1.0 LICENSING HISTORY

- 1.1 The premises licence (LN/201500631) for this premises was issued on 23 October 2015, naming Ms Alisha Patterson as both the named premises licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS).
- 1.2 The application was subject to initial representations from the Police and Licensing Authority, who sought a reduction of hours to that proposed, and modification to conditions. Agreement to the amendments was met by all parties, and the representations were subsequently withdrawn.
- 1.3 On 2 March 2016, Ms Patterson applied for a Temporary Event Notice until 4am. The Police objected and Miss Patterson subsequently withdrew the TEN application.
- 1.4 On 16 March 2016, Ms Patterson applied for another Temporary Event Notice again until 4am. The Police objected and Miss Patterson subsequently withdrew the TEN application.

2.0 **CURRENT POSITION:**

- 2.1 The current Premises Licence permits:
- 2.1.1 Hours the premises are open to the public: 11.30am to midnight daily
- 2.1.2 Supply of alcohol (on supplies only): 12pam to 23:45 daily
- 2.2 A copy of a location map of the premises is attached as Annex 01.
- 2.3 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached as Annex 02.

3.0 THIS APPLICATION:

3.1 On 10 May 2016 the Metropolitan Police Service applied for a review of the premises licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 based on the

prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm licensing objectives.

- 3.2 Licensable activities have been provided after the permitted times, and breaches of licence conditions have been established on a number of occasions. The Police seek to revoke the premises licence.
- 3.3 A copy of the application is attached as Annex 03.
- 3.4 Additional information from the Police has been provided and is attached as Annex 04.

3.5

The application was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.

4.0 <u>RELEVANT REPRESENTATIONS</u>:

- 4.1 The Licensing Authority support the Police review application have made representations based on the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance and public safety licensing objectives.
- 4.2 A copy of the Licensing Authority representation is attached as Annex 05.
- 4.3 The Licensing Authority has provided additional information which is attached as Annex 06.
- 4.4 On 7 June 2016, Miss Patterson submitted a signed statement in response to the review application, and is now attached as Annex 07.

5.0 <u>RELEVANT LAW, GUIDANCE & POLICIES</u>:

- 5.1.1 the Licensing Act 2003 ('Act'); or

- 5.3.3 the prevention of public nuisance: &
- 5.3.4 the protection of children from harm [Act s.4 (2)].

- 5.4 In carrying out its functions, the Sub-Committee must also have regard to:
- 5.4.1 the Council's licensing policy statement; &
- 5.4.2 guidance issued by the Secretary of State [Act s.4(3)].

Review:

- In reviewing a licence the Sub-Committee will consider, and take into account, the complaints history of the premises and all other relevant information [Pol s.10.3].
- Licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated premises supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual. (Guid 11.21)

Decision:

- 5.7 Having heard all of the representations (from all parties) the Sub-Committee must take such steps as it considers <u>appropriate</u> for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- 5.7.1 to modify the conditions of the licence;
- 5.7.2 to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- 5.7.3 to remove the designated premises supervisor
- 5.7.4 to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- 5.7.5 to revoke the licence [Act s.52].
- In deciding which of these powers to invoke, the Sub-Committee should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial action taken should generally be directed at these causes and should generally be directed at those causes and should always be no more than an <u>appropriate</u> and proportionate response [Guid s.11.20].

This letter concerns the application for a New Application Premises Licence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Please find the licence enclosed. Please check the details on the licence carefully, the Licensing Authority is prepared to correct any of our clerical errors within 28 days of the licence being issued.

Note - Transfers

On the grant of a transfer application, any notification or permit (under the Gambling Act 2005) in respect of gaming machines at the premises becomes null and void. A new notification or permit will need to be sought by the new holder of the premises licence (under the Licensing Act 2003) before gaming machines may be lawfully provided at the premises.

Please be advised that the licence does not override any restrictions on trading hours etc. that may apply to the premises in respect of planning permission and/or Sunday trading & etc.

