DECISION

AGREED:

- 1 To support residents to stay at home, to suspend the Allocations policy until further notice. In its place to allocate homes as temporary accommodation. This would include homeless households and rough sleepers who need to self-isolate, NHS staff and other Enfield key workers that need to self-isolate that are existing tenants in Council housing, temporary accommodation, the Housing Gateway, referrals from Children's Services, Adult Social Care, and Community Safety.
- 2 For estate regeneration properties to continue to move in the allocated tenant where appropriate and safe to do so.
- 3 That this will not apply to Sheltered Housing where the vulnerability of residents would put them at of risk infection. Allocations of Sheltered properties will be suspended unless the risk to residents in an individual scheme is deemed to be acceptable. (i.e. No households over 70 or self-isolating).
- 4 To note that this is not anticipated that this will affect large numbers of properties as the restrictions will reduce the number of households seeking to move.
- 5 That this decision will be reviewed following any substantial and long-term change to the Covid-19 related restrictions.

Reasons for Urgency

Measures to control the spread of Covid-19 have reduced our ability to procure temporary accommodation as many letting agencies have shut, nor can we support residents to move on in the private rented sector due to a lack of available stock and the ability to move in. Equally our ability to let social housing properties is affected as residents are unable to view properties or move into them due to the restrictions on movement currently in place. The proposal therefore ensures the best use of the Council's stock whilst protecting our most vulnerable residents.
