#### Cabinet:

- 1. Resolved to make a Compulsory Purchase Order under section 226 1 (a) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended). The London Borough of Enfield (New Avenue Estate Regeneration) Compulsory Purchase Order 2015, to effect acquisition of land and new rights in respect of the land detailed in the report and shown outlined on the plan in Appendix 1 of the Report.
- 2. Noted the generic draft Statement of Reasons (attached as Appendix 2 of the report) which sets out the justification for making the Compulsory Purchase Order in relation to the Order Land referred to in Appendix 1 of the Report.
- 3. Agreed to delegate authority to the Director of Regeneration and Environment, acting in consultation with the Director of Finance, Resources and Customer Services, to take all necessary steps consequent to the making of a Compulsory Purchase Order, on the basis that there is a compelling case in the public interest to make the Order, including:
  - a) To publish the draft Compulsory Purchase Order, referred to within the report, to seek confirmation of the Secretary of State and if confirmed, implement the Order;
  - b) To modify the statement of Reasons and the Order Plan and effect any other procedural requirements including (but not limited to) the publication and service of all notices and the presentation of the Councils case at any public inquiry;
  - c) To acquire any interests in land within the Order Land by agreement and the making of payments equivalent to the market value of the property interest being acquired plus any statutory payments and disturbance compensation or the provision of property services in lieu of the market value of the property interest being acquired and any statutory payments and disturbance compensation, in contemplation of the Order being made; and
  - d) If and when the Order is confirmed then to acquire by compulsion and make payments of statutory compensation, if voluntary agreements cannot be reached.

#### **DECISION**

**AGREED:** subject to no call-in being received, the following decisions will come into effect on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> September 2015:

- 1. To note the contents of the Report.
- 2. To award the contract to the highest scoring contractor, Contractor A for the supply and installation of specified new play equipment, outdoor gym equipment and safer surfacing within the Borough's play area.

#### **ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:**

- 1. Not to let the contract:
- Play equipment has limited lifespan and items that no longer meet British and European Standards would have to be removed from the play area
- Over time, with deteriorating equipment, a play area would need to be closed to mitigate the health and safety risks to the public;
- It would bring into question the Council's commitment to promoting healthy lifestyles and outdoor exercise for local children.
- 2. To let the contract as an open tender under the Official Journal of the Eastern Union (OJEU) Procurement Regulations. This would substantially increase the timescale required to undertake the procurement without improving the likely value of the bids received.

# **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:**

It is recommended to award the Contract because:

- The new contract will satisfy the Council's statutory duty of care to maintain play areas to British and European Standards;
- New equipment will provide savings compared to ongoing and more frequent maintenance costs of old equipment;
- New and safe equipment will continue to bring pleasure and enjoyment to the young residents of Enfield;
- It will engage children in physical and outdoor activity, promoting healthy lifestyles.
