<p>AGREED: that the following decision will come into effect on Wednesday 22 July 2020, subject to not being called in:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> To give approval for e the successful tender submitted to be accepted and the respective contract awarded to NSL (Marston Holding Limited) for a six-year period with the option to extend up to a further four years subject to authority. To give authorisation to the Head of Parking Services to instruct and work together with Legal Services to prepare and complete the contract together with any supplementary contractual documentation. To give authorisation for all operational aspects of the contract to be delegated to the Head of Parking Services in consultation with the Director for Environment and Operational Services and the Cabinet Member for Environment. 							
ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED:							
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> To deliver a comprehensive parking and traffic enforcement service of the type required by the council is a major undertaking which requires resources other than staff such as specialist types of vehicles equipped with ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) and mobile CCTV; stock of materials, such as signs, uniform, body worn video, etc; specialist IT software and systems for the provision of permit, virtual pay and display and back office IT services and training. The main service providers have multiple contracts which enable them to transfer skilled staff to other contracts and strong purchasing power and agreements with specialist sub-contractors. There is also the need for specialist training and IT solutions. External contractors benefit from economies of scale in all of these areas and this is a benefit for the council, they also have the ability to be flexible and increase and decrease service provision. These services have been outsourced since the council took over Decriminalised parking powers from the Police in 1994. There are no known frameworks for the provision of parking enforcement services. Some related services such as IT, permit services and pay by phone services are available 							

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The award of the contract to NSL (Marston) has been proposed following the procurement and evaluation process. The evaluation has taken into account a wide range of factors including the ability to meet the contract conditions and specification, previous experience and performance and value for money to the Council.
