The Manager Viw4 was at the rear doors of the venue and showed us outside where Viw1 and 2 were. Viw1 clearly had a swollen left eye with a half inch laceration under the swelling. Viw2 was holding blue paper to the left side of his head. LAS confirmed his injury was two 2-3 inch lacerations to the left side of his head.

Viw1 and 2 had both been drinking and were intoxicated.

Initially both males did not wish to speak to police and it was difficult to find out exactly what had occurred. Both males were seen by LAS H101 and taken into the ambulance.

During this time Viw3 a doorman at the location became freed up from his duties as more of the patrons left the location. He stated that he had witnessed exactly what had happened. He informed police that he saw 6-7 Albanian males attacking both Viw1 and 2 while they were on the floor, they were all punching into both males and throwing glasses on top of them and SUS1 smash a glass into the back of Viw2's head while he was unconscious on the floor. Viw4 the grabbed two of the males and dragged them off, and all of the suspects ran out of the bar barging into everyone as they



condition that required staff to call police following any disorder or when persons on the premises had taken part in any offence,

When asked about this Ms Rooney stated that she had told the LAS there had been an assault. I felt that failing to call police may have put members of the LAS at risk as they would be required to enter a potentially hostile and violent environment whilst delaying the possible apprehension of offender and their criminal behaviour. As a result of this I served a form 690 and accompanying notes (via PS Lucey) on Mr McIntyre which outlined the closure of the Maze Inn, otherwise known as the Rising Sun, 7 Chase Side, N14. This was to remain in place until 1200hrs, on 09/02/14.

The grounds for the closure were as follows.

- 1. The assistant manager did not alert police to the assault and so created a potential for it to continue either inside or outside the venue and cause unnecessary danger to first responders.
- 2. I have attended a near identical incident at this venue albeit sometime ago.
- 3. This incident took place in the presence of security staff within the bar and led to two victims of assault one of which amounted to GBH.
- 4. Groups remained in the vicinity and had potential to return to the venue.

Having served to notice we were joined by MSC Inspector Matthew Appleton and is licensing team who inspected the licence copy whilst arranging a full licensing inspection whilst on the premises.


I have identified two other CAD calls to the venue relating to this incident. The first is CAD 882 at 0144hrs, during which an unidentified male asks if an ambulance had been called. The second is CAD 902 at 0149hrs, from an who states he had seen a male lying on the floor with lots of blood.

It is worth noting that staff appeared to be closing the pub when I arrived, that said I could not guarantee it would not reopen when officers left and so I felt it necessary to serve the notice.

A senior police officer has decided to make this closure order under the terms of section 161 of the Licensing Act 2003, requiring the relevant premises specified in the order to be closed for the period of time specified in the order.

Your attention is drawn to section 161(6) of the 2003 Act. This makes it an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse, to permit relevant premises to be open in contravention of this closure order or any extension of it, and any person found guilty of such an offence shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to both.

By virtue of section 171(2) and (3) of the 2003 Act, relevant premises are to be regarded as open, for the purposes of this order, if any person other than the holder of the premises licence for the premises, any designated premises supervisor, the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, a manager of the premises, any person who usually lives at the premises or any member of the family of any of the former, enters the premises and buys, or is otherwise supplied with food or drink or any item usually sold on the premises or, while he is on the premises, they are used for the provision of regulated entertainment.

Section 162 - 168 of the Licensing Act 2003

This part of the closure order now explains the effects of sections 162 – 168 of the 2003 Act as required by section 161(4)(d) of that Act.

NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED

Initial hearing

- The senior police officer who made the closure order is under a statutory duty to apply to the magistrates' court for it to
 consider the order, or any extension of it, as soon as reasonably practicable after it comes into force.
- The magistrates' court must consider the closure order made by a senior police officer as soon as practicable after receiving the application, by holding a hearing and determining whether to exercise its powers under section 165 of the 2003 Act.
- Under law on human rights, you are entitled to attend the hearing, to be legally represented, and to make representations to the
 court before any decision is taken. The chief executive to the magistrates' court will be able to advise you about the details of
 the procedures which apply in your area.
- A discretion is provided for the magistrates to revoke the order and any extension of it, if it is still in force; or to order that the
 premises remain closed or be closed until a review of the licence has taken place; or to order that the premises remain closed
 until a review of the licence has taken place but subject to such exceptions or conditions that they may specify. The last of
 these powers would enable the court to allow premises to re-open but subject to certain new terms and conditions which they
 may decide to impose.
- When deciding whether the premises should be allowed to re-open or remain closed, the court must consider whether closure
 of the premises is necessary in the interests of public safety to prevent disorder or likely disorder (where the closure order was
 made for this reason) or to prevent further public nuisance caused by noise (where the closure order was made for this reason).
- It is an offence for any person who permits the premises to open in contravention of an order made by the magistrates for the closure of the premises, and the 2003 Act provides for an offender on conviction to be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to three months imprisonment or to both.
- It is an offence for any person who fails to comply with or does an act in contravention of any order made by the magistrates in relation to the premises in these proceedings, and provides for an offender on conviction to be liable to a fine not exceeding £20,000 or to three months imprisonment or to both.
- Where, for whatever reason, the courts are unable to consider a closure order before it expires, the senior police officer
 concerned may extend the order for up to another period of 24 hours if certain circumstances obtain. These are that the officer
 reasonably believes that the closure of the premises continues to be necessary in the interests of the public safety to prevent
 disorder, or likely disorder, or to prevent further public nulsance caused by noise. Such extensions can be made on an
 indefinite number of occasions.
- The senior police officer is required to give notice to the holder of the premises licence for the premises, or to any designated
 premises supervisor, or the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, or a manager of the premises of such
 extensions of the closure order.
- The senior police officer may cancel his closure order or any extension of it at any time after he has issued it, but before it has
 been considered by the court. If he does so, the court must still consider the closure order originally served, and the licensing
 authority will still be obliged to review the premises licence.
- The senior police officer is required to cancel the order if he reasonably believes that closure of the premises is no longer necessary in the interests of public safety to prevent disorder or to prevent further public nuisance; and is required to give notice to the holder of the premises licence for the premises, or any designated premises supervisor, or the premises user in connection with a temporary event notice, or a manager of the premises when he decides to cancel it.

Review hearing

- The licensing authority must review the premises licence in respect of the premises no later than 28 days after it is notified of the magistrates' court's determination. The authority is empowered, if necessary, to promote the licensing objectives, to modify the conditions of the premises licence, exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, remove the designated premises supervisor from the licence, suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months or revoke the licence. Their consideration is not confined solely to the incident which gave rise to the service of the closure order. They may examine any issues which are relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- Where a decision has been made to revoke the premises licence, the decision has no effect until the explry of the time
 permitted for appealing against the decision; and if an appeal is made until the appeal is disposed of.

In considering the closure of a premises for disorder the following should be taken into account;

DIDNITE CENTER NO CONTROL RASK

 The conduct of the person in charge i.e. what have they done to prevent the disorder, has their action or inaction contributed to the problem, do you have faith in their offer to close?

Whether the premises has a history of disorder, as opposed to a one off incident?

 Whether the disorder can be attributed to the premises or has it simply occurred in its general vicinity?

If the disorder is not already occurring what are the grounds for suspecting it is imminent?

Will the closure order solve the problem or are there other alternatives?

 The potential to aggravate the disorder by ejecting a large and possibly aggrieved crowd from a premises at once, as a consequence of a closure order.

If after giving these matters consideration and the decision to close the premises is taken then a <u>form 690</u> should be completed and handed to the appropriate person which will be the person in control of the premises and could be; the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) a personal licence holder, a manager or a Temporary Event Notice User.

Consideration should be given to the length of time the order should remain in force. The closure order should not be made for longer than is required for the disorder/ public nuisance matter to be resolved, for a maximum period of 24 hours.

