#### **DECISION**

**AGREED:** subject to no call-in being received, the following decision will come into effect on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2014:

- 1. To approve purchase orders being raised to the appointed supplier from the procurement process, for self-serving kiosks, staff readers, security gates and other required RFID equipment. To approve purchase orders being raised for replacement counters and other necessary equipment as outlined in the agreed Spend to Save Plan. The total value is £440,375 to be funded as previously agreed. The cost is for a five year refresh period and includes support and Serco costs.
- 2. To approve the release of £259,630 from the IT programme budget to purchase additional self-service kiosks and staff readers to replace Windows XP equipment that cannot be upgraded. The cost is for a five year refresh period and includes support and Serco costs.

#### **ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:**

Biblioteca/Axiell have reported that existing self-serving equipment in libraries is bow considered to be legacy equipment and therefore cannot be upgraded to Windows 7 in line with Council requirements. The appointed supplier is also unable to upgrade the software in all the legacy machines.

## **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Library staffing levels in branches with RFID equipment assume self-service capability and there is a significant degradation in the level of service provision when self-service capability fails. The legacy equipment will not be maintained beyond April 2014, so must be replaced. This also provides an opportunity to improve self-service provision with more user friendly and reliable technology.