Please be advised that a premises licence lapses if the holder of the licence: dies; becomes a person who lacks capacity (within the meaning of the Mental Capacity Act 2005) to hold the licence; becomes insolvent; is dissolved; or if it is a club, ceases to be a recognised club. An individual becomes insolvent on: the approval of a voluntary arrangement proposed by him; being adjudged bankrupt or having his estate sequestrated; or entering into a deed of arrangement made for the benefit of his creditors or a trust deed for his creditors. A company becomes insolvent on: the approval of a voluntary arrangement proposed by its directors; the appointment of an administrator in respect of the company; the appointment of an administrative receiver in respect of the company; or going into liquidation.

The licence, or a certified copy of it, must be kept on the premises at all times and must be produced on request to any authorised officer. The summary of the licence must be prominently displayed within the premises.

The London Fire Brigade advise as follows:

- (2) where an engineered solution or BS 9999 has been used to increase capacity;
- (3) where capacity is risk-critical; for example where the premises use has a higher occupancy factor than that which the building was designed for.

Where applicable, capacity should normally be inclusive of staff and performers. Management should be able to demonstrate a realistic method of controlling capacity.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

The Mandatory Conditions are attached and form part of the Operating Schedule of your licence/certificate. You must ensure that the operation of the licensed premises complies with the attached Mandatory Conditions as well as the Conditions in Annex 2 and Annex 3 (if applicable). Failure to do this can lead to prosecution or review of the licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. All staff shall receive induction and refresher training (at least every three months) relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence.
- 2. All training relating to the sale of alcohol and the times and conditions of the premises licence shall be documented and records kept at the premises. These records shall be made available to the Police and/or Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year.
- 3. A 'Think 25' proof of age scheme shall be operated and relevant material shall be displayed at the premises.
- 4. A written record of refused sales shall be kept on the premises and completed when necessary. This record shall be made available to Police and/or the Local Authority upon request and shall be kept for at least one year from the date of the last entry.
- 5. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where those leaving the premises can read them.
- 6. Deliveries to the premises shall only be made between 09:00 19:00.
- 7. All refuse and bottles shall be disposed of in bins quietly so as not to disturb neighbours or local residents. There shall be no disposal of glass bottles outside between 21:00 hours and 08:00 hours.
- 8. After 21:00 children shall only be permitted to enter and remain on the premises if accompanied by an adult at all times.
- 9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system.
- (1) All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
- (2) All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
- (3) Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorized officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- (4) The CCTV system should be updated and maintained according to police recommendations.


- (5) A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorized council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 10. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- (1). All crimes reported to the venue
- (2). All ejections of patrons
- (3). Any complaints received
- (4). Any incidents of disorder
- (5). All seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (6). Any faults in the CCTV system
- (7). Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 11. There shall be no entry or re-entry of patrons to the premises after 2300 hours every day.
- 12. There shall be no admittance of patrons from the rear entrance.
- 13. With the exception of gaming machines, there shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 14. A minimum of 6 prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed throughout the premises, including all the toilets, warning customers that drug use will not be tolerated.
- 15. The premises shall operate the Local Authority or similar proof of age scheme and display the relevant material. Only passport, photographic driving licences or ID with the P.A.S.S. logo (Proof of Age Standards Scheme) may be accepted.
- 16. All doors and windows shall be kept closed but not locked during opening times.
- 17. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all public exits from the premises requesting customers respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and area quietly. These notices shall be positioned at eye level and in a location where they can be read by those leaving the premises.
- 18. A sign shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises informing customers of the last time of entry to the premises.
- 19. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be to a person seated taking a table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 20. Not withstanding condition (19), alcohol may be supplied and consumed prior to their meal in the designated bar area, by up to a maximum at any one time, of (6) persons dining at the premises.

- 21. With the exception of gaming machines, there shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 22. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.

The Silverhawk Caribbean Jerk Cuisine is a restaurant with capacity of approx 35/40 patrons. The DPS is the PLH which has been held for 6 months. She is failing to promote all four of the licensing objectives, which are, The prevention of crime and disorder, Public safety, The protection of children from harm and The prevention of public nuisance.

Licensing officers have visited premises on 4 occasions. The premises has been seen to be operating outside of operating hours and on the 3 internal visits the DPS has breached numerous conditions of the licence.

