

- A male believe to be a Pimp was arrested within the first week of the team up and running. He was charged with driving offences & bailed pending further evidence for the controlling a female for financial gain
- Two males arrested at a vulnerable females house who is a known sex worker in the N18 area. Believed to be cuckooing & using the premises for drugs. Working with LA to safeguard and to re house the female.
- Several vulnerability assessment survey's completed with the Sex workers. Details where necessary (with consent given) have been passed onto variety Further action is being taken with the vehicles to Outreach groups & Charities
- We have made progress in engaging with some of the more well-known sex workers and developing plans of building out profiles and applying enforcement plans in order to start building grounds for potential CBOs
- We are making steps to make contact with the Modern Slavery Team to link in with them.

Safer Estates – Funded Team North

METROPOLITAN POLICE

Safer Estates is a team of one Sergeant and fifteen PC's who are dedicated to tackling criminality, ASB and vulnerable persons living on Enfield Estates

Whilst employed by MPS, they work in partnership with the Local Authority to have a more person centred approach to policing, dealing with the issues that matter most to the residents

Safer Estates, although reactive by the areas they focus, the team are extremely proactive and are well known for carrying out thorough initial and follow up investigations in order to secure convictions

In the past three months they have carried out 120 Stop and Search, 49 arrests, a large quantity of Heroin, Cocaine and Cannabis, over £10,000 of assets, three firearms and 22 weapons seized

Project Taipan

Project Taipan has been running since July 2020, the aim is to reduce violence with North Area by preventing and detecting drug offences and working with Safer Neighbourhood Teams to provide training and guidance on dealing with and the developing of intelligence

Since the beginning of the year the team have executed seven warrants, resulting in the recovery of stolen goods and seizure of drugs.

Additionally the team have uncovered and shut down two cannabis factories.



Safer Schools - Enfield

Our Safer Schools Officers have been working hard delivering online presentations to Primary Schools, Secondary Schools, Special Need Schools and Colleges in Enfield. They have covered various topics including;

Staying Safe Online COVID safety with updates on Government guidelines Child sexual exploitation and child criminal exploitation Gangs Mental Health Wellbeing and addictions – alcohol / drugs / gambling

The presentations continue now that the students have returned focusing on personal safety while travelling to and from school

Presentations are also being delivered to parents on the dangers of social media to improve their awareness with regard to children's safety

As each session was being delivered the participants had the opportunity to ask questions in the comments bar, should they require any clarity on topic being delivered. Then at the end of the session there was an open question and answer session held, sign posting support agencies

Presentations were also delivered to trainee Social Workers explaining the role of the Safer School Officers and the type of incidents schools address and their protocols

Officers continue to work closely with attendance officers within school and Educational Welfare Officers with regard to non-attendees and refusers and carrying out joint welfare checks

Our team have also been working in partnership with schools in Enfield running Student Surgeries to encourage <u>stu</u>dents to come and see them with any worries or concerns they may have



Safer Schools - Enfield

- The Safer Schools Team have been working hard to tackle robberies in Enfield, specifically to prevent robberies of school children
- The team secured additional funding from the TTCG to fund Operation Raphael, this funding has enabled the team to carryout proactive patrols in the robbery hotspots, in Enfield Town, Southbury Road, Bullsmore Lane, Ponders End, Enfield Highways and Edmonton Green
- The team have delivered some excellent results, two examples of which include;
 the seizure of a machete and Rambo style knife (pictured below) from known robbery suspects, resulting in their arrests and subsequent charges and conviction at court





Safer Schools -Enfield

PC Simon Odong featured in the Enfield Dispatch newspaper with his hard hitting life story.

PC Simon Odong talks about his work with Enfield's safer schools programme and the influence of his own turbulent childhood

Simon Odong arrived in the UK in 1990 as a young boy, unable to speak English, baving Fled a civil war in Uganda where be'd grown up. Today Simon is a police officer who works in 65 primary schools across Enfield, helping to motivate the next generation to make the right choices at an early age.

Drawing on his experiences and his incredibly difficult childhood, Simon wants to steer children to follow a route through their education that keeps them safe and avoids delving into criminality. Simon, a Metropolitan Police officer enver 100%, fold the Oimerich - Tawart to help guide young adults and my job is to guide them, together with parents and teachers, on their life choices as they develop.

