

## Safer Neighbourhood Board Report 24<sup>th</sup> July 2019.

### Performance Framework

- **Summary**

Total Notifiable Offences in Enfield have increased by 9% in the year ending May 2019. In London, there has been a smaller increase of 5.4% in the same period.

Residential Burglaries in Enfield have increased by 11.1% in the year ending May 2019.

Serious Youth Violence has decreased in the last year in Enfield by 5.2% and London has also experienced a similar decrease of 2.2% in the same period. Enfield is currently the 2nd highest borough in London for Serious Youth Violence victims.

Domestic Abuse with Injury has increased in Enfield by 2.6% in the year to May 2019.

ASB calls have reduced in Enfield by 1.2% in the year ending May 2019, compared to same period in the previous year. In London they increased by 4% in the same period.

**Keeping young people safe and reducing their risks from crime**

- **Serious Youth Violence**

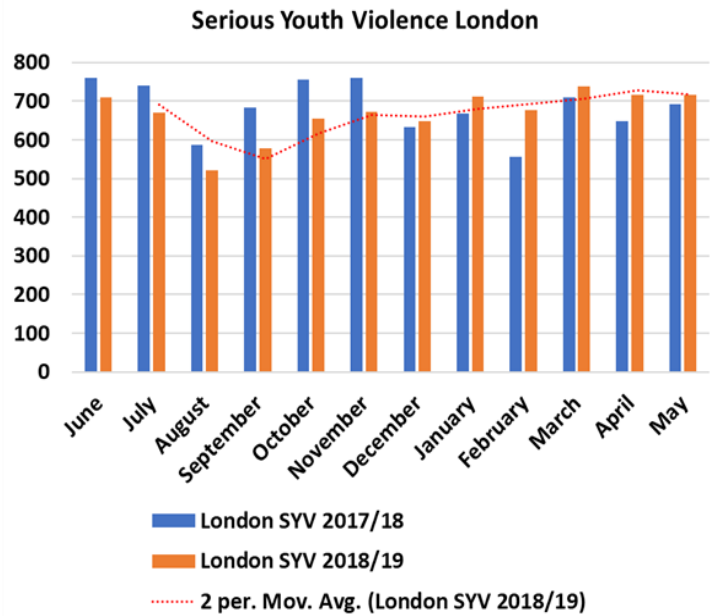
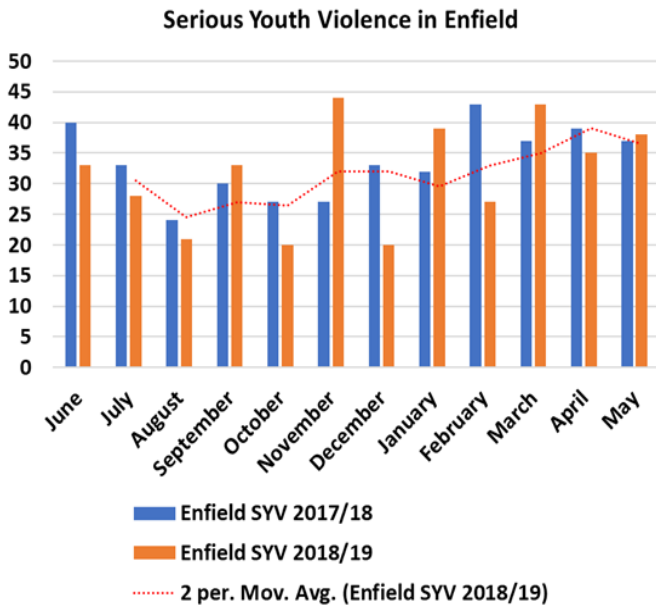
There have been 381 Serious Youth Violence<sup>1</sup> victims in the year to May 2019, compared to 402 the previous year, a decrease of 5.2% (n=21). London experienced a similar decrease of 2.2% in the same year.

The borough of Enfield recorded the second highest number of Serious Youth Violence victims out of all the 32 London boroughs and were marginally above our neighbouring borough Haringey, recording 380.

On average, Enfield recorded 32 serious youth violence victims a month in the last year, equating to just over one victim per day.

Although there has been a decrease in SYV year on year, since April 2019 there has been an increase on the borough in SYV victims, as shown in the chart below.

<sup>1</sup> **Serious Youth Violence** is defined as any offence of Most Serious Violence or Weapon enabled crime, where the victim is aged 1-19. This measure shows the number of victims aged 1-19 of these offences.

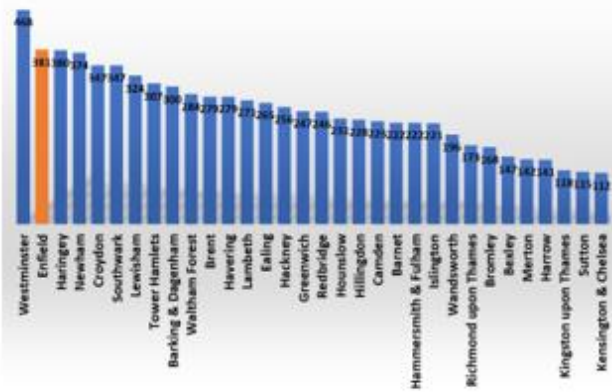

Enfield has the 4<sup>th</sup> largest youth population aged 1-19<sup>2</sup> in London accounting for just over a quarter of the total population. When considering the rate of SYV per 1000 population aged 1-19, Enfield recorded a rate of 4 over the last year.

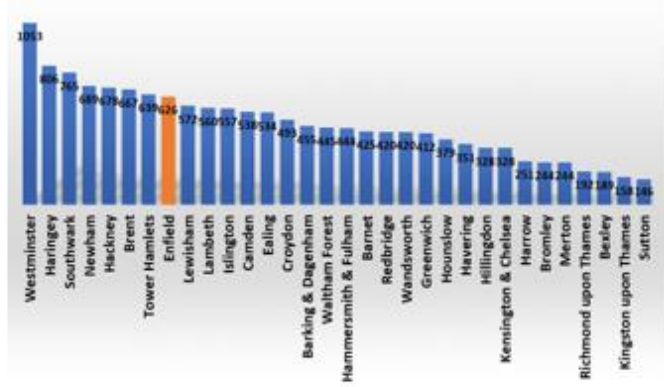

Charts 3-9: The below graphs show Enfield's position out of the 32 London boroughs for gang related offences.

