#### AGREED:

- 1. The indicative budgets set by Full Council at its meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> February 2017, for public realm improvements, bridge & highway structures and flood prevention be approved as confirmed budgets.
  - That approval is given to the:
- 2. Items of work and breakdown of funding, as shown in table 2 of this report and explained in paragraphs 4.1 to 4.8
- 3. Schedules of carriageway schemes contained in Appendix 1 of this report
- 4. Schedules of footway schemes contained in Appendix 2 of this report.
- 5. Schedules of structures and watercourses schemes contained in Appendix 3 of this report
- 6. Placing of orders through any existing relevant term contract, procure alternative term contracts for minor works, or to invite and evaluate tenders/quotations and, where suitable tenders/quotations are received, to award contracts for works as appropriate.
- 7. That authority be given to the Executive Director for Regeneration & Environment to amend the programme of works and funding allocations within the approved budgets as necessary for operational reasons.
- 8. That authority be given to the Head of Highway Services to adjust the approved estimate costs of individual schemes as a result of progressing the detailed designs, subject to costs being contained within the overall agreed programme allocations and to reporting of revised costs to the Executive Director for Regeneration & Environment on a quarterly basis.

#### **ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:**

- 1. As set out in paragraphs 3.2 and 3.3, a sustained level of capital funding is essential to maintain the condition of the highway network. Any alternative to sustained levels of capital funding would go against prevention and proper assessment management principles, resulting in greater reactive maintenance and continued deterioration of the highway network, for which even greater capital funding will be required in the future.
- 2. As advised in paragraph 3.5, realistically, sufficient funding for the UK local road network will only be achieved with sustained support from central government over and above its commitment to the strategic road network.

#### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. Confirmation of the capital budget, allocated to the items of work shown in table 2 will allow the Council to continue with its programme of maintaining the condition of its carriageways, footways and associated highway assets.
- 2. A sustained level of capital funding is essential to maintain the highway network and avoid potentially more costly maintenance in future years.
- 3. Appendices 1, 2 and 3 identify specific schemes associated with the main highway assets that have been prioritised for treatment. These schemes have been identified as having the highest urgency for treatment or where it is considered that intervention this year will prevent further and more costly deterioration in future years.