A closure order only prohibits licensable activity i.e. the sale or supply of alcohol, hot food/drink after 11pm, or the provision of regulated entertainment. There is no power in the legislation for officers to use reasonable force to physically close a premises.

Extension of a section 161 closure order (section 162 LA 2003)

If before the closure has expired, a senior officer reasonably believes that by the end of the closure period, a Magistrates' Court will not have been able to consider the order and the criteria for the order continue to apply, they may order an extension of the order up to a further 24 hours.

Cancellation of a section 161 closure order (section 163 LA 2003)

A closure order **must** be cancelled if the senior officer reasonably believes that the matters relating to its issue have been resolved.

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Consens of the Consen

Closure Orders S161 Licensing Act 2003

Several recent incidents have highlighted a lack of consistency in the use of Closure Orders issued by officers under section 161 Licensing Act 2003 (LA 2003).

The powers contained within this section are a useful tool when dealing with disorder occurring, or likely imminently to occur, at, or in the vicinity of, licensed premises where there is a risk to public safety and closure of the premises is deemed necessary to alleviate this risk. (A <u>flow chart</u> outlining the process is available and should be used in conjunction with this guidance)

An order under section 161 LA 2003 is for use at any licensed premises including premises benefiting from a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) however this does <u>not</u> include a club premises certificate. A section 161 order is a valuable reactive tool for an officer dealing with spontaneous disorder at an identified premises. If however there is disorder occurring, or more likely, anticipated in a geographic area, an alternative power can be used under section 160 LA 2003. This enables a Superintendent to apply to the Magistrates' Court for an order requiring all licensed premises within a specific location to close for up to 24 hours where they are satisfied such an order is necessary to prevent disorder. Again this does not apply to premises with a club premises certificate.

Procedure

A closure order under section 161 must be made by an officer of at least the rank of Inspector, who must be satisfied that the closure is necessary in the interests of public safety in the case of disorder, or to prevent nuisance in the case of public nuisance caused by noise.

A closure order must be in writing and can be served by a constable of any rank. In exceptional circumstances it may be appropriate for the Senior Officer to make the order remotely and ask an officer at the scene to deal with service of the Order. However given the serious implications of such an Order and the fact the that the Officer making the Order will be accountable for a decision to close a premises, it is envisaged that an Inspector will generally be in attendance at the scene, to make a full assessment of the situation before deciding to deploy this particular operational tactic.

As the issue of a closure order under section 161 has serious implications, including automatically triggering a Court hearing and a licence review, careful consideration should be given to their use. Where possible and appropriate, immediate voluntary closure of the premises should be sought by the person in charge.

The order and any copy of it should be endorsed 'cancelled' and signed and dated by the senior officer who made the closure order and give notice of the cancellation to the Premises Licence Holder /Designated Premises Supervisor /manager of the premises.

Application to a magistrates' court (section 164 - 165 LA 2003)

The officer responsible for making the order **must**, as soon as practicable after the closure order comes into force, apply to a relevant magistrates' court for it to consider the order and any extension of it.

The legislation is slightly ambiguous regarding the position with regards to an application to Court if the closure order has been cancelled at any point prior to the hearing. Based upon legal advice, the MPS position in such a situation is that an application must still be made to a Magistrates' Court irrespective of any cancellation or expiry of the order.

Legal representation for this court hearing is available from the DLS. The Court will require at the bare minimum, a copy of the closure order and a details of the incident that gave rise to the closure.

The Officer must also notify the relevant Licensing Authority (Part of the local authority) that;

- 1. a closure order has come into force.
- 2. the contents of the order and any extension of it
- 3. and that application has been made to a magistrates' court.

Licence Review Hearing (section 167 LA 2003)

A full licence review hearing will be convened within 10 working days after the day that the local authority receives notification from the magistrates' court of their decision.

All closures of licensed premises under section 161 LA 2003 should be brought to the **immediate** attention of the Borough Licensing Officer who will be responsible for managing the review process and any subsequent action involving the premises.