Police do not have confidence in the ability of the PLH to deal with any issues that may arise as she does not appear to understand the licensing objectives, or in fact know what they are.

With each visit the PLH has been offered assistance and guidance, explanations have been given regarding each breach but unfortunately on the final visit there were still numerous breaches.

The PLH does not instill the Police with any confidence that she intends to or is capable of adhering to the conditions of the licence. The PLH appeared quite detached from it all, showed no emotion and was unable to offer reasonable explanations as to why all conditions had not been met. Police have serious concerns that the licensing objectives are not being promoted and that she will not be able to take on the added responsibility of the increased risk that will arise whilst operating.

Below is a condensed version of events. A full statement with all facts has been written by PC237YE STAFF and is submitted with this form.

Premises licence obtained in Oct 2015 to run as a restaurant - drink ancillary to meals.

Since then the DPS has operated outside of her licensing conditions with noise complaints being received by police and also Police seeing at first hand breaches being made by still operating outside of hours.

Posters seen advertising promoted event and calling itself a wine bar-

In February a full licence inspeaction was made and 3 breaches to the Act and 8 breaches to the licence found. DPS offered help and advise and given contact no.

Nothing heard from her.

In March another full inspection made and all the same breaches were found. DPS again educated regarding promoting the objectives and confirmed she knew contact no and offered help and advise again.

Even though help was offered and advice given at each stage, at no time has the DPS contacted the Police for help.

In April another visit was made and again 2 breaches to the Act and 3 breaches to the licence were found and still the DPS did not appear to understand the severity of the situation and again appeared non plussed that conditions breached and in fact at this stage did not know what the licensing objectives were.

Police have no confidence in the PLH/DPS and due to not being able to adhere to the relatively simple task of her conditions she has not shown any ability in promoting the licence objectives.

In conclusion the Police seek to revoke the Licence. We do not feel a change in DPS will suffice as the current DPS is also the PLH and will therefore still have a controlling factor and it with her that the Police do not have any confidence. The MPS feel that these measures are wholly proportionate and reasonable and an appropriate measure to promote the licensing objectives,

Premises was operating at 0110 hours in the morning with patrons being allowed entry, the lights were low and loud music with an MC could be heard.

The metal shutters on the rear of the venue were also down but left open a foot above the ground. Loud music could be heard along with somebody on a microphone

The venue should be shut at 0000 hours and is conditioned to be a restaurant not a club as it appeared to be.

16th February 2016

Police conducted a licensing inspection.

The licence was inspected and there were eight (8) breaches to the licence found. There could possibly have been more, however the CCTV was unsurpringsly unavailable to view. This is a main concern.

Breaches to Licensing Act:-

Inside the venue were professional looking posters promoting a previous event at the venue on the 30th January

2016 advertising itself as a wine bar.

The above matters and Police concerns were discussed with Alesha. She was warned and reminded that she is to run as a restaurant and not as a bar/nightclub. The added dangers that this brings were highlighted to her and in my opinion she did not appear to be aware of them which is a concern.

Notification of alleged offences under the Licensing Act 2003 was served to the DPS and fully explained

2nd March 2016

TEN received for a party with recorded music until 0400.

3rd March 2016

Police conducted a further visit to venue. DPS in attendance.

Again there were the same breaches of the Licensing Act and numerous breaches of her licence conditions. DPS explained that she was not yet operating in accordance with her licence, however, at the time of visiting alcohol was on view and being offered for sale at the bar with spirits in the optics/racks and price listings all still visible with no attempt to remove from public display. It was explained that this was a breach, which she struggled to understand.

DPS was asked about the event and how she would further promote the licensing objectives, she said she didn't know and that it was being arranged by the promoter.

Police tried to educate the DPS as to the importance of adhering to the conditions and what they are promoting. Contact details were given so that she could clarify things if she did not understand.

