DECISION

AGREED: subject to no call-in being received, the following decision will come into effect on Monday 30th June 2014:

- 1. That the Greater London Authority's grant of £525,000 European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) funding, to match fund £525,000 provided by 6 project delivery partners (total £1.05 million), be accepted.
- 2. That the Council acts as Lead Partner for Retrofit London and signs an agreement with the GLA, enabling Enfield Council to accept the £525,000 ERDF funding and the associated audit and monitoring requirements.
- 3. That Enfield Council enters into agreements with Retrofit London delivery partners: LB Haringey, LB Waltham Forest, LB Lewisham, Enterprise Enfield and North London Chamber of Commerce, setting out their respective match funding contributions, delivery activities, roles & responsibilities and outputs.
- 4. That an allocation of £78,000 from Enfield Council's Match Funding Reserve Fund is made and £94,000 worth of staff time (total value £172,000) is committed as the Council's match funding contribution.
- 5. That a Programme Manager is recruited to manage the Retrofit London project.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:

To reject the offer of funding from the GLA and let SME's try to access new market opportunities on their own Dialogue with SME's in Enfield, Haringey, Waltham Forest and Lewisham highlighted the need to support SME's in order to open-up new market opportunities, particularly as the complexities of these new markets was holding back the ability of SME's to secure sales and in-turn grow new jobs in this area.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

Accepting the ERDF funding from the GLA and delivering the Retrofit London project will put in place a resource to address challenges and barriers faced by SME's. Also by working with 3 other boroughs delivery partners will increase the scale of demand for retrofit services and the potential to achieve sales and in-turn secure existing jobs and grow new jobs.
