	 to grant the former Middlesex University campus site the status of an Asset of Community Value (as per the submitted application which is currently being considered by the Council's Nomination Panel against the published ACV Evaluation Criteria).
	 (ii) to grant permanent public access across the grounds (iii) The request to actively encourage a long term public use for the listed mansion and grounds (iv) The request for a re-evaluation of the management and strategic vision of Trent park on a whole

	(1) look for a positive future for the heritage assets at the site that will protect and promote their historic value and involve Members in the decision making process where possible.

"This Council calls for cross part support of the 20th March online petition by Londra Gazette against the short sighted decision announced by the Oxford, Cambridge and RSA Exam Board (OCR) to drop the Turkish Language "A" Level examination, particularly as there is strong evidence that the participation of students sitting the Turkish Language exams are higher than for German of Spanish which will not be discontinued.

Given that Turkish is one of the most spoken languages in Enfield, this Council calls on Nicky Morgan, the Education Secretary, to apply pressure on OCR into reversing the decision to scrap "A" Level Turkish Language and also calls for pressure to be applied into reversing the decision to scrap other language subjects that have been dropped."

It is recommended that the Director of Regeneration & Environment and the Director of Finance, Resources & Customer Services:

- 1. Agree the sale and purchase contracts appended to Part 2 of this report;
- 2. Authorise the execution and exchange of the contracts and associated documents that constitute the transactions;
- 3. Authorise completion of the land acquisitions following unconditional exchange of contracts;
- 4. Authorise the purchase of Environmental Liability Insurance as recommended in Part 2 of this report;
- 5. Authorise the purchase of Defective Title Indemnity Insurance as recommended in Part 2 of this report and note that the cost of this insurance will be borne by the vendor.
- 6. Provide a post completion update report to Cabinet in accordance with KD 3827.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:

The following options have been considered:

- Declining the possible purchase of the land potentially available to the council has been considered, but rejected due to the uncertain timescales associated with the vendor bringing the land to market and securing development and consequent benefits for the community;
- The use of compulsory purchase powers to acquire the land that comprises the opportunity, either as a package or individually has been considered, but this is not the council's first preference given the negotiations that are currently taking place with the land-owner, terms have been agreed and the sales and purchase contracts are drafted.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. To provide a greater level of certainty over the timescales associated with the development of three early start sites in Meridian Water and their relationship with significant rail and education infrastructure, and to increase developer and stakeholder confidence in the delivery of the Masterplan.
- 2. Acquisitions and therefore the control of land within the Meridian Water Masterplan area will help accelerate housing delivery.
- 3. The purchase of the sites will support the Meridian Water Housing Zone bid.
