

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence : (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.**
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.**
- 3. Where the licence includes a condition that individuals are required to carry out any security activity at specified times at the premises each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.**

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 4. With the exception of Amusement with prize machines, there shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.**
- 5. Regulated entertainment by way of live music shall be restricted to a maximum of two performers at any one time.**
- 6. If a disc jockey is used on any night, then he/she shall ask customers to leave quietly.**
- 7. Additional patrols shall take place by members of staff internally and externally to limit any noise pollution when regulated entertainment is being offered within the premises.**
- 8. Soft drinks and non-alcoholic drinks shall be available.**
- 9. An additional CCTV camera to be placed at the front of the premises to cover the front drinking area.**
- 10. Children under 18 years of age shall not be permitted in the public areas of the premises after 23.00.**
- 11. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.**
- 12. At least 6 prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises including the toilets warning customers that drugs will not be tolerated.**
- 13. A digital CCTV system must be installed at the premises complying with the following criteria: (1) Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside, the counter, alcohol displays and all the floor area; (2) Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification; (3) Cameras**

viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of the screen; (4) Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises; (5) Cameras facing the entrance door must capture a minimum of 16 per second; (6) Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed; (7) Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image; (8) Provide good quality images - colour during opening times; (9) Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises; (10) Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet; (11) Provide a monitor to in full view of customers entering the premises. This monitor must display the images of said customers; (12) Have a separate monitor to review images and recorded picture quality; (13) Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture and retention; (14) Have signage displayed on the front entrance door and in the customer area to advise that recorded CCTV is in operation; (15) Digital images must be kept for 31 days; (16) Police will have access to images at any reasonable time; (17) The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy. If this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

14. All doors and windows shall be kept closed (but not locked) during regulated entertainment, except for access to and egress from the premises.

15. The Management shall make subjective assessments of noise levels at the perimeter of the premises approximately hourly, whilst regulated entertainment is provided to ensure that noise from the premises does not cause a disturbance to local residents. Records shall be kept of the times, dates and any issues discovered. These shall be kept for six months. Records must be made available to an authorised officer of the Council, upon request. Where monitoring by staff identifies that noise from the premises audible at the perimeter, measures shall be taken to reduce this i.e. turning down the volume.

16. All staff at the premises shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every three months), relating to the sale of alcohol.

17. All training relating to the sale of alcohol shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request.

18. All instances of crime & disorder shall be reported to the Police and be kept in an incident logbook.

19. Toilets at the premises shall be checked for any sign of drug use on average every hour between 20:00 and closing time. A record shall be kept of the times, dates, and any issues discovered. These records shall be kept for six months. Records must be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or the police upon request.

20. A minimum of three door supervisors shall be employed on the premises on Friday and Saturday from 21:00 until the premises is closed. The duties of these staff will include the supervision of persons entering and leaving the premises to ensure that this is achieved without causing a nuisance. Door Supervisors shall be easily identifiable by wearing either reflective jackets or reflective armbands.

21. Any door supervisors employed shall be from SIA approved contractors.

22. Signs shall be prominently displayed on the exit doors advising customers that the premises is in a 'Drinking Control Area' and that alcohol should not be taken off the premises and consumed in the street. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.

23. Children under 14 years of age shall not be permitted in the public areas of the premises after 21:00. Children under 18 years of age shall be supervised by an accompanying adult at all times.

24. A challenge 21 policy shall be employed whereby those who appear to be under the age of 21 and are asking to purchase alcohol will be asked for identification to prove their age. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.

25. There will be no new entry to the premises after 01:00 on Friday and Saturday.

26. The rear garden at the front of the premises shall not be used after 23:00 Monday to Saturday and 22:30 on Sunday.

27. An external area at the front of the premises shall be designated for the use of smokers from 23:00 until closing time on Mondays to Saturdays and from 22:30 until closing time on Sundays. Exceptions to this condition are customers entering or leaving via the doors at the front of the premises and those using the designated smoking area. There shall be no more than 15 persons using this designated area during these times and no alcoholic drinks or glass containers shall be permitted in the smoking area during these times. The designated area shall be adequately supervised to control the number and behaviour of patrons so as to not cause noise nuisance. Notices shall be displayed in the area specifying the terms of its use and asking patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to use the area quietly.

28. At least one door supervisor shall remain directly outside the premises for 30 minutes after the premises has closed on Fridays and Saturdays to ensure the safe and quiet dispersal of patrons.

29. A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request.

30. Any candles used at the premises shall be put in a candleholder and positioned to minimise any risk of customers being burnt or coming into contact with naked flames.

This letter concerns the application for a Variation of the DPS on a Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Please find the licence enclosed. Please check the details on the licence carefully, the Licensing Authority is prepared to correct any of our clerical errors within 28 days of the licence being issued.

Note - Transfers

On the grant of a transfer application, any notification or permit (under the Gambling Act 2005) in respect of gaming machines at the premises becomes null and void. A new notification or permit will need to be sought by the new holder of the premises licence (under the Licensing Act 2003) before gaming machines may be lawfully provided at the premises.

Please be advised that the licence does not override any restrictions on trading hours etc. that may apply to the premises in respect of planning permission and/or Sunday trading & etc.

The terms, conditions and restrictions of the licence must be complied with whenever the premise is used for licensable activities. Failure to comply with the licence is a criminal offence with, on conviction, a maximum fine of £20,000 and/or up to 6 months imprisonment.

The licence, or a certified copy of it, must be kept on the premises at all times and must be produced on request to any authorised officer. The summary of the licence must be prominently displayed within the premises.

The London Fire Brigade advise as follows :

The issue of capacity should be addressed in the fire risk assessment for the premises use. This does not mean that every premises must have a capacity figure. There should be evidence however that the responsible person has considered the number of persons who can be safely evacuated through the available exits.

A safe capacity figure will be expected in the following circumstances:

- (1) in premises that could potentially become overcrowded; for example bars, pubs, clubs, and other places of public assembly :
- (2) where an engineered solution or BS 9999 has been used to increase capacity;
- (3) where capacity is risk-critical; for example where the premises use has a higher occupancy factor than that which the building was designed for.

Where applicable, capacity should normally be inclusive of staff and performers. Management should be able to demonstrate a realistic method of controlling capacity.

Should you wish to change the operation of the premises in the future by adding new licensable activities or by changing the hours or removing conditions then you will need to apply for a variation of the licence. Please contact us for further advice.


You must notify the licensing authority of any change in the name and/or address of either the premises licence holder or the designated premises supervisor.

The licence is subject to an annual fee, payable on each anniversary of the licence first being granted.