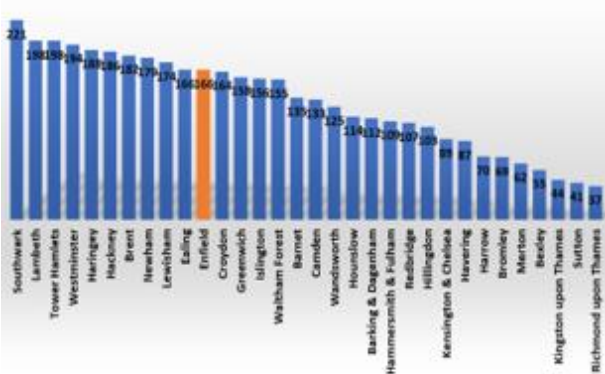

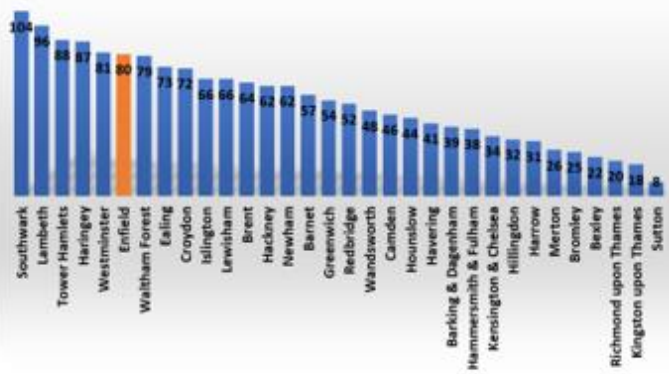
Knife Crime Offences



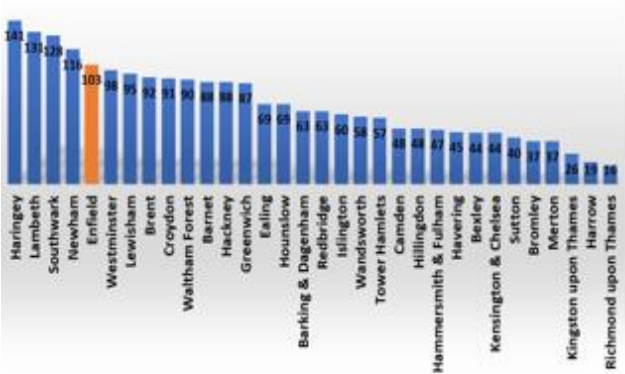
Knife Crime With Injury Offences



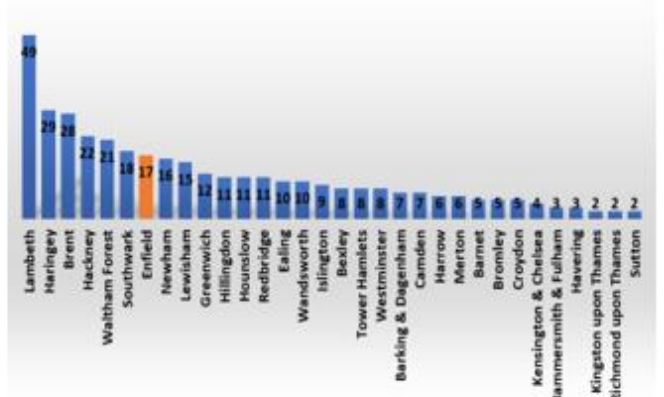
Knife Crime Injury Victims Not DA 1-24

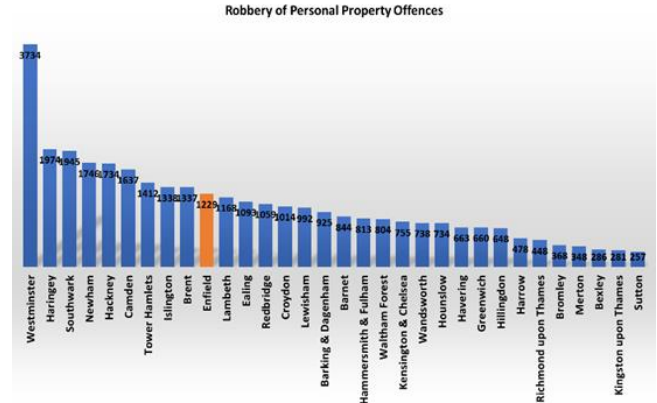
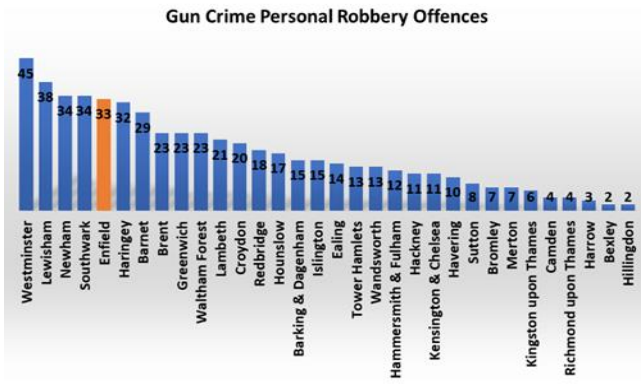


Gun Crime Offences



Gun Crime Lethal Barrelled Discharged Offences



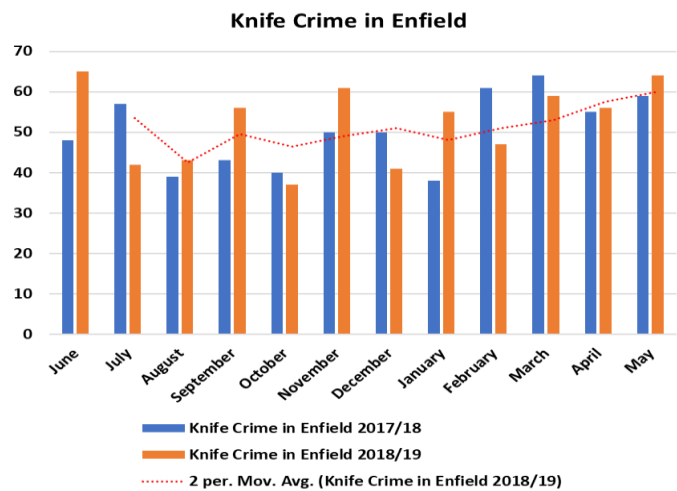


• **Knife Crime in Enfield**

In the year ending May 2019 Knife Crime<sup>3</sup> in Enfield has increased by 3.6%, compared to the previous year. London has experienced a small increase of 0.5% in the same period.

