<p>AGREED subject to not being called in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The 10 schools listed in Annex A are progressed through to implementation, subject to the school's commitment and completion of the Memorandum of Understanding and statutory consultation process.</li> <li>That the Application &amp; Prioritization Process at Appendix 1 is adopted to guide the sequence of implementation for future School Streets.</li> <li>That the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at Appendix 2 is adopted by the Council for the Schools listed at Annex A and for all future Schools that participate in the School Streets initiative.</li> <li>That authority is delegated to the Director of Environment &amp; Operational Services to approve any alterations to the school list, to provide final approval in agreement with the Cabinet Member of implementation following design &amp; consultation, and where appropriate to revise the selection and prioritization criteria and MOU as the School Streets initiative continues to evolve.</li> </ul>							

## OPTIONS CONSIDERED

Do nothing

This is not recommended as this project is considered a key measure in protecting young people at pick up and drop off times.

Have all sites go straight to ANPR

Avoids change of mode and what could be argued as duplicate work. Also eliminates risks and pressures of marshalling. Marshalled schemes provide a softer approach for schools and are sometimes preferred. They build a great sense of community, encourage social interaction and are quicker and cheaper to implement.

## REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

School Streets create a safer and cleaner environment at the entrance to schools. In addition to these improvements in safety, these measures contribute towards enabling more active forms of travel as part of the wider Healthy Streets programme.