"It's things like being online and peer pressure and where that can lead them, and encouraging them to take responsibility for every choice they make." When children are preparing to leave primary school, Simon argues, they are at a crucial age. "All the things you know before you are eleven have an impact on your life." he says.

"It is about going in and doing presentations and assisting parents who might be having difficulties and speaking to pupils individually and talking about our num store." Simon's family went into hiding when he was five years old, hoping to avoid being caught up in the couffict that ravaged Uganda for eight years, starting in 1986. His father field the country and lost contact with the rest of the family, with each thinking the other was dead for years, until they were reutiled and emigrated to England.

Being able to share such a stney of overcoming difficulties during his childhood gives Simon a unique ability to motivate pupils to make positive choices in their own lives.

"If I can do it, anyone can do it," he says. "I want to motivate children to be a better version of themselves. "I fell guilty when I was 18 that I was alive when a lot of other people my age didn't make it. So when I see children make had choices, when they could make different choices, it gets to me personally. "You can concentrate on the negative but it doesn't get us anywhere. I want to make a difference."

What are some of the challenges children face today? "In my day everything we dad remained anonymesa, but now everything is unline with images posted on social media, and then when you get a job interview it can affect you. "Gangs are glammurited in the way they are portrayed. People are social creatures and they want to belong and if their parents are neglecting them and they are vulnerable, joining a gang can be appealing, "My job is to get them as much support

as possible. They might think that joining a gang gives them an easier life but it in not sustainable. "Up to the age of eleven is the most

crucial time to talk to children, before they start secondary school, and that is the most important age. If we don't get it right before they get to secondary school

we are just chasing our tails. "If they can see police as humans it gives them confidence, it is about preventing them from getting involved in crime, which for me is more rewarding than putting handcuffs on them." Over the last year, Simon has been forced to talk to schooldtildren via Zoom, but that will soon change and be his looking forward to getting back into the classroom. "I am'twent to get back into the classroom." "I am'twent to get back into school."



Safer Schools - Enfield

Just before April half term our Safer Schools Officers carried out three recruitment events;

- The first event was at Enfield Grammar - for girls, this was face to face presentation with 174 students
- The other events were at Aim Academy reaching out to approximately 30 students across all year groups



Youth Engagement - Cadets

We had very productive 8 weeks and the activities of our cadets were:

- Preparation for Duke of Edinburgh awards bronze, silver and gold camps online fitness sessions and map and compass reading, mental health awareness focused session with mindfulness input
- Holocaust memorial sessions with various theoretical and awareness input provided by guest speakers,
- Cadets days of action (weapon sweeps conducted by cadets leaders due to covid19 restrictions no police cadets were able to join them) - excellent results with numerous weapons recovered





Youth Engagement - Referral Scheme



The Youth Engagement Team have developed a successful youth engagement referral scheme, whereby young people are referred to our team by either their safer schools officers or local authority outreach leads

This is pre arrest scheme for those on the cusp of offending between 10 and 17 years old

All young people referred to our team have been enrolled on various programmes including;

- 4-22 Foundation for a programme leading to permanent recruitment
- Community Music, 10 young people will begin seven weeks of music writing and video editing online leading to an entry route into professional qualification
- Some young people have been referred to Tottenham Hotspur Foundation
- Kicks and mentoring programme and referred to positive role models for professional basketball coaching and mentoring



Youth Engagement – Partnership Work

We have a negotiated agreements with many third sector organisations and the local authority to identify the best routes for young people to be referred to.



Our Youth Engagement Officer also attended local youth provisions for input on community policing and day to day engagement - Bruce Grove and You Vs You workshops with young refugees.









Our Youth Engagement Team have recorded a podcast in Polish funded by the Polish embassy for those hard to reach young people on the main subjects of interest such as stop and search, carrying weapons in schools and public places and road traffic collisions and police involvement - this differs in Poland hence important for communities to be aware.



The team have worked together with Enfield's Young Mayor on a project to raise awareness about community policing and have contributed input for a leaflet and PowerPoint to be disseminated to all Enfield schools and youth provisions.

The team have led the Youth Independent Advisory Group meetings (every six weeks) with Superintendent Chris Jones and Nicole Owusu from Bruce Grove cochairing. Recent meetings were very much concentrated on the recent murders in Haringey and how it makes young people and communities feel. We have welcomed faith leaders to one of those meetings who were able to give us excellent feedback - for which we are grateful.




Enfield Crime Types








Monthly I Calls Rolling 12 months
