing a black shiny jacket and Dark jeans, who I now know to be [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED] come out of the toilet adjacent to the main entrance and started screaming and shouting and trying to attack PC ROBINSON and Pc Wale and I noticed that [REDACTED] had blood on his face and hands as if he had been fighting. Due to his aggressive behaviour I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] arm to stop him from getting near them as I believed that [REDACTED] was going to attempt to get to my colleges and assist the male in escaping. I shouted at [REDACTED] to stop and he refused, and so I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] and tried to pull him away and was aware that Pc Clarke had also took hold of [REDACTED] continued to struggle with us and we were joined by other officers were also trying to restrain him. [REDACTED] then turned around, shouting and threw a punch at Pc Clarke and he continued to be extremely aggressive towards police, [REDACTED] was lashing out and as I took hold of his arm he then turned around and threw a punch towards me nearly hitting me in the face. It was quite clear that [REDACTED] was under the influence of alcohol or drugs, as he was very aggressive and violent. Due to his violent behaviour and the fact that he was causing other males to become aggressive I decided to try and take [REDACTED] to the floor in order to restrain him. [REDACTED] was resisting and refused to comply with Police, with numerous officers shouting for him and the other males to move back. The area was very small and cramped and due to the wet floor it was difficult to stand up. Because of [REDACTED]s violent behaviour I believed that an officer may be badly injured and I feared for my college's safety as they were trying to deal with the other male and were not aware that [REDACTED] was trying to get to them and fight them from behind.

Due to the above both myself and Pc Clarke attempted to take [REDACTED] to the ground as it was safer to detain him while he was on the ground. I was shouting at [REDACTED] to get down on the floor and I could hear Pc Clarke shouting as well, but [REDACTED] was not listening and continued to fight with us. At this point, I had [REDACTED] around the head and he was still throwing punches towards me and trying to get away from me. [REDACTED] broke free and again threw several punches

at me hitting me on the chest and Head as a result of this I decided to use a distraction technique by punching him twice in the chest this didn't work, and [REDACTED] carried on aggressively swinging his arms, with clinched fists trying to punch myself and Pc Clarke. During the struggle I saw Pc Clarke also deliver two distraction strikes to his thigh in order to get [REDACTED] to the floor but he was still resisting. It was quite clear that [REDACTED] would not calm down and it was he was out to fight with police. [REDACTED] was continually shouting at us to "fuck off" and was calling me a "fucking cunt".

We eventually got [REDACTED] onto the floor and I and Pc Clarke managed to over power [REDACTED] and get him to the floor on his front. We were then attempting to get his arms behind his back to handcuff him and detain a violent male. [REDACTED] was still resisting and as a result he was banging his head on the ground and the wall next to our location I noticed that his nose was bleeding and he had a cut above one of his eyes [REDACTED] was still tensing his arms and torso and was kicking his legs out. And we needed the assistance of other officers to control him. We were joined by Pc 366YE Wilson, Pc 222YE Asser and Pc 336YE Bowen and eventually after struggling with [REDACTED], we managed to get his arms behind his back and handcuff him in a rear stack. [REDACTED] was still shouting and swearing and telling me to

"fuck off" and calling me a "Fucking cunt" [REDACTED] continued to struggle on the floor and in the process was banging his head, I was aware that other males were still being aggressive towards police but I focused my attention on [REDACTED] and was trying to calm him down Pc Bowen was standing next to me and he informed me that he was recording the incident on his body cam. Whilst [REDACTED] was on the floor at 05:45am I informed him that I was arresting him on suspicion of Affray and cautioned him to which he replied "Fuck you, Fuck you, you cunt" I then spoke with Pc 277YE Ewart and asked him to call an ambulance in order to treat [REDACTED]'s injuries. Whilst waiting for the ambulance he continued to struggle on the floor and was continuously abusive towards me. [REDACTED] continued to shout and swear and telling us to fuck off. Whilst waiting for the ambulance I could hear males outside the club still shouting and banging on the main doors to the club, when they were eventually moved on staff from LAS came into the club and we stood [REDACTED] up and they checked his injuries and requested that we take him to the ambulance in order for them to treat him.

I remained with [REDACTED] I led him to the ambulance and whilst in the ambulance he continued to be verbally abusive towards me swearing at me calling me a "nasty bastard" and a "fucking cunt"

These are my original notes made at Wood Green police station these notes were delayed as I was assisting Pc Wale with his prisoner who was also arrested inside the club and taken to Wood Green police station, [REDACTED] was conveyed to NMH

Notes started at 0726hrs on 01/02/2014 at WOOD GREEN POLICE STATION

On Saturday 1st February at approximately 0525hrs, I was on duty in full uniform, posted as the driver of a marked Police vehicle, call sign YE21 nights with PC ROBINSON 477YE. We are both taser trained officers and were carrying tasers.

We received a call to attend CLUB 303, DUTE LANE, ENFIELD as an unknown informant stated that there was a large fight at the club, CAD 1981/01FEB14 refers.

On arrival at scene, a female approached me and stated that there was a large fight inside the club mainly between white males, some of which were believed to be Irish males and some English. She stated that there were approximately 20 to 30 of them fighting. The female stated that one male had a bad head injury and she had assisted him as he fell unconscious and she had administered CPR. The female couldn't give me a good description of what the male looked like as she had put him in the recovery position and then got out the way as she was scared as the males were still all fighting The security staff stated that there was still a fight taking place inside the club and they wanted our assistance to clear the club.

