AGREED subject to no call-in being received, that the following decisions will come into effect on Monday 8th September 2014:

- 1. That the following applications be approved under the Enfield Residents Priority Fund (as detailed in Appendix A of the report) for funding from the unallocated Enfield Residents Priority Fund 13/14:
 - Bowes Ward (BOW052) Evesham, Ollerton and Stanley Street Party £200
 - Ponders End Ward (PE043) Weekend Cricket Coaching £15,070
- 2. The following applications were approved subject to conditions:
 - Ponders End Ward (PE042) Turkish Advocacy Café £10,000 agreed subject to satisfactory details being provided in relation to the proposals for scheme insurance and web access.
 - Ponders End Ward (PE044)- Weekly CAB Advice Sessions for Alma Estate residents £1,995 agreed subject to confirmation that their charitable trust bid to support the work in the longer term has been successful.
- 3. To approve the project variation in relation to:
 - Chase Ward (CHAS008) Fine @ The Vine to amend the original application transferring expenditure from revenue to capital subject to clarification of the terms of Capel Manor College's obligations under their lease of Forty Hall Farm from the Council.
 - Confirmation from Forty Hall Community Vineyard that they have an agreement with Capel Manor College to occupy the building for at least five years.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:

That the projects are not considered and the funding is not allocated, this would not be recommended as this will not support community engagement and will not allow residents the opportunity to further improve the local area in which they live or work.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

The projects submitted have been proposed and developed by the local people of Enfield, to help improve the social, economic or environmental wellbeing by tackling local need and deprivation. The projects all support the Council's vision of making Enfield a better place to live and work, delivering fairness for all, growth and sustainability and strong communities.
