1 <u>LICENSING HISTORY & CURRENT POSITION</u>:

- On 23 July 2005 an application by **Mr Baris Salman & Mr Ibrahim Korkmaz** to convert an existing Justices Off Licence to a Premises Licence, which was not subject to any representations, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.2 On 25 October 2011 an application by **Mr Baris Salman & Mr Ibrahim Korkmaz** for a minor variation of the Premises Licence (so as to annex additional conditions to the licence), which was not subject to any representations, was granted by officers in accordance with delegated powers.
- 1.3 The current Premises Licence permits :
- 1.3.1 **Hours the premises are open to the public**: Sunday to Saturday from 00:00 to 00:00 (i.e. 24-hours a day, 7-days a week).
- 1.3.2 **Supply of alcohol (off supplies only)**: Sunday from 10:00 to 22:30, on Monday to Saturday from 08:00 to 23:00, on Good Friday from 08:00 to 22:30 and on Christmas Day from 12:00 to 15:00 & from 19:00 to 22:30.
- 1.4 Since 23 July 2005 the Designated Premises Supervisor specified on the Premises Licence has been **Mr Baris Salman**.
- 1.5 A copy of a location map of the premises is attached as Annex 01.
- 1.6 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached as Annex 02.

2 THIS APPLICATION:

- 2.1 On 24 October 2014 application was made by the **Licensing Authority** for the review of the Premises Licence.
- The review application relates to the prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective. The minor variation application (granted on 25 October 2011 see section 1.2, above) arose because counterfeit alcohol was found on the premises previously. On 15 October 2014 counterfeit alcohol was again found on the premises, along with non-duty paid alcohol.
- 2.3 The authority considers that it is now appropriate, for the promotion of the licensing objectives, to revoke the Premises Licence.
- 2.4 The application was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.5 Each of the Responsible Authorities were consulted in respect of the application.
- 2.6 A copy of the application is attached as Annex 03.

3 **RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS**:

- 3.1 **Metropolitan Police**: Representation is made, on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, in <u>support</u> of the review application. The authority agrees that it is appropriate, for the promotion of the licensing objectives, to revoke the Premises Licence.
- 3.1.1 A copy of the representation is attached as Annex 04.
- 3.2 **Other Persons**: Representations have been made, <u>against</u> the review application, by persons residing at 5 separate addresses. The grounds of the representations include the prevention of crime and disorder.
- 3.2.1 Copies of the representations are attached as Annex 05.

4 RELEVANT LAW, GUIDANCE & POLICIES:

- 4.1 The paragraphs below are extracted from either:
- 4.1.1 the Licensing Act 2003 ('Act'); or
- 4.1.2 the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State to the Home Office of October 2014 ('Guid'); or
- 4.1.3 the London Borough of Enfield's Licensing Policy Statement of April 2012 ('Pol').

General Principles:

- 4.2 The Licensing Sub-Committee must carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives [Act s.4(1)].
- 4.3 The licensing objectives are:
- 4.3.1 the prevention of crime and disorder;
- 4.3.2 public safety:
- 4.3.3 the prevention of public nuisance; &
- 4.3.4 the protection of children from harm [Act s.4(2)].
- 4.4 In carrying out its functions, the Sub-Committee must also have regard to:
- 4.4.1 the Council's licensing policy statement; &
- 4.4.2 guidance issued by the Secretary of State [Act s.4(3)].

Review:

- In reviewing a licence the Licensing Sub-Committee will consider, and take into account, the complaints history of the premises and all other relevant information [Pol s.10.3].
- 4.6 A number of reviews may arise in connection with crime that is not directly connected with licensable activities, for example the sale of contraband goods. The Sub-Committee does not have the power to judge the criminality or otherwise of any issue. The Sub-Committee's role is to ensure the promotion of the crime prevention objective [Guid s.11.24].
- 4.7 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These include the use of the premises for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol [Guid s.11.27].
- Where reviews arise in respect of these criminal activities and the Sub-Committee determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined, it is expected that revocation of the licence even in the first instance should be seriously considered [Guid s.11.28].

Decision:

- 4.9 Having heard all of the representations (from all parties) the Licensing Sub-Committee must take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- 4.9.1 to modify the conditions of the licence;
- 4.9.2 to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- 4.9.3 to remove the designated premises supervisor
- 4.9.4 to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- 4.9.5 to revoke the licence [Act s.52].
- 4.10 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, the Sub-Committee should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should generally be directed at those causes and should always be no more than an appropriate and proportionate response [Guid s.11.20].



Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence: (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule


- 3. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 4. Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.
- 5. The premises licence holder and any other persons responsible for the purchase of stock shall not purchase any goods from door-to-door sellers.
- 6. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all receipts for goods bought are kept together in a file or folder as evidence that they have been brought into the UK through legal channels. Receipts shall show the following details: (1) Seller's name and address; (2) Seller's company details, if applicable; (3) Seller's VAT details, if applicable.
- 7. Copies of these documents shall be retained on the premises for no less than 12 months and shall be made available to police or authorised officers of the council on request within five working days of the request.
- 8. An ultra violet light will be used at the store to check the authenticity of all stock purchased which bears a customs stamp.
- 9. A personal licence holder is to be present on the premises and supervise the sale of alcohol, throughout the permitted hours for the sale of alcohol.
- 10. All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every three months) relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of this premises licence.
- 11. All training relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.
- 12. The premises must operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) shall be accepted.

