Appendix 1: The results of the Public Consultation

Respondents

- In total, 137 responses were submitted via the questionnaire. Of these, 124 were from residents, including 45 from those living in the east of borough (that is, residents in EN3, N9 and N18)
- Representatives from the following organisations and businesses responded to the questionnaire:

- In addition to the questionnaire responses, the Council received three emails from residents. These emails detailed suggestions on behaviours they wanted to be subject to a PSPO (e.g. littering). However, none of these are appropriate for a PSPO. Each email was responded to.
- It was felt that participation rates could have been higher if the online questionnaire could have been supplemented by face-to-face engagement. This approach was followed in similar years. However, this was not possible due to the pandemic

Key findings

Respondents were asked to what extent they agree or disagree with the eighteen proposed PSPOs. A breakdown of responses is available below.

In total, 16 proposed PSPOs had an approval rating (those who *agree*) of 84.6% or more. Only two proposed PSPOs had an approval rating lower than this:

- Dogs are to be excluded at all times in Schedule 1 parks (75.9% agree, 14.6% disagree)
- Dogs to be kept on leads at all times in the 15 parks listed in Schedule 2 (74.9% agree, 18.2% disagree)

Few comments were added by those who disagree with the proposal to exclude dogs in Schedule 1 parks. Those who did felt it was unfair.

In relation to the proposed PSPO for dogs to be kept on leads at all times in the 15 parks listed in Schedule 2, just four comments were made by those who disagree. Comments expressed that dogs need exercise and freedom, and that they can be fitted with a muzzle.

The two Friends of the Parks groups who shared their views agree with all of the proposed PSPOs relating to dogs in parks.

It should be noted that in their response, the Metropolitan Police agreed with each of the eighteen PSPOs with no responses to the open-ended questions.

A key theme that emerged from the questions which captured comments on the proposed PSPOs, was that a number of respondents question whether or not the Council will be able to enforce the PSPOs. Primarily due to a perceived lack of resources.

Literal responses

Respondents were asked for comments in relation to each PSPO. The comments collated from these questions were reviewed and summarised in Appendix X.