Police put in an objection to the TENs

20th April 2016

A further licensing inspection took place and unfortunately there were still breaches of her licence .:-

When asked about the alcohol the DPS stated that the spirits in the optics had not been there on Monday when another Licensing Officer had attended on a reassurance visit. She stated that another member of staff put them back. It was explained that she was the DPS and therefore needs to be in control. It was obvious that the alcohol had been put back up for sale once the officer left. Although CCTV is installed the DPS has not done so in accordance with the conditions and the entrance/exits were not covered. Also the DPS was not knowledgeable

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enough of the system to catch a particular time or download any images. At this stage after 3 inspection visits it is very concerning that conditions are not being met. There is no confidence that if the bear minimum of adhering to the premises licence conditions are not being met, then the Police have no confidence that the DPS can operate this venue responsibly promoting the licence objectives. The DPS has also put on promoted events and these bring their own added risks, so much so that venues that regularly hold these events submit a detailed risk assessment form to a Police Intelligence Team who conduct checks on Police Indices to identify any known risks at the time. This form is a Met Police Form 696 and to this date the Police have not received a 696 from Silverhawk restaurant. The DPS does not appear to understand or appreciate the importance of promoting the objectives. In fact when asked on the last visit if she knew what they were, she replied she did not. The potential for disorder, nuisance and violence is high.

Ms PATTERSON is the PLH and DPS for this venue. At the application stage and at every meeting or visit since, Police contact details have been left or confirmed with her, offering help and advice. At no time has Ms PATTERSON contacted the Police Licensing Team.

This premises has had a premises licence for 6 months now and at no point has the licence been adhered to. In fact there is worrying evidence that has since come to light to suggest unlicensed activity was taking place long before this.

Ms PATTERSON has been complacent in running this venue in breach of her licence and showing a disregard to the licensing objectives. The onus is on Ms PATTERSON to promote the licence objectives and she is clearly failing to do so. The Police have made repeated attempts to ensure compliance but to no avail.

Ms PATTERSON does not own the business/building which in itself creates difficulties.

The Police contend that there are no other alternatives but to seek the revocation of the licence.

The MPS feel that this measure is wholly proportionate and reasonable and an appropriate measure to promote the licensing objectives and reduce the risk of crime, disorder, public safety and nuisance.





- (5) A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised Council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Sec 10 An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the Police.

This was very disappointing considering you had had two (2) previous visits from the team bringing your attention to the breaches under your licence and making the effort to educate and assist you. Contact details were given to you to request assistance should you need it.

In view of this we do not feel confident that you are able to promote the licensing objectives and in fact will not be able to cope with the risks involved in running a licensed premises. You have not shown to us that you have an understanding of the objectives and fear that there is a high risk of crime and disorder occurring. By failing to adhere to your conditions you are committing criminal offences and failing to promote the licensing objectives.

It is now our intention to request a review with the Licensing Authority to revoke your premises licence.

The Metropolitan Police as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 reserve the right to initiate a Review of your Premises License and take enforcement action with reference to the commission of offences under the Licensing act 2003.

I certify that I have considered this review and I wish to make representations supporting the review application as activities at the premises are detrimental to the Licensing Objectives for the following reasons:

Background History:

The licence for this premises was granted on 23/10/15. The application was made in part following a visit by Licensing Enforcement Officers in May 2015 who witnessed unlicensed activities taking place. **See Appendix 1**. During the application process both I and Police Licensing Officer, PC Gary Marsh met with the applicant. I made the applicant aware that noise complaints had been received by the council about loud music coming from this premises in the past and PC Marsh made them aware of his concerns that people might try and hire out the venue for club nights.

The applicant was also advised that alcohol licensed premises are automatically entitled to provided recorded music until 23:00 without the need for it to be listed on their licence. Given this information and the previous noise complaints the applicant agreed to remove recorded music from their application and to only provide it until 23:00.

The premises is currently licensed to provide the following activities:

This review application (submitted by the police) is the result of breaches of licence conditions and licence times.

Location:

This premises is located in a parade of shops on High Street, Enfield. There are residential properties above some of the shops, and in nearby side streets.

Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP)

This premises is located in a Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) area. The current licensed hours are within those specified in the CIP. As demonstrated in the CIP this location is an area of concern in relation to crime and disorder and public nuisance.

Police Intelligence Reports and statements

In the 8 months since this licence was granted police have witnessed repeated alleged breaches of the Licensing Act 2003 and repeated alleged breaches of licence conditions.