On average there has been 52 knife crime offences per month in the year ending April 2019, compared to 50 per month the previous year.

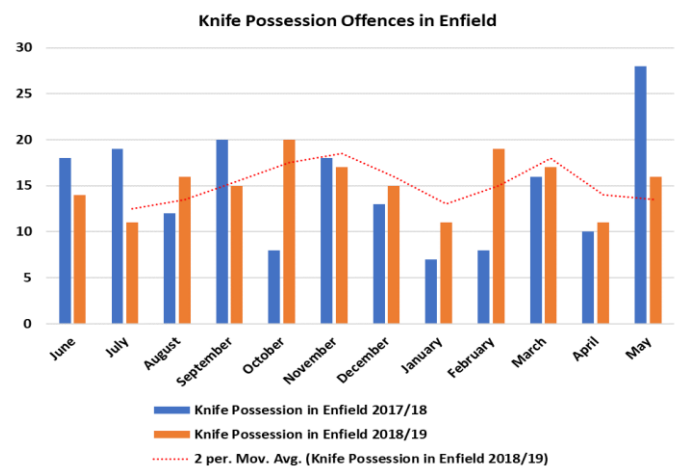
Knife Crime offences in May 2019 increased to 64, compared to 56 the previous month and were higher than this time last year.



• **Knife Crime Possession Offences**

In the year ending May 2019 Knife Crime Possession offences increased by 2.8%, compared to the previous year. London has experienced a 1.7% reduction in the same period.

Offences in May 2019 increased recording 16 offences after a reduction in offences since February 2019, however, they remain lower than this time last year.

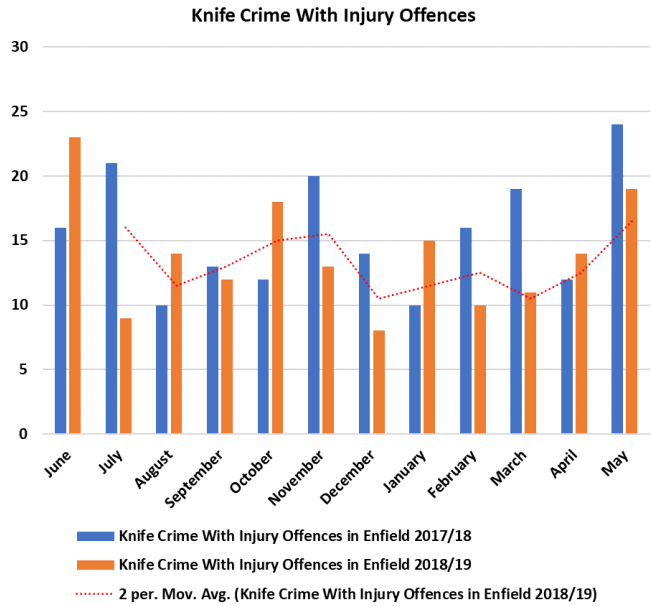


<sup>3</sup> **Knife crime** is defined in as an offence of homicide, attempted murder, assault with intent to cause harm, assault with injury, threats to kill, sexual offences (including rape) and robbery or where a knife or sharp instrument has been used to injure, used as a threat, or the victim was convinced a knife was present during the offence.

- **Knife Crime with Injury**

In the year ending May 2019 Knife Crime Injury offences had decreased by 11.2% recording 166, compared to previous year of 187. In London there was a reduction of 12%.

Although there has been a reduction year on year, since February 2019 there has been a steady increase month on month in knife crime injury victims in Enfield.

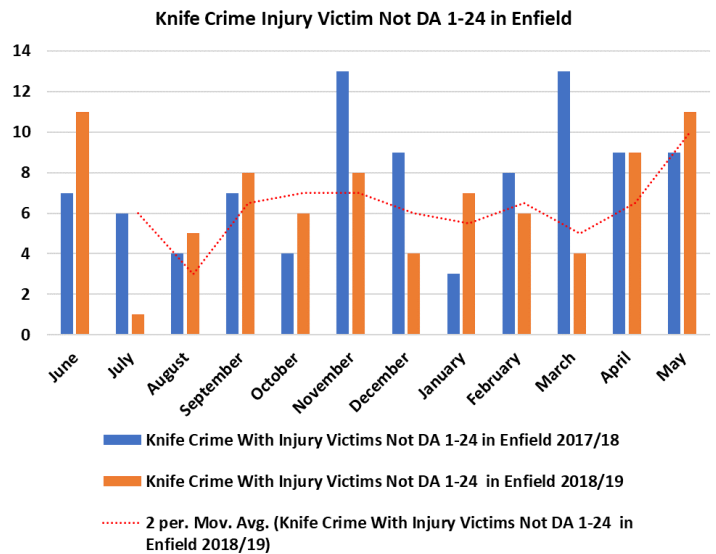


- **Non-Domestic Knife Crime Injury Victims Not DA Under 24**

Non-Domestic Knife Crime victims under 24 make up 48% (n=80) of all knife crime injury victims in Enfield and overall there has been a reduction of 13%, recording 80 victims in the last year, compared to 92 the previous year.

In London there was a reduction of 19.1% recording 1715 victims, compared to 2119 the previous year.

After a continual decrease in the first quarter of 2019, the number of young people who received a knife injury in April 2019 more than doubled, compared to the previous month March 2019 and continued to increase in April 2019.

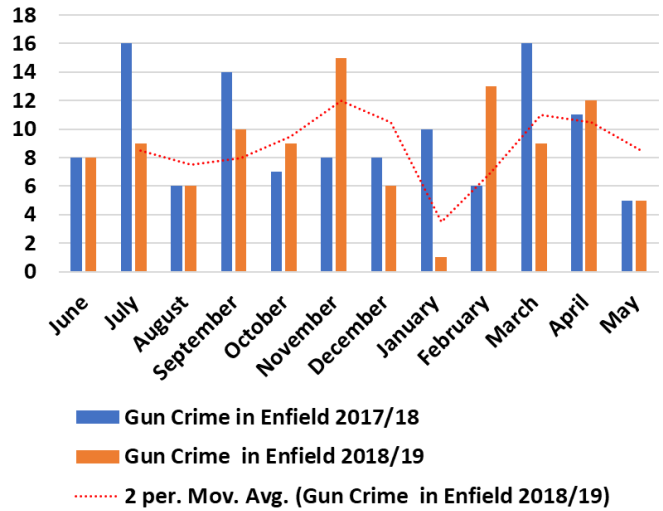


- **Gun Crime**

Gun crime<sup>4</sup> offences in Enfield decreased by 10.4%, recording 103 offences in the last year, compared to 115 the previous year. London experienced an 13.4% decrease in the same period.