Myself, along with PC DELLAR 167YE, PC ROBINSON 477YE, PC WALE 365YE, PC EWART 277YE, PC BOWEN 336YE and other officers went into the club to assist. When we went into the club there was a small reception area approximately 6 meters long and 4 meters wide, which had a lot of males loitering around. Some of the males had blood on them and there was a clear sign of disturbance and a fight had taken place.

I was standing in the reception area, and people were slowly coming out and making their way to the doors. A lot of the

males were heavily intoxicated and were being abusive as they were coming out. There was one more main entrance to the main dance floor. In the reception area were the doors leading to the toilets. The floor was covered in liquid believed to be alcohol making it very slippery.

Suddenly I saw PC ROBINSON, and other officers start to struggle with a male to the right of the main dance floor entrance. I could hear him shouting and swearing. This caused numerous other IC1 males to start pushing forward and trying to get to Police officers and also the male officers were attempting to detain.

At this point an IC1 male, slim build with short brown hair, wearing a black jacket and blue jeans, who I now know to be [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED] of an unknown address come out of the toilet next to where I was standing, and tried to get past me, screaming and shouting and trying to attack PC ROBINSON and the other officers present. I could see that [REDACTED] had blood on his face and hands as if he had been fighting.

I took hold of [REDACTED] arm to stop him from getting near them due to the fact that I had a genuine honest held belief that [REDACTED] was going to attempt to get to my colleges and assist the male in escaping and in doing so use force on him due to his aggressive behaviour. I shouted for the male to stop and he refused, and so I grabbed hold of [REDACTED] and tried to pull him back. I am aware that PC DELLAR and other officers were also trying to stop [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then turned around, shouting and threw a punch in my direction. Fortunately I was far enough away to move and not get hit, but still [REDACTED] was lashing out, and I also saw him try to punch PC DELLAR in the face as well. [REDACTED] was clearly attempting to assault us. [REDACTED] was clearly under the influence of alcohol and due to his erratic behaviour, I also believe that he had consumed drugs, as he was very aggressive and violent.

[REDACTED] was refusing to resist and comply with Police, with numerous officers shouting for him and the other males to move back. The area was very small and cramped. The only good thing was that the lighting had gone back on and so people could see what was happening. I felt that there was a good chance that with [REDACTED] acting in this aggressive and violent way, an officer may be badly injured as I feared for my colleges safety as they were trying to deal with the other male and were not aware that [REDACTED] was trying to get to them and fight them from behind.

At this stage, both myself and PC DELLAR attempted to take [REDACTED] to the ground as it was safer to detain him while he was on the ground, due to the small area and slippery floors. I was shouting at [REDACTED] to get down on the floor and I

could hear PC DELLAR shouting as well, but [REDACTED] was not listening and continued to fight us. I had [REDACTED] round the body and was trying to pull him away as he was skinny and was wriggling away from me and was pumped up and very worked up. Once I was closer to [REDACTED], I considered a red dot challenge to try and stop [REDACTED] but the area was too small, there were too many people and officers around, and it wasn't a suitable use of force. I also considered my baton and CS but both would not work as the close proximity of others, and so I kneed him twice in the fleshy part of his left thigh as a distraction technique to get [REDACTED] to stop trying to attack PC ROBINSON and get him to the floor. This didn't work and had no affect on [REDACTED] and he carried on aggressively swinging his arms, with clinched fists trying to punch us. I saw PC DELLAR also deliver distraction strikes to [REDACTED] to get him to the floor but he was still resisting. Due to the close area that we were trying to restrain [REDACTED] in and stop him fighting us, I couldn't see where PC DELLAR struck [REDACTED], but whatever we did, [REDACTED] would not resist and it was clear he was out to fight us. [REDACTED] was continually shouting at us to "fuck off" and calling PC DELLAR "a fucking cunt". Finally myself and PC DELLAR managed to over power [REDACTED] and get him to the floor on his front. We were then attempting to get his arms behind his back to handcuff him and detain a violent male. [REDACTED] was still resisting, tensing his arms and torso and was kicking his legs out. I think he may have kicked another officer in the leg. Eventually after struggling with [REDACTED], we managed to get his arms behind his back and handcuff him in a rear stack. [REDACTED] was still shouting and swearing and telling us to fuck off and so PC DELLAR held onto [REDACTED]'s handcuffs and kept him on the floor as [REDACTED] was still trying to get up.

I then got up as [REDACTED] was detained, and started to push the males back into the dance floor area as they were trying to get out. I was continually shouting at two IC3 males and an IC1 male in particular that were being aggressive. I could hear that people were banging on the main doors which had been shut to stop anyone else coming in.

Eventually the club was emptied and [REDACTED] was taken to an ambulance outside as he had sustained injuries believed to be from where he was fighting earlier in the club. An Irish male then made himself known to LAS with a large cut wound to the back of his head. The male was also very intoxicated and stated that he had been beaten up by some white lads in the club. The male didn't give any other information to me and was being dealt with by other officers on scene.

I went back into the club and spoke to the manager about the CCTV. I attended the manager's office and viewed the CCTV. Although the club has approximately 18 cameras, there were only 6 working, none of which showed any of the areas where the fighting took place or where the arrests of the two males had taken place. I asked the staff to confirm that the CCTV