These have led to a lack of confidence in the current DPS' ability to comply with the licence. They appear to have handed control of the business over to club night promoters. The current DPS does not appear to appreciate the consequences of committing the alleged offences or allowing the licence breaches to occur.

By virtue of the entry into force of Section 85 of the Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Act 2012 on 12 March 2015, a number of offences under the Licensing Act 2003 are no longer limited to the previous statutory maximum financial penalty of £20,000.

The maximum penalties for some of the less serious offences remain unchanged – and indeed some offences remain limited to £5,000 or less. However, there is now no statutory limitation for the more serious offences, such as: Carrying on unauthorised licensable activities (s136).

Breaching licence conditions and or trading after the licensed hours are offences under s.136 of the Act.

Had the premises been licensed to trade as a nightclub then a whole range of additional conditions would have been requested especially in relation to promoted events.

The layout of the premises is such that from the front most people wouldn't realize that there was a room at the back of the premises. There are some tables in the back room but if these were moved back it is estimated that the venue would hold around 80-100 people if standing in line with a vertical drinking venue such as a wine bar.

Council Records since Licence Issued

27th **December 2015** – 05:46 – Noise complaint received from local resident stating that the last two Saturday nights until 05:30 / 06:30 on Sunday morning residents have been disturbed by loud music, amplified noise and rowdy drunk customers shouting and arguing in the street. The complainant advised that there was no noise team available at this time and that there have been previous problems with this address.

22nd January 2016 – An officer spoke to the complainant who said that there have been no further issues. They said most of the problems were over the Christmas period and that they started during the early hours of the morning. The main issues were loud music and people noise and men and women urinating outside the back of

the premises. The officers phoned the premises and spoke to a member of staff called Sharon. The Premises Licence Holder was not on site. The member of staff said that the 26th December was their Christmas party. Advised her of complaint and left details asking PLH to call officer to discuss. No return call received.

<u>Planning</u>

The Planning Enforcement Team is currently investigating this premises as they are trading without the necessary planning permission.

P13-02743PND - there was a Notification made for the property to operate as an A3 Use for 2 years from 23/9/2013.

There have been no applications for a formal change of use and the property has not reverted to its original A1 use and the current use of the property is therefore unlawful.

P/App - P12-03184PLA for - 'Change of use of ground floor from (A1) to restaurant (A3) together with extractor flue at rear and alterations to shopfront' was refused.

Conclusion:

The Licensing Authority has no confidence in the current Premises Licence Holder / DPS as a result of the repeated alleged breaches and offences witnessed by the police and therefore support the police review to revoke the licence.

If the Licensing Sub Committee is not minded to revoke the licence in its entirety the Licensing Authority recommends that they consider removing the Designated Premises Supervisor and suspending the licence until a new DPS has been appointment and compliance with all of the licence conditions has been demonstrated to the satisfaction of the police.

- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance



WITNESS STATEMENT

This statement (consisting of 4 pages) is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

I, Alisha Rochelle Patterson, of the Silver Hawk Caribbean Jerk Cuisine, 68 High Road, Enfield, London,.. will say as follows:

- I am the Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Silver Hawk Caribbean Jerk Cuisine, 68 High Road, Enfield, London, EN3 43R ("the Premises").
- 2. The Premises licence number is LN/201500631.
- 3. I am over 18 years of age. I am of good character.
- 4. I have been served with an application to review the Premises Licence in respect of the premises that has been submitted by PC Karen STAFF the licencing officer of the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) covering out area. I refer to matters contained within his statement that accompanied that application.
- 5. I believe that this is an unfounded application and ask that the Sub-committee reject it.
- 6. There is an undercurrent, both in the statement of PC Karen Staff and the general demeanour of police officers who attend the premises, that it will attract gangsters and people from opposing gangs. I do not know where that belief comes from and would like an explanation. I would also like to know how many of the non-Caribbean restaurants that are in the same area as the Premises, have had his raised as a reason for a licence review.