Although there has been a decrease in gun crime in the borough year on year, in the last three months since February 2019, the number of offences has remained consistently above 8 offences per month. However, in May 2019 numbers dropped to 5, compared to 12 recorded in the previous month of April 2019.

**Gun Crime in Enfield**

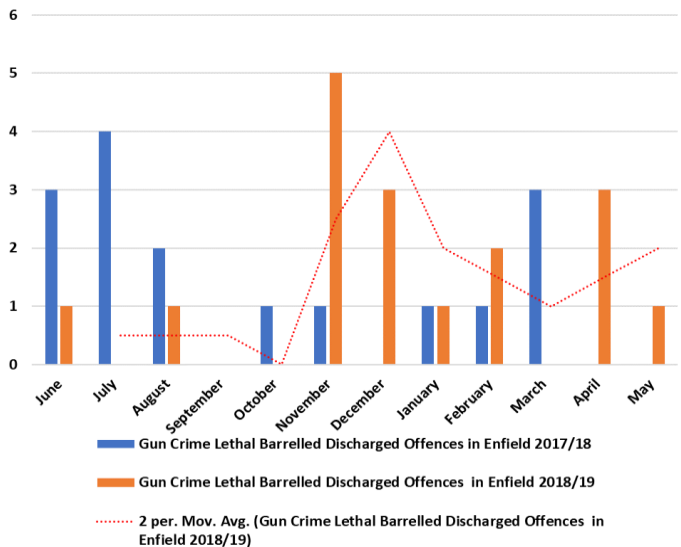


- **Gun Crime Lethal Barrelled Discharged Offences**

Gun crime lethal barrelled offences in Enfield recorded 17 in the year to April 2019, compared to 16 the previous year, an increase of 6.3%. London experienced a decrease of 9.1% in the same period.

In May 2019 there was only 1 offence, compared to the 3 offences recorded in the previous month.

**Gun Crime Lethal Barrelled Discharged Offences in Enfield**

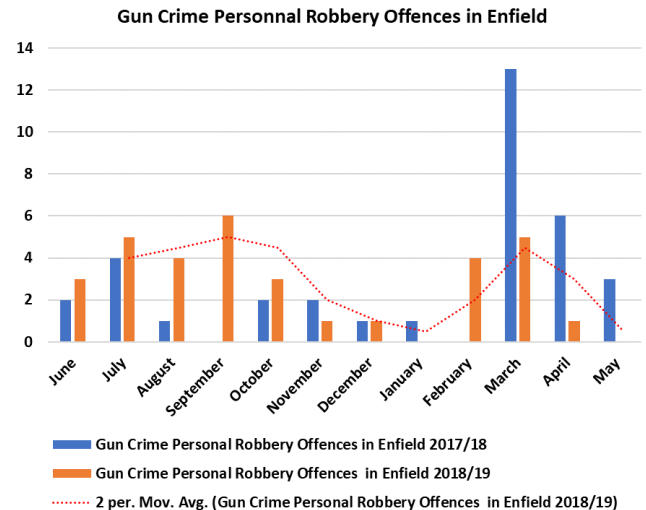


<sup>4</sup> **Gun Crime** is defined as an offence where a Firearm has been fired, any Firearm has been used as a blunt instrument to cause injury to a person, a Firearm has been intimidated and the victim was convinced a weapon was present or a Firearm has been used as a threat.

- **Gun Crime Personal Robbery**

Enfield recorded a total of 33 Gun Crime Personal Robbery offences, compared to 35 recorded the previous year a decrease of 5.7%. London recorded a decrease of 15.2%.

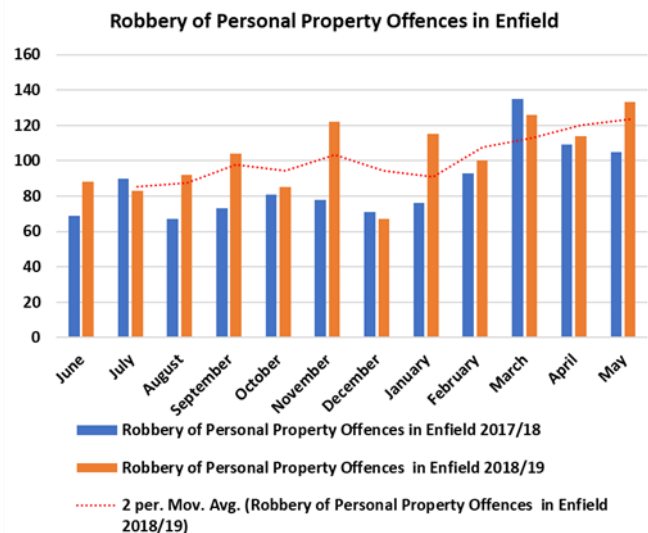
There were no recorded offences in May 2019, compared to the 1 offence recorded the previous month. So far this year, February (n=4) and March 2019 (n=5) have recorded the most offences.



- **Robbery of Personal Property Offences**

Robbery of personal property offences in Enfield increased by 17.4% recording 1229 in the year ending May 2019, compared to 1047 the previous year. In London there was an increase of 8.7% in the same period.

In May 2019 offences increased by 19 offences recording 133, compared to the previous month April 2019 recording 114 offences.



- **Section 60s Stop and Search and Violence with Injury**

The following analysis is a response to the action raised at the SSCB Meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> July 19 - Item 5.11. The action was to determine the impact of the increased stop and search on the borough in recent months.

Statutory powers exist under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act (PACE) for the police to search a person or vehicle without first making an arrest.

Under Section 60 of the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994 Police have the right to search people in a defined area during a specific time period when they believe, with good reason, that serious violence is anticipated.

