DECISION

AGREED: In order to support Council tenants and leaseholders to remain in their homes and to limit the number of people outside of the household accessing their home during the period of restrictions currently put in place by government it is proposed that we make some temporary changes to our responsive repairs service until further notice.

- 1. Emergency Repairs: These in their nature are critical and linked to health and safety- there will be no change to these repairs.
- 2. Urgent Repairs: All urgent repairs reported will be triaged and assessed against risk in the current environment and where necessary would be escalated and treated as an emergency.

e.g. broken window restrictors in a block with young children not attending school currently would usually be treated as an urgent priority, however in the current environment we would treat as an emergency.

Where it is considered that it is safe for an urgent job to be put on hold the surveying team will be available to provide self-care advice, support and reassurance to customers and able to escalate if required.

- **3. Routine Repairs:** Routine repairs will be raised as usual but works not scheduled until the existing restrictions are removed. Routine repairs would include:
 - Internal plastering
 - Leaking tap
 - Repairs to kitchen doors, drawers or worktops

These changes seek to balance ensuring that critical health and safety / emergency repairs can continue to be delivered to those most in need across Council Housing.

During this period all operatives attending people's homes will adhere to strict social distancing measures at all times.

This decision will be reviewed following any substantial and long-term change to the Covid-19 related restrictions.

DECISION

AGREED: subject to not being called in:

- 1. To make the traffic orders pursuant to s6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to continue the operation the provisions of the following experimental traffic management orders.
 - (a) The Enfield (Free Parking Place) (Disabled Persons) (No. 8) Experimental Traffic Order 2018
 - (b) The Enfield (Free Parking Places) (No. 2) Experimental Traffic Order 2018
 - (c) The Enfield (Goods Vehicles Loading Bay) (No.6) Experimental Traffic Order 2018
 - (d) The Enfield (Parking Places) (Pay and Display) (No.4) Experimental Traffic Order 2018
- 2. To note the representations made in relation to the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (No. 161) Experimental Traffic Order 2018 and the modification made to the order to a) relax the loading restriction on the western side of Green Lanes N21 (Winchmore Hill Broadway); and b) introduce an additional 'loading gap' on the western side of Village Road EN1.
- 3. To also note the representations made in relation to the Enfield (Stop and Shop Parking Places) (No.2) Experimental Traffic Order 2018 and the modification made to extend the permitted maximum length of stay from 15 minutes to 20 minutes.

DECISION CONTINUED

- **4.** To make the orders pursuant to s6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to continue the operation the modified Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (No. 161) Experimental Traffic Order 2018 and the modified Enfield (Stop and Shop Parking Places) (No.2) Experimental Traffic Order 2018 on completion of the consultation period, subject to consideration of any additional representations or objections received.
- **5.** To implement the additional actions proposed in paragraph 4.28 of the report.

ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

Do Nothing - If the Council does not make the experimental orders permanent before 12 June 2020, i.e. with 18 months of them coming into operation, they will lapse and the associated parking places and waiting and loading restrictions would cease to be enforceable under the provisions of the original orders.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. The recommendations have been made so that four of the experimental traffic orders can be made permanent without delay as the associated elements generated few specific objections. The two remaining experimental orders, relating to loading and the 'Stop & Shop' bay by Compton Road have been modified and cannot be made permanent until a further period for comment has expired. However, having considered all of the representations made to date, it is recommended that these experimental orders be made permanent in due course, subject to the consideration of any new representations or objections received before 3 June 2020.
- 2. Finally, a number of suggestions have been made for additional disabled bays, improvements to the conspicuity of the loading gaps etc. and it is recommended that these be investigated further and taken forward where feasible.

Please note that this is an urgent rule 16 decision and there is no report.

SECTION 2: Notice of forthcoming Key Decisions for which it has not been possible to provide notice

This section lists the Key Decisions that are proposed to be taken by the Council, which require publication in accordance with the Local Government Act 2000. 2. Rule 16 – Special Urgency

This procedure should only be used in exceptional circumstances where it is not possible to:

- provide the required 28 days' notice prior of a key decision; and
- provide a minimum of 5 working days' notice prior to the decision needing to be taken;
