Associate Cabinet Members are non-voting attendees of cabinet meetings. However, I have ensured that I attended all cabinet meetings and take part in discussions on policy and matters relevant to matters in Enfield South East.

Engagement with Edmonton residents to gather views on key issues and consult

- Arrange Area Ward Forum meetings
- Engage with Edmonton based community groups
- Engage with Friends of the Park Groups

The last Area Ward Forum meeting for Enfield South was held in January 2020. Due to the coronavirus pandemic Area Ward Forum meetings had to be cancelled for the remainder of the year. However, I have continued to correspondence and speak to residents over the phone.

Key issues identified

- Fly tipping hotspots.
- Crime and antisocial behaviour, specially issues relating to prostitution on Fore Street.
- Further information from NLWA about the Energy Recovery Facility.
- Residents continued involvement in the shaping and codesign of the Meridian Water project so that the scheme benefits local residents.
- Residents and local businesses have overall welcomed development plans at Edmonton Green Shopping Centre, although they want engagement to continue so to shape any future development in the area.

Support for the Enfield Stands Together Campaign

- Work with Edmonton ward councillors and community groups to support the council's Together Campaign.
- Actively contact local businesses to request for food and financial donations for the council's supply centre.

Engage with local businesses

- Promote the support available to local businesses during the coronavirus crisis.
- Actively engaged with local businesses to understand the challenges faced and feedback key issues to Economic Development team.

Key issues identified

- Business rate relief and support grants needed to assist local businesses to survive during the coronavirus crisis.
- Flexible licensing for restaurant, cafes and pubs.
- Residents and businesses have welcomed the Good Growth investment plans for the Fore Street, including a community centre.