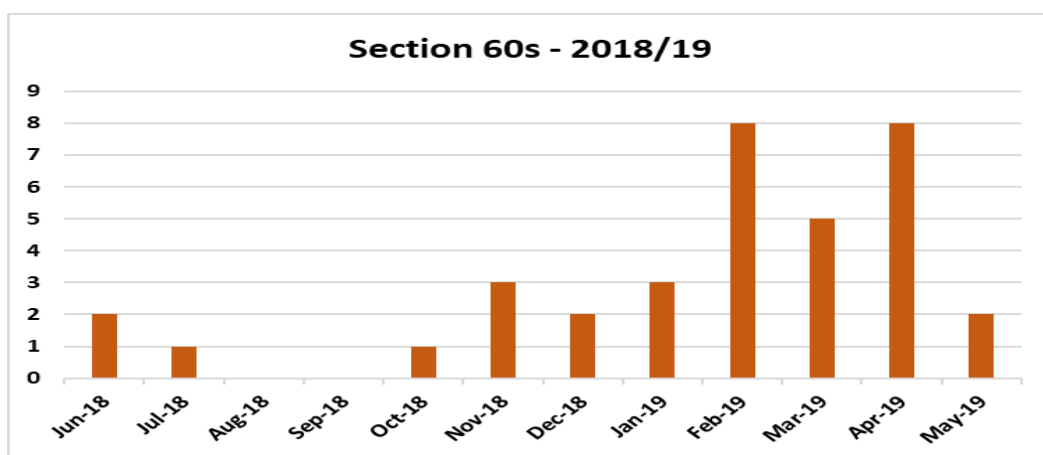


In the period from June 2018 to May 2019<sup>5</sup>, North Area BCU authorised 35 Section 60s, with at least one implemented every month except in August and September 2018. 22 were issued for Haringey area but these also incorporated some areas of Enfield, particularly the south eastern wards of Upper Edmonton, Edmonton Green and Haselbury.

13 Section 60s were issued for Enfield specifically, these mainly incorporated the wards crossing the eastern boundary of the A10. Each lasted 24-hours and on 7 occasions they occurred on consecutive days, ranging from 2 days to 6 days.

The distribution of the Section 60s through the year is shown below – 26 of the 35 authorised Section 60s occurred in the 5 months from January to May 2019.

Focussing on the 5 months from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019 (151 days) in Enfield, there were 2,949 stops throughout the period, the daily average was 20. There were 1,113 violence with injury (VWI) offences recorded in the borough in the same period, with an average of 7 offences per day.

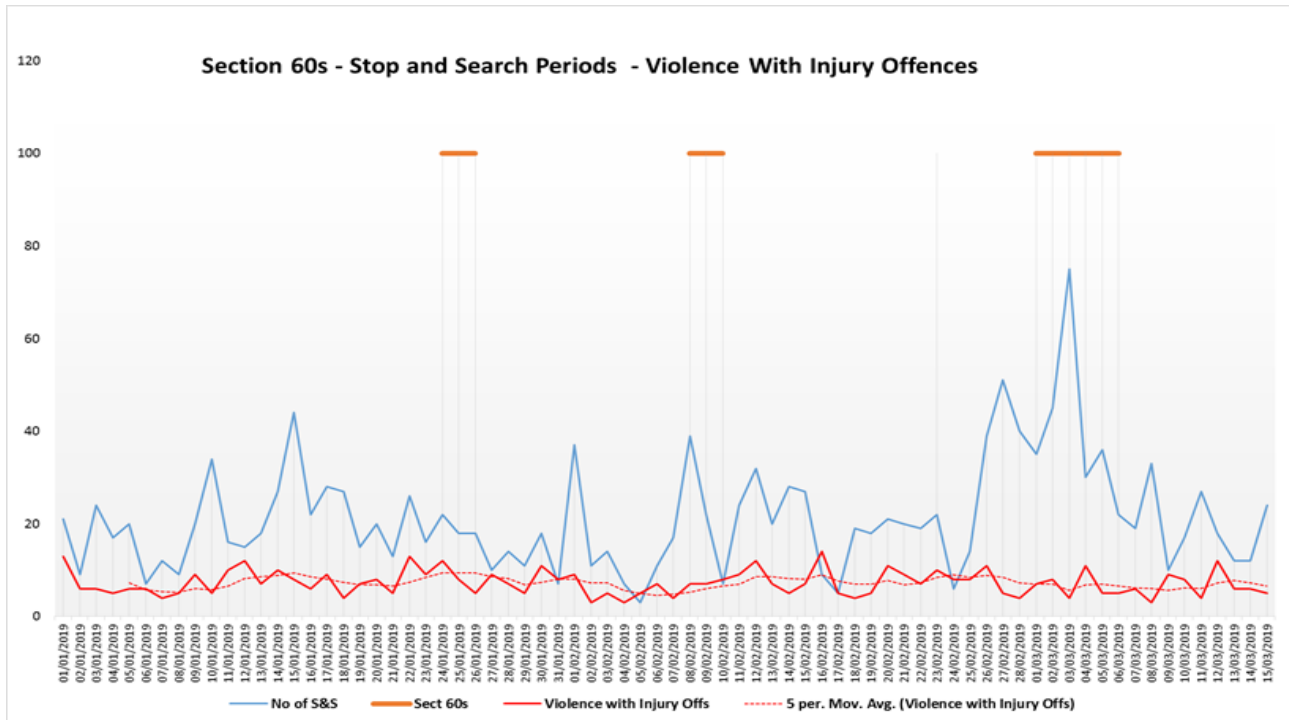
The following charts show the daily distribution of all stops in the review period, alongside VWI offences and the Section 60 occurrences in Enfield.

The review period charts are split into 2 periods for ease of illustration (from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 15<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and 16<sup>th</sup> March to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019) each followed by a summary table.