- 7. Before referring directly to the matters raised in the statement if PC Karen Staff, it should be noted that since the Premises opened there have been:
 - No incidents of crime and disorder
 - No incidents causing public nuisance
 - No incidents risking public safety at the premises; and
 - No incidents risking the Protection of Children from Harm at the premises.
- 8. I shall now respond to the assertions contained in the statement of PC Karen Staff:

23 October 2015

We were not informed of these complaints and neither the police nor the Environmental Health Services visited the Premises. It is not said in the statement what these supposed breaches of our licence were. We were not operating as a nightclub/bar.

• 14 February 2016

This was a private party and if the police had come into the premises, which we would have allowed them do, then they would have seen that. There were no members of the public allowed in. On this occasion we should have applied for a temporary licence and we did not. Since then if we have wanted to have an event that is outside our licencing hours we have applied in the correct and complied with the decision taken in relation to that application.

16 February 2016

There was a fault with the CCTV which we were not aware of until it had to be viewed; we did not refuse access to the CCTV equipment and the repair was carried out.

Statutory breaches

Sections 57 (7) and 135(4) – Premises licence part b was mounted on the wall part A was in box and it states personal information such as my home address. My personal licence was not on the premises at that time; I now keep a copy of it on the Premises for inspection.

Section 136 (1) – see the answer for 14 February 2016 above

Breaches to premises licence

1 and 2 are denied. Staff have received training and the training had been recorded. At the time did not do all the paperwork for the Premises at the Premises and I did not keep it there. I was happy to provide this to the officers.

- 4. There was no record to keep as there had been no refused sales. We have not had minors attempting to buy alcohol and we have not had people so intoxicated that we had to refuse them alcohol. We have also not sold alcohol out outside of our permitted hours.
- 9. The police told us that our CCTV system was not in compliance with the licence as there were not enough cameras. So we later added more cameras. We asked them to put in writing any further issues that they had with the CCTV cameras and received nothing. Our cameras do cover the entrance and exit of the premises.
- We have always had an incident log and made it available.
- 11. This has happened in the past, see the answer for 14 February 2016 but has not happened since.
- 16. We have not breached this and there is no evidence provided to suggest that we have.
- 18. We now have this.

It was during this inspection that it was first mentioned that our restaurant was a "natural hangout" for gang members and that we were in a position between gangs in Edmonton and Ponders End. I was upset with this; just because we are a Caribbean restaurant it does not mean that we are a magnet for gang activity.

3[™] March 2016

I deny that all the same breaches were present. However, there was on this occasion a fuller conversation between myself and the police officer who attended. Some had been actioned or were in the process of being actioned.

20 April 2016

Statutory breaches

s.57 (7) – both the premises licence and personal licence was shown and was kept in a folder and also shown on the wall behind the bar which is visible and was recognise by Gary on a previous visit.

s.136(1) – this is completely denied. Alcohol is only sold in accordance with our licence. At the request of the police I have now taken down the optics, but I thought that they were a good way to comply with Annex 1, section 7 (a)(ii) and 7(b) as they showed the price and ensured compliance with the measurement.

Breaches to premises licence

It is clear from here that we are complying with the conditions. The police found less

breaches than on the previous visit.

4. There have not been any refused sales as per our previous answer in relation this. If

there had been they would have been recorded. I cannot prove something that has not

happened.

9. All of these conditions have been complied. After the previous visit we installed new

cameras. The entrances and exits are fully covered. I know how to operate the system

and showed them that I could record and do playback - I could have produced a specific

day and time.

10. There is an incident log and it has always been made available when requested

9. I did not tell the police that I did not know the objectives; the way that the restaurant has

been run clearly shows that I do. When asked to tell the officers what the objectives were I

felt pressurised by them and did not articulate myself very well, but I explained them. I was

then told that I should have been able to recite the licensing objectives; to me being able to

recite the objectives does not show an understanding of them.

10. I have had a licence since 23 October 2015. At the beginning I did not see the importance of

something such as having my personal licence available at all times. I now am compliant

with all the licence conditions that come with running my restaurant and I do not want to

lose my business by non-compliance.

11. As a woman owning a small business, which has employees, I feel that I am a role model to

other is the local area. I take that very seriously and ask the Panel to take into account that I

have positively responded to teething problems with my business.

12. If this application is considered by the sub-committee, I would ask you to find that the

revocation of my licence is not a proportionate response to the alleged breaches