- 13. A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year from the date of the last entry.
- 14. Children under the age of 14 shall not be permitted on the premises after 21:00 unless accompanied by an adult.
- 15. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.

Enfield Licensing Authority is seeking a review of the premises licence on the grounds that the premises have been found to be selling non duty paid and counterfeit alcohol.

The premises have previously been given the opportunity to submit a minor variation to strengthen the licence conditions as a result of counterfeit alcohol being found at the premises.

This review is primarily based on the prevention of crime and disorder, licensing objective. The review application is to revoke the premises licence in its entirety.

Background Information:

Complaint and Visit History of Premises

The licence for this premises was converted to a premises licence in 2005 and a minor variation to strength the conditions was granted in October 2011 following the discovery of counterfeit alcohol.

13th March 2012 – Full licence inspection. Condition 8 Ultra violet light not yet purchased.

15th October 2014 – The premises was visited as part of a joint HMRC and Trading Standards Operation to check for any counterfeit / none duty paid alcohol or tobacco. 15.75 litres of wine (21 bottles) and 27.3 litres of spirit (39 bottles) were seized by HMRC. The wine was for a sale at a price that was almost cheaper than the tax that

should have been paid on it. Duty for all the products would have equated to £351.21. Trading Standards also seized 3 bottles of counterfeit vodka. A full licence inspection was not carried out but the officers did note that Part B of the Premises Licence was not on display and that the premises was selling drugs paraphilia in the form of grinders and small plastic bags. Although these are not illegal they could attract drug users / dealers to the premises.

Additional Information:

DCMS Guidance (11.26) states that there are certain criminal activities that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously. The list includes the sale of smuggled tobacco and alcohol (i.e. non duty paid products).

DCMS guidance (11.27) goes on to say that it is envisaged that responsibility authorities will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.

Conclusion:

A significant amount of duty diverted alcohol has been seized from the premises along with counterfeit alcohol. The premises has a history of selling counterfeit alcohol and has already been given the opportunity to submit a minor variation to strengthen the licence conditions.

The Licensing Authority therefore recommends that this licence be revoked.

If the Licensing Committee does not deem it necessary to revoke the licence in its entirety I would recommend the DPS be removed from the licence and the licence be suspended for or 3 months.

The Application

Enfield Licensing Authority is seeking a review of the premises licence on the grounds that the premises have been found to be selling non duty paid alcohol.

Location

This venue is situated in a mixed residential and retail street.

History

I have researched Police crime and intelligence systems with the following intelligence reports being of some relevance;

Police intelligence report number - YERT 00376413 - Date Created 01/08/2014. Date Updated 26/08/2014 - **Ordnance Supermarket** is involved in selling illegal cigarettes and tobacco.

They sell brands such as MAYFAIR, MARLBORO and GOLDEN VIRGINIA at cheap prices such as £5 a packet.

Police intelligence report number - YERT00376076 – Date created 22/07/2014. Date updated 19/09/2014 - There are a number of shops on Ordnance Road EN3 which are involved in the sale of fake cigarettes and tobacco including **Ordnance Supermarket**.

In summary I wish to make representation on the following:

Prevention of crime & disorder

The Metropolitan Police wish to support this application on the grounds that on 15th October 2014, the premises was visited as part of a joint HMRC and Trading Standards Operation to check for any counterfeit / none duty paid alcohol or tobacco. 15.75 litres of wine (21 bottles) and 27.3 litres of spirit (39 bottles) were seized by HMRC. The wine was for a sale at a price that was almost cheaper than the tax that should have been paid on it. Duty for all the products would have equated to £351.21. Trading Standards also seized 3 bottles of counterfeit vodka.

Guidance:

DCMS Guidance (11.26) states that there are certain criminal activities that may arise in connection with licensed premises, which the Secretary of State considers should be treated particularly seriously. The list includes the sale of smuggled tobacco and alcohol (i.e. non duty paid products).

DCMS guidance (11.27) goes on to say that it is envisaged that responsibility authorities will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence – even in the first instance – should be seriously considered.

Conclusion:

A significant amount of duty diverted alcohol was seized from the premises.

The Metropolitan Police support the London Borough of Enfield Licensing Authority review application in recommending that this premises licence be revoked.

The Secretary of State believes that the sale of smuggled alcohol should be treated particularly seriously and that where licence reviews are submitted and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined revocation of the licence, even in the first instance should be seriously considered.

Having regard to all this information, and taking into account DCMS guidance, this leaves no other alternative other than for the Metropolitan Police to seek total revocation of this premises licence.

However, if the Licensing Committee does not deem it necessary to revoke the licence in its entirety, it is recommended the DPS be removed from the licence and that the licence be suspended for a minimum of 3 months.