**Chart 11: The chart below shows the Section 60s, Stop and Search Periods and Violence with Injury offences in Enfield between 1st January to 15th March 2019**



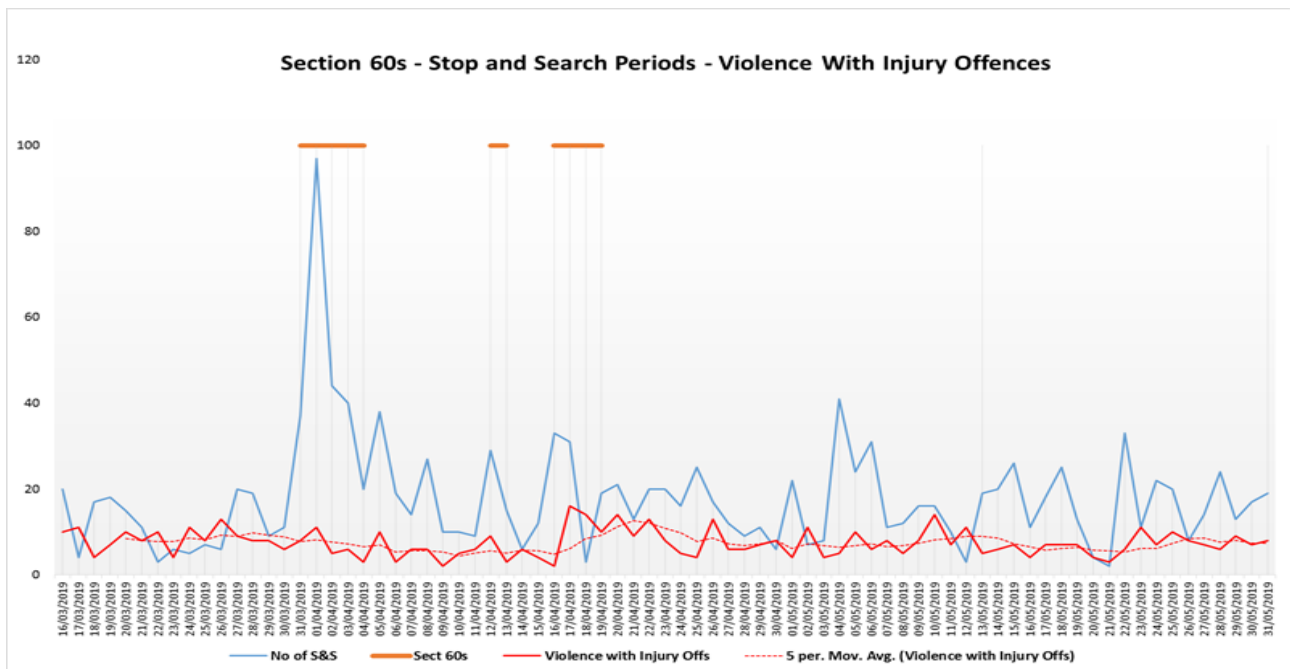

Looking first at the period from 1<sup>st</sup> January to 15<sup>th</sup> March 2019 - During regular PACE patrols there were peaks of violent crime on 12<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> January raising the daily average to 8 crimes per day.

Regular stop and searches increased after the violent crime peak on the 12<sup>th</sup> and rose again at the same time as the violent crime peak on the 22<sup>nd</sup> January. Both these trends may have contributed to the implementation of the first 3 Section 60s during this period, from 24<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> January. After this period, the violent crime average dropped to 6 daily along with a drop in the daily average number of stop and searches.

In the period from 16<sup>th</sup> March to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019. There was a peak in VWI offences on 26<sup>th</sup> March with 13 recorded, followed by an increase in regular stops on 27<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> March when there were over 45 stops each day.

5 Section 60s were then implemented from the 31<sup>st</sup> March to 4<sup>th</sup> April during which the average number of stops rose to an average of 46 per day while the violent crime offence average remained at 7 daily and remained at this level until the next Section 60 on 12<sup>th</sup> April.

The highest number of VWI offences recorded on a single day was on the 17<sup>th</sup> April with 16 recorded in Enfield. These occurred while 4 consecutive Section 60s were put in place by Haringey Borough Command Unit from 16<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> April.

There were no days when there were no VWI offences recorded. The days when the lowest number of VWI offences were recorded (e.g. 2 or 3 records) often occurred just after or during Section 60s.

**Reducing Burglary and Keeping People Safe in the Home**

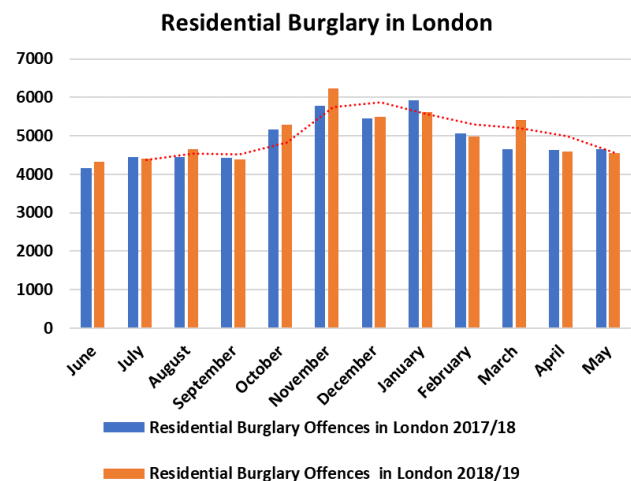
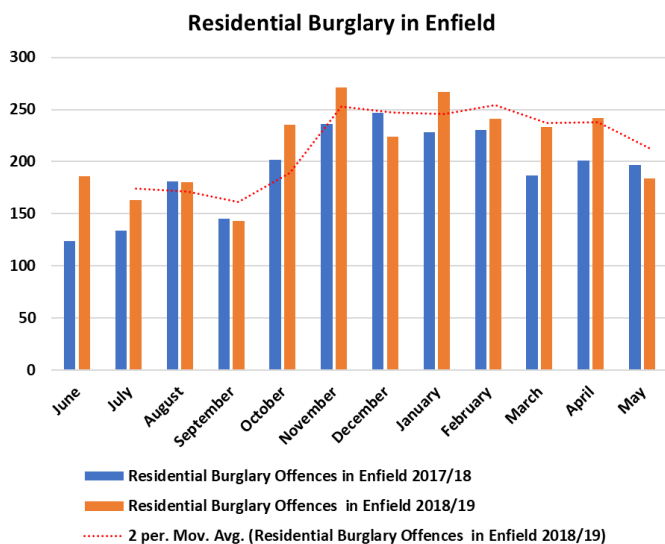
• **Residential Burglary**

There were 2569 Residential Burglaries in Enfield in the year ending May 2019, compared to 2312 in the previous year, an increase of 11%. Enfield is significantly above London which recorded an increase of 1.9% in the same period.

Enfield is a large borough with an estimated 131,707 households (GLA Estimates 2017) which equates to a rate of 20 residential burglaries in the last year per 1000 households in Enfield, compared to 23 residential burglaries<sup>6</sup> in our neighbouring borough Haringey.

Since January 2019, there has been a steady decline in residential burglaries in Enfield with May recording the lowest month this year and was lower than the same time last year.

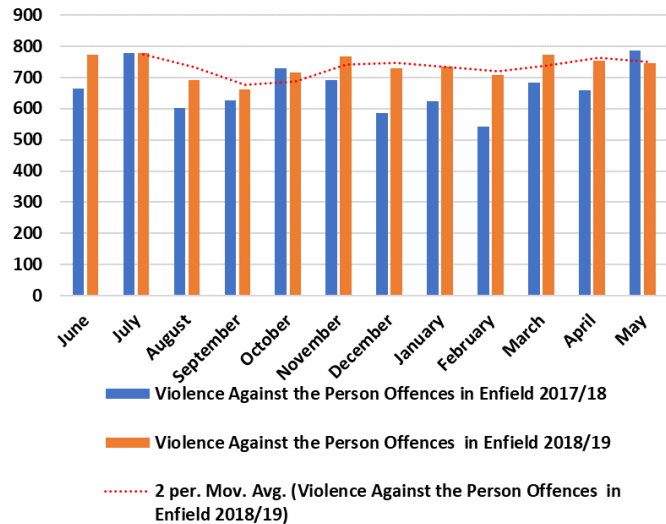
**Tackling Violent Crime in all its forms.**

- **Violence Against the Person in Enfield**

In the year ending May 2019 there were a total of 8826 Violence Against the Person offences (VAP)<sup>7</sup> recorded in Enfield, compared to 7969 offences the previous year, equating to an increase of 10.8%. In London, there was a smaller increase of 4.7% in the same period.

VAP offences have continued to decrease in May 2019 and have remained lower than the same time last year.

**Violence Against the Person in Enfield**

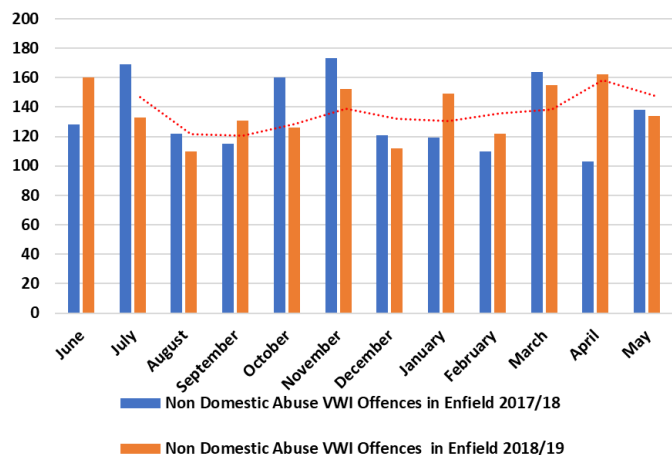


- **Non-Domestic Violence with Injury Offences in Enfield**

In the year ending May 2019 there were 1646 offences, compared to 1622 the previous year, equating to an increase of 1.5%. In London there was an increase of 0.3%.

There has been an increase in non-domestic violence with injury offences in the last two months, with April 2019, recording higher than the same time last year. However, in May 2019 offences have decreased and recorded lower than the same time last year.

**Non Domestic VWI Offences in Enfield**



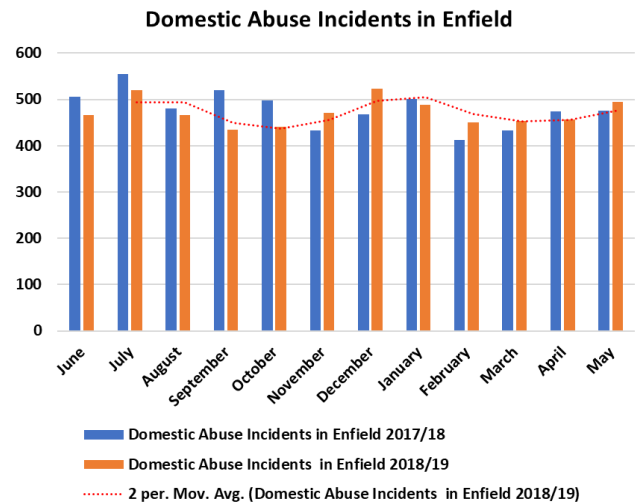

• **Domestic Abuse Incidents**

There were 5664 Domestic Abuse Incidents<sup>8</sup> recorded in the year ending May 2019 in Enfield, compared to 5754 incidents in the previous year, equating to a decrease of 1.6%. In London, there was an increase of 0.4% in the same period.

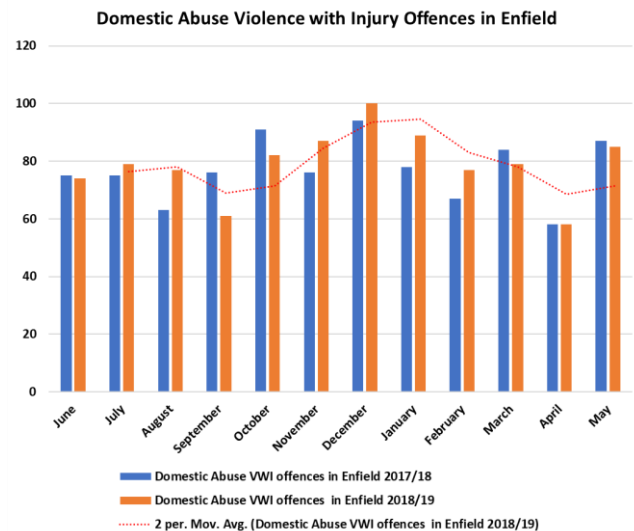
Since February 2019 domestic incidents have increased month on month and in May 2019 they have continued to increase, recording slightly higher than the same time last year.



• **Domestic Violence with Injury**

Violence with Injury offences which were domestic related have increased by 2.6% in Enfield, recording 948 offences, compared to 924 offences in the previous year. In London, there was an increase in the same period of 1%.

There has been a steady decline in offences since January 2019, although the month of May 2019, experienced a significant increase compared to the previous month April 2019, but remains slightly lower than the same time last year.

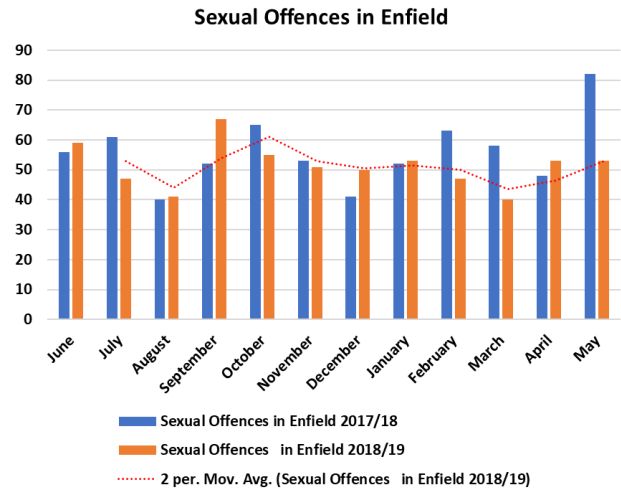


<sup>8</sup> **Domestic Abuse** is defined as “Any incident of threatening behaviour, violence or abuse (psychological, physical, sexual, financial or emotional) between adults, aged 16 and over, who are or have been intimate partners or family members, regardless of gender and sexuality”.

- **Sexual Offences**

In the year ending May 2019, reports of Sexual Offences in Enfield recorded a total of 616 offences decreasing by 8.2%, compared to 671 offences the previous year. London recorded an increase of 0.4% in the same period.

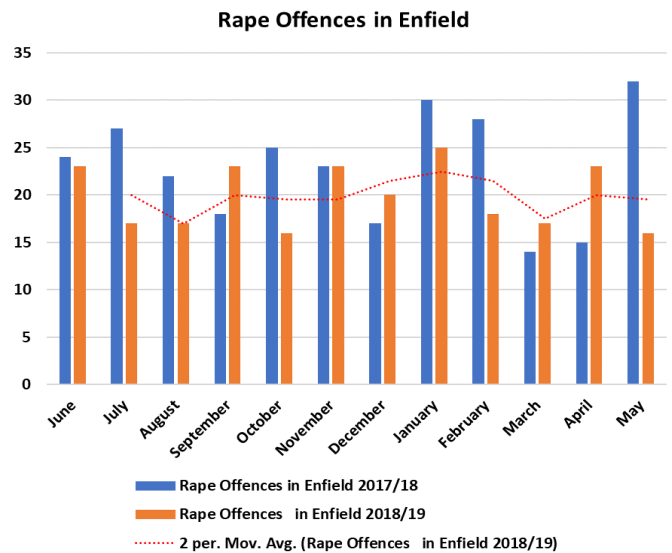
After a decline in Enfield in the first quarter, offences in April 2019 experienced a slight increase and have remained consistent in May 2019 recording the same number of offences (n=53), remaining lower than the same time last year.



- **Rape Offences**

Rape offences reported in Enfield have experienced a decrease of 13.5%, recording 238 in the year ending May 2019, compared to 275 the previous year. Enfield remains below London at a 0.9% increase in the same period.

Rape offences declined in May 2019 recording 16 offences, compared to 23 offences the previous month.

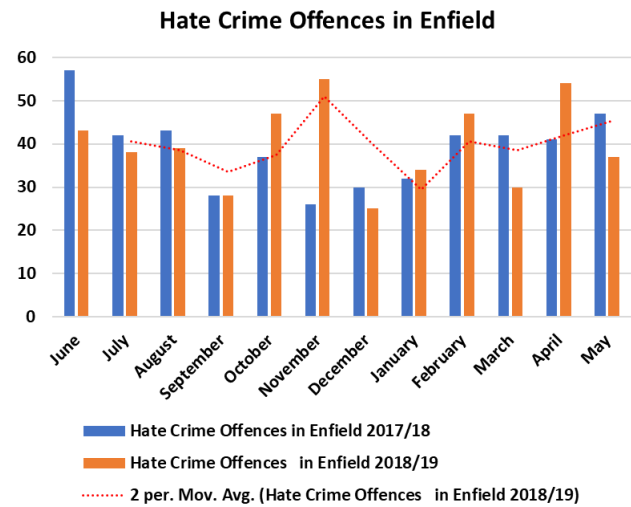


There have been 495 cases have been discussed at MARAC in the 12 months to the 31<sup>st</sup> May 2019, which represents an 8.5% (n=39) increase in the number of referrals, compared to 495 cases the previous year. Of those referrals 14% (n=71) were repeat referrals, declining from 18% (n=82) in the previous 12-month period.

### Promoting Cohesion and Tackling Hate Crime

Hate crime in Enfield increased by 2.1% in the year ending May 2019 recording 477 offences, compared to 467 in the previous year. In London, there was an increase of 3.7% in the same period.

Hate crime offences decreased in May 2019 after a peak in the previous month April 2019, which was due to Homophobic hate crime recording 10 offences. In May Homophobic hate crime was also high recording 8 offences.

### Dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour

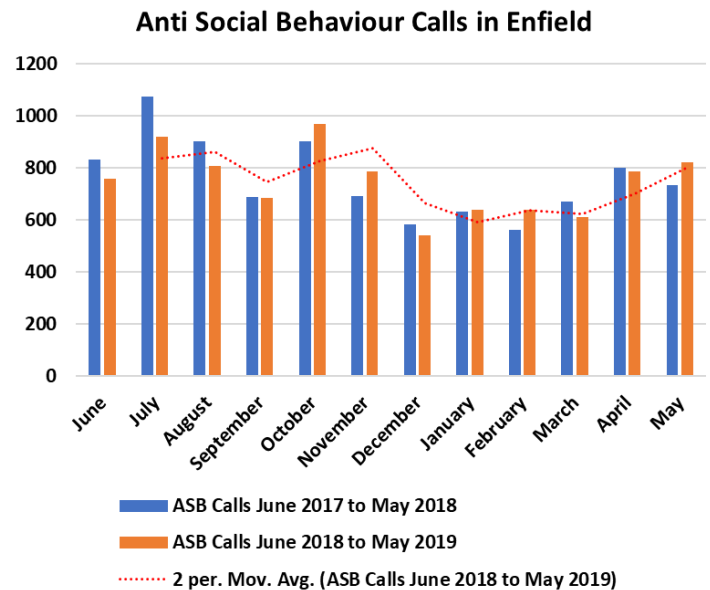
In the year ending May 2019 there was a total of 8966 Anti-Social Behaviour calls, compared to 9079 calls the previous year, a small decrease of 1.2%. In London, there has been an increase of 4% in the same period.
